## SEASON NOTES

**CONNECTIONS:** Rick Carlisle coached the Pacers for three seasons (2003-07) and earned a 181-147 (.552) record while leading the team to three straight postseason appearances...Mavericks center Erick Dampier was drafted by the Pacers and played in Indiana during the 1996-97 season...Dampier is a former teammate of Troy Murphy and Mike Dunleavy (the three played together at Golden State)...Pacers guard T.J. Ford played the 2003-04 season in Milwaukee with Mavericks forward Tim Thomas and 2006-2008 in Toronto with Mavericks forward Kris Humphries...T.J. Ford played his college ball at the University of Texas.

**FYI:**

- For the 1<sup>st</sup> time this season, 3 Mavericks scored 20+ points in a game...at HOU (11/25), Jason Terry (27), Dirk Nowitzki (25) and Tim Thomas (23) all had at least 23 points each...last season, 3 Mavs had 20+ in 13 games (last vs. DEN, 3/27/09)
- Led by 5 players who average at least 5.7 rebounds per game, the Mavericks rank 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA in rebounds per game at 44.7
- Over the last 3 games, the Mavericks are averaging 29.0 assists...at HOU (11/25), Dallas dished out a season-high 33 on 55 made FGs...3 players had 7+ steals including Jason Terry (season-high 10), JJ Barea (9) and Jason Kidd (7)
- Dallas is 7-1 when dishing 25+ assists
- Jason Kidd is the only player in the NBA to record a rebounds-assists double-double. A season ago, he led the league with 2 of this variety. Since 2006-07, in fact, there have been 17 rebounds-assists double-doubles with Kidd owning 10 of them.
- Over the last 2 games, Dallas' opponents are averaging 19.7 turnovers resulting in 25.0 Maverick points...in that span, the Mavs are averaging 12.0 steals...at HOU (11/25), 4 players had 2+ steals led JJ Barea and Tim Thomas with 3 each (Matt Carroll and Dirk Nowitzki both had 2 each)
- Dallas is 5-1 when coming away with 10+ steals and have set season-highs for steals in each of the last 2 games

**30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

**ALL ALONE IN SECOND PLACE:** Jason Kidd now ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,337 assists). With 7 assists at HOU (11/25/09), he passed Mark Jascckson (10,334) for 2<sup>nd</sup> position. More specifically, Kidd dished his 10,335<sup>th</sup> assists on an alley-oop lob to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 to play in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of the HOU game. Kidd now trails only John Stockton (15,806). For the season, the guard averages 9.2 assists (T-3<sup>rd</sup> among NBA leaders).

**OH, WHAT A NIGHT!:** After falling down by 13 early in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter at HOU (11/25), the Mavericks rebounded and were firing on all cylinders after sparking a 26-0 run that stretched between the late 1<sup>st</sup> and early 2<sup>nd</sup> quarters. The Mavericks recorded season-highs in points (130), FG% (.655, 55-84 FGs), assists (33) and steals (14). Ten players hit at least 1 FG and 5 hit at least 5 FGs each.

**HOT SHOT:** After shooting an astonishing 65.5% (55-84 FGs) from the floor at HOU (11/25), the Mavericks now own the 2 highest shooting percentages recorded in the NBA this season. They had previously shot 62.4% in a win vs. TOR (11/7). A season ago, DAL just reached the 60% mark at MIA on 1/31/09 (.603).

**MODEL T:** (Jason) Terry and (Tim) Thomas put on quite a display in HOU (11/25). JET went off for 27 points (10-11 FGs, 4-4 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) and 10 rebounds in 32 minutes for his 1<sup>st</sup> double-double since vs. ORL (3/3/07) when he had 29 points and 15 assists. Thomas added 23 more points (9-13 FGs, 4-8 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) and 3 steals in his 4<sup>th</sup> game of the season. A season ago, Thomas recorded just 3 20-point games on the season (previously 24 at PHI, 1/24/09).

**ELIAS SAYS:** Terry and Thomas are the 1<sup>st</sup> pair of teammates to score at least 23 points in the same game as reserves this season. They are the 1<sup>st</sup> duo to do so in Mavericks franchise history.

**ANOTHER STREAK BEGINS:** At NO (11/4), Dirk Nowitzki's NBA-long streak of 29 straight games with 20+ points came to an end. Since then, the power forward has started another streak of that sort – he now has 10 games with 20+ dating back to vs. TOR (11/7). His streak is the 3<sup>rd</sup> longest currently in the NBA (thru games of 11/25)

**AROUND THE BLOCK:** Dirk Nowitzki has at least 1 block in each of the last 10 games dating back to vs. TOR (11/7) – 2 at HOU (11/25). For his career, he has only 2 longer streaks of consecutive games with a block. Last season, his longest streak was 5 games. Nowitzki ranks T-15<sup>th</sup> at 1.6 bpg.

**JET & COMPANY:** The Mavericks reserves rank 4<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in points per game (40.7). Over the last 3 games, the bench averages 54.7 points. At HOU (11/25), Jason Terry contributed his 5<sup>th</sup> 20-point game of the season as the Dallas bench outscored the Rockets bench 68-44 on the night. Terry has single-handedly outscored the opposing bench 3 times this season (1-2 record) including the last 2 games. JET is 1 of 6 reserves to have at least 4 20-point games off the bench this season. Terry has scored the most points of any player off the bench (272) and his 18.1 ppg ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> among all bench players.

