SEASON NOTES

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks center Jake Voskuhl hails from Houston where he played his high school ball at Strake Jesuit...Mavericks athletic trainer Casey Smith and Rockets athletic trainer Keith Jones worked together on the athletic training staff for the U.S. Sr. National Basketball program for three summers (2006 World Championships, 2007 Olympic Qualifying, 2008 Summer Olympics)...Mavericks center Drew Gooden and Rockets forward Shane Battier played together in Memphis (2002-2003).

IN THE OFFSEASON:

- Dallas acquired eight players through free agent signings and trades. Most notably, Dallas executed a sign-and-trade for Shawn Marion that also brought Kris Humphries and Nathan Jawai to town. Other offseason additions were Rodrigue Beaubois, Quinton Ross, Tim Thomas, Drew Gooden and Jake Voskuhl. The Mavericks re-signed Jason Kidd and James Singleton, as well.
- For the first time in his career, Dirk Nowitzki had a basketball-free summer. He opted not to play for the German National Team and instead represented the NBA at a Basketball Without Borders trip to South Africa.
- Jason Terry also made a trip on behalf of BWB (China).
- Jason Kidd and Shawn Marion became teammates for the second time in their careers. The duo played together for two seasons (1999-00, 2000-01) with the Suns after Marion was drafted by the franchise with the ninth pick of the 1999 NBA Draft.
- The American Airlines Center premiered a one-of-a-kind sight and sound system. During the summer, AAC installed the first 1080 high-definition center scoreboard in the NBA and NHL. Digital video throughout the arena bowl is increased by over 300 percent with the addition of a new high-definition center scoreboard and two stadium-sized video displays that dominate the upper end walls. Matching the HD video experience is a state-of-the-art concert quality sound system.

- Jason Kidd, Dirk Nowitzki and Jason Terry all received the night off (rest) at CLE (10/20) allowing JJ Barea to make his first start at point guard and Drew Gooden to make his first at power forward
- The Mavericks acquired a future second round pick from MIN in exchange for the services of Australia native Nathan Jawai (10/20)
- Drew Gooden recorded his 4th double figures scoring game of the preseason at CLE (10/20) with 10 points (5-11 FGs, 2-3 FTs) in 32 minutes as he made his 2nd start
- James Singleton (3), Erick Dampier (2) and Kris Humphries (2) all posted preseason-bests for blocks at CLE (10/20)...Singleton added preseason-highs 9 rebounds, 4 assists and 29 minutes

30TH ANNIVERSARY: The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30th season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

SAVE A TREE: The Mavericks announced on Oct. 5 that their digital media guide is now available for download at mavs.com. For the first time in team history, the team opted not to print a media guide in order to conserve natural resources. (ALMOST) SEEING DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Since players are seeing limited minutes in the preseason, Dallas has yet to notch a double-double. Kris Humphries has nearly cracked into 10/10 territory in 4 straight games (vs. MEM 10/11, vs. DET 10/15, vs. CLE 10/17, at CLE 10/20). He is averaging 15.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in that span. His 9 rebounds (4 times) are tied for the most by any Maverick in the preseason (also by Gooden and Singleton at CLE, 10/20). Over the first 6 games, Humphries is averaging 14.5 points (4th on team), team-high 7.7 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 20.7 minutes.

BENCH MARK: In 2008-09, led by NBA Sixth Man Jason Terry (19.6 ppg), the Mavericks' bench supplied an NBA-high 37.9 points per game. Thurs far, the bench is outdoing itself in the preseason. In 6 games, the bench has produced 56.0 points on 44.9% (114-254 FGs) shooting from the field. The bench poured in 80 of Dallas' 113 points vs. DET (10/15) led by JET's 21, Drew Gooden's 16 and Kris Humphries' 14.

TOE THE LINE: The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, have picked up in preseason games right where they've left off over the last several seasons. As a team, Dallas is shooting 78.9% (153-194 FTs) from the line and ranks T-3rd in the NBA in FT%. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.7% FT (7th in NBA) and has hit 4,360 FTs (4th).

