**CONNECTIONS:** Head coach Rick Carlisle coached Ron Artest for three seasons when both were in Indiana...Mavericks player development coach and radio analyst Brad Davis was drafted by the Lakers (1977) and played one season in L.A....Lakers center DJ Mbenga was a Maverick (2004-2007)...Mavericks forward Drew Gooden and Lakers guard Shannon Brown played together in Cleveland (2006-2008)...Lakers forward Josh Powell was a forward on the Mavericks 2005-06 Western Conference Championship team...Mavericks guard Matt Carroll and Lakers guard Matt Morrison played together in Charlotte (2006-2008).

**FYI:**

- Four new Mavs made their regular season debuts with Dallas in the season opener vs. WAS (10/27)...Shawn Marion and Quinton Ross were in the starting 5 while Drew Gooden and Kris Humphries both came off the bench
- Vs. WAS (10/27), the teams combined to commit just 10 turnovers each...last season, Dallas recorded 22 games with less than 10 turnovers and in the preseason, the Mavs averaged 15.4 turnovers per game
- Jason Kidd recorded 2 steals vs. WAS (10/27)...he had multiple steals in 4 of his 6 preseason games
- Dirk Nowitzki finished the opener vs. WAS (10/27) with a game-high 34 points...a season ago, the Mavericks were 19-7 (.731) when Nowitzki crossed the 30-point threshold

**30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

**SAVE A TREE:** The Mavericks announced on Oct. 5 that their digital media guide is now available for download at mavs.com. **TOE THE LINE:** The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, is shooting 79.4% (27-34 FTs) from the line. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.7% FT (7<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and has hit 4,360 FTs (4<sup>th</sup>).

**20 IN A ROW:** Dirk Nowitzki has scored at least 20 points in each of the last 26 dating back to vs. OKC (2/27/09). His streak is the longest such streak in the NBA. He has recorded 1 20-point game this season. His career mark for consecutive 20-point games stands at 31. Below is a list of Nowitzki's other career hot streaks.

**CLOSING IN ON SECOND:** Jason Kidd now ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,205 assists). With 20 assists vs. PHO (4/5/09), he passed Magic Johnson (10,141) for 3<sup>rd</sup> position. Kidd now trails John Stockton (15,806) and Mark Jackson (10,334). If Kidd averages for this season around his career average of 9.2 assists, he will move into 2<sup>nd</sup> place within the first 15 games of the 2009-10 campaign.

**STOLE THE SHOW:** With 2,200 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 7<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 4 steals vs. OKC (2/27/09), he moved into 7<sup>th</sup> place, surpassing Hakeem Olajuwon (2,162). Kidd needs 8 steals to take 6<sup>th</sup> place from Clyde Drexler (2,207).

**TOP 10 LIST:** Jason Kidd hit 3 3-pointers vs. SA (12/9/08) to move into 9<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,391 (surpassing Antoine Walker, 1,386 3FGs). For his career, he has 1,484 3-pointers. He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (3<sup>rd</sup> at 10,205 career assists, 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.2 apg; 3<sup>rd</sup> with 103 triple-doubles; 7<sup>th</sup> with 2,200 steals).

**18 KARAT:** Dirk Nowitzki was pure gold for the Mavs last season, averaging 25.9 points (4<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and 8.4 rebounds (team-high). He recorded 34 points and 9 rebounds to open the 2009-10 season vs. WAS (10/27/09). With his 39 points vs. UTA (1/17/09), Dirk Nowitzki crossed the 18,000-point threshold for his career (19,118 total points). He joins 55 other players to reach the mark and now ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> all-time among NBA scorers. Nowitzki ranks 7<sup>th</sup> among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Allen Iverson, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett, Ray Allen and Tim Duncan. Paul Pierce also crossed the 18,000 point mark last season.

**HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT:** Of the 15 players currently on the roster, 11 are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Kris Humphries, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Shawn Williams, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

**EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS:** On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers      12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics          10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
- San Antonio Spurs      10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics          9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
- Dallas Mavericks        8 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

**TWO OF A KIND:** The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out 318 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 263-63 (.807). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

## HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

**Regular Season Coaching Record: 331-243 (.577); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)**

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