**TOP 40:** Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2<sup>nd</sup> 40-point game of the season (14<sup>th</sup> of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs) in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 4 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games. There have been 17 40-point outings this season.

**GOODEN PLENTY:** Drew Gooden has recorded 10+ points OR 10+ rebounds in his last 6 starts and has 4 double-doubles. In that span, Gooden averages 13.8 points, 11.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks. Gooden's game-high 16 rebounds vs. SAC (11/20) marked a season-high. He also added a career-high 9 offensive boards. His previous career-high was 8 OR (2 times). There have been 35 16-rebound performances in the NBA this season. Gooden and Dampier have 1 of them each.

**RODDY, PROUD AND LOUD:** Rookie Rodrigue Beaubois has come alive for the Mavericks in his last 7 starts (6-1 DAL record). The native of Guadeloupe averages 8.7 points, 1.7 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 18.0 minutes. In that span, he has shot 54.2% (26-48 FGs) from the floor. Arguably, Beaubois is the first rookie since Josh Howard and Marquis Daniels (2003-04) to have played meaningful minutes for the Mavericks, especially this early in the season. **ROADIES:** The Mavericks are in the midst of playing 5 of 6 games on the road (IND is 2<sup>nd</sup> road game in the stretch). So far, Dallas has amassed a 6-2 record (.750) and owns the T-1st best road winning percentage in the NBA (along with CLE and PHO). On their current 3-game trip, Dallas faces opponents that have won 58.1% of their games (25-18 combined record).

**IN SPITE OF THE RIM:** The Mavericks are 6-2 when shooting less than 44% FG (recently, W vs. SA, 11/18). Dallas and POR are the only teams in the league to have 5+ wins when shooting under 44%. A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has an NBA-best 3 wins when shooting 40% or less FG. Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting below 40%.

**MOVING UP THE RANKS:** Jason Terry now has 6,702 points as a Maverick and has moved into 8<sup>th</sup> place all-time among Mavs. If JET sustains his 18.1 points per game pass, look for him to overtake Sam Perkins (6,766) for 7<sup>th</sup> place by early December.

**CRASHING THE BOARDS:** Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8<sup>th</sup> of his career (2<sup>nd</sup> with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has come down with at least 10 rebounds in 5 of the last 6 games, and has 14+ boards in 2 games. He has 29 14-rebound performances since joining the Mavs in 2004-05. Dallas is 20-9 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

**IRON ERICK:** Erick Dampier recorded his 3<sup>rd</sup> double-double of the season with 14 points and 20 rebounds in 32 minutes vs. HOU (11/10). In 2008-09, Dampier didn't come up with his 3<sup>rd</sup> double-double until 1/2/09 vs. PHI. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 46 double-doubles (35-11 record, .761). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 70-19 (.787). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 14 regular season games – including the last 6 due to an illness.

**18 KARAT:** Dirk Nowitzki leads the Mavericks in scoring and ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in rebounding to start the 2009-10 season. With his 39 points vs. UTA (1/17/09), Dirk Nowitzki crossed the 18,000-point threshold for his career (19,487 total points). He joins 55 other players to reach the mark and now ranks 38<sup>th</sup> all-time among NBA scorers, passing Terry Cummings (19,460) with 28 points vs. GS (11/24). He needs 35 points to move into 37<sup>th</sup> position (Walter Davis, 19,521). Nowitzki ranks 5<sup>th</sup> among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett and Ray Allen. Nowitzki is followed by Duncan and Paul Pierce.

**DIRK and KIDD FOR 3:** For his career, Dirk Nowitzki has 1,092 3-pointers and ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> all-time among NBA players. In fact, Nowitzki (7,316 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,512 3FGs, 7,493 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in NBA history to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also Rasheed Wallace, 1,006 3s and 7,058 rebounds).

**TOE THE LINE:** The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 80.2% (283-353 FTs) from the line and rank 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA behind OKC and DEN. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.8% FT (7<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and has hit 4,475 FTs (4<sup>th</sup>).

**STOLE THE SHOW:** With 2,223 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 6<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals at SA (11/11/09), Kidd surpassed Clyde Drexler (2,207). The point guard is 85 steals away from taking 5<sup>th</sup> position from Scottie Pippen (2,307).

**TOP 10 LIST:** Jason Kidd hit 3 3-pointers vs. SA (12/9/08) to move into 9<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,391 (surpassing Antoine Walker, 1,386 3FGs). For his career, he has 1,512 3-pointers. With 17 more 3-pointers, he will move into 8<sup>th</sup> place (Nick Van Exel, 1,528). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (2<sup>nd</sup> at 10,337 career assists, 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.2 apg; 3<sup>rd</sup> with 103 triple-doubles; 6<sup>th</sup> with 2,223 steals).

**BACK-TO-BACK IT UP:** Dallas begins the 6<sup>th</sup> of 20 back-to-backs at IND (11/27). The Mavericks have 4 more back-to-backs than a season ago. Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 4-1 in the first game of a back-to-back and 3-2 in the second game.

**HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT:** Of the 15 players currently on the roster, 11 are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Kris Humphries, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Shawne Williams, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

**EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS:** On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)  
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)  
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

**JUST THE TWO OF US:** The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out 324 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 268-64 (.807). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

## HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

**Regular Season Coaching Record: 342-246 (.582); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)**

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