BONJOUR, RODRIGUE: Rookie Rodrigue Beaubois made his NBA debut in the 2nd half vs. ORL (10/5). Beaubois, a native of Guadeloupe, contributed 2 points, 2 rebounds and 1 assist in 9 minutes. Beaubois' 2nd outing at WAS (10/9) was very impressive for the rookie. Beaubois filled his stat line with 14 points (4-8 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 4-6 FTs), 3 assists and 3 steals in 21 minutes off the bench.

NICE DEBUT: Shawn Marion made his Mavericks debut at WAS (10/9) after missing the 1st preseason game with a sore right calf. In WAS, he finished with a game-high 26 points (11-15 FGs, 4-4 FTs), 5 rebounds, 2 assists and 3 steals in 30 minutes. Marion has been sidelined for the last 2 contests with the right calf injury.

HOT SHOT: Dirk Nowitzki led all scorers with 26 points (9-14 FGs, 8-10 FTs) in 28 minutes vs. MEM (10/11). The game was his 2nd with 20 points in the preseason. Over the last 4 wins, Nowitzki is shooting 62.7% (27-43 FGs) from the floor and is averaging 18.5 points.

SIXTH MAN SPRINGING TO ACTION: The NBA's reigning Sixth Man, Jason Terry, recorded his best performance of the preseason vs. MEM (10/11). In true JET form, he contributed 23 points (8-17 FGs, 3-4 FTs), knocked down 4 3-pointers (4-8 3FGs), dished 2 assists and added 2 steals in 28 minutes. He followed that with a game-high 21 points (8-10 FGs, 4-5 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) in 24 minutes off the bench. Last season, JET finished with 33 games of 20+ points off the bench (63 games off bench).

20 IN A ROW: Dirk Nowitzki scored at least 20 points in each of the last 25 games in 2008-09. His streak was the longest such streak in the NBA last season. He has recorded 2 20-point games in the preseason. His career mark for consecutive 20-point games stands at 31. Below is a list of Nowitzki's other career hot streaks.

CLOSING IN ON SECOND: Jason Kidd now ranks 3rd all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,199 assists). With 20 assists vs. PHO (4/5/09), he passed Magic Johnson (10,141) for 3rd position. Kidd now trails John Stockton (15,806) and Mark Jackson (10,334).

STOLE THE SHOW: With 2,198 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 7th on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 4 steals vs. OKC (2/27/09), he moved into 7th place, surpassing Hakeem Olajuwon (2,162). Kidd needs 10 steals to take 6th place from Clyde Drexler (2,207).

TOP 10 LIST: Jason Kidd hit 3 3-pointers vs. SA (12/9/08) to move into 9th place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,391 (surpassing Antoine Walker, 1,386 3FGs). For his career, he has 1,484 3-pointers. He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (3rd at 10,199 career assists, 6th at 9.2 apg; 3rd with 103 triple-doubles; 7th with 2,198 steals).

18 KARAT: Dirk Nowitzki was pure gold for the Mavs last season, averaging 25.9 points (4th in NBA) and 8.4 rebounds (team-high). With his 39 points vs. UTA (1/17), Dirk Nowitzki crossed the 18,000-point threshold for his career (19,084 total points). He joins 55 other players to reach the mark and now ranks 43rd all-time among NBA scorers. With 29 points at NO (4/12), Nowitzki passed Dale Ellis (19,004 points) and Reggie Theus (19,015 points). Nowitzki ranks 7th among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Allen Iverson, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett, Ray Allen and Tim Duncan. Paul Pierce also crossed the 18,000 point mark last season.

HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT: Of the 15 players currently on the roster, 11 are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Kris Humphries, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Shawne Williams, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS: On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

ELITE COMPANY: The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
- San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
- Dallas Mavericks 8 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out 317 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 263-62 (.809). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 331-242 (.578); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
