SEASON NOTES

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Heat guard Dwyane Wade were teammates on the U.S. Men's Sr. National Team that won Olympic gold in Beijing (2008)...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion played for the Heat from 2008-2009...Heat center Jamaal Magloire appeared in 7 games for Dallas in 2008...Rick Carlisle coached Heat forward Jermaine O'Neal in Indiana from 2003-2007...Mavericks forward Tim Thomas and Heat guard Quentin Richardson were together with the Knicks during the 2008-09 season...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion and Heat guard Quentin Richardson played together in Phoenix during the 2004-05 season.

FYI:

- The Mavericks' last 3 wins have each come by 10 points (at GS, vs. PHO, at ORL) after having had just 1 10-point win in nearly 2 months (defeated NY 128-78 on 1/24 after previous winning 100-86 at OKC on 12/16)
- Led by Jason Kidd, the Mavericks are averaging 10.0 steals in their last 2 wins and have scored 18.0 points on opposing turnovers in that span
- Dallas defeated ORL (2/19) for the 1st road win over a .500 team since defeating BOS (1/18)
- Over his last 2 starts (in place of injured Erick Dampier), Brendan Haywood is averaging 12.5 points, 9.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 3.5 blocks and 35.0 minutes. Vs. PHO (2/178), he recorded his 6th 5-block game of the season (2-4 record)
- Jason Kidd came away with a career-high 7 steals vs. PHO (2/17)...his previous high was 6 (24 times). Over the last 2 games, the point guard is averaging 5.5 steals per game. Among NBA leaders, he ranks 4th at 1.9 spg
- Kidd is 1 of 4 players to have a 7-steal game this season (also NO Paul and OKC Westbrook (8) and GS Watson (7))
- Dallas is 20-6 when scoring 100+ points (with 3 of those losses in OT)...the Mavs are 10-2 when scoring 110+
- Since at MIL 11/16, the Mavericks have won 24 of 29 games when scoring 97+ points and have lost 13 of 16 games when scoring 96-or-less (wins vs. NO, 12/14; at WAS, 1/20; at ORL, 2/19)

- Following the game vs. MIN (2/5), the Mavericks are now 11-3 when both Dirk Nowitzki (21) and Jason Terry (20) score 20+ points...a season ago, the team was 25-8 in such instances
- Dallas is 16-5 in games after a loss
- The Mavericks lead the league in wins when trailing at halftime with 13
- Dallas shot 55%-or-better for the 7th time this season at NY (1/24) with 58.1% FG
- The Mavericks have now hit at least 1 3-pointer in 911 consecutive games
- Dallas won by double digits at home (107-97) vs. PHO (2/17) for the first time since winning (121-103) vs. HOU (11/10)...of Dallas' 34 wins, 14 have come by at least 10 points
- Dallas is 19-5 when outrebounding the opposition (recently: W, 45-44 vs. PHO, 2/17)
- The Mavericks captured a Western Conference-best 18th road victory at ORL (2/19) matching their road win total from last season
- Jason Kidd recorded his 16th double-double of the season (team-best) vs. PHO (2/17) with 18 points (6-11 FGs, 4-8 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), 7 rebounds, 10 assists and career-high 7 steals in 42 minutes...the double-double was his 13th with points-assists. Kidd is 1 of 7 players to have 10+ points-assists double-doubles this season (PHO Nash leads league with 32 followed by UTA Williams 25, NO Paul 22, BOS Rondo 23, CLE James 18, LAC Davis 12)
- The Mavericks will next be in action at home on 2/22 when they host Danny Granger and the Indiana Pacers at 7:30 p.m. on FSSW

30TH ANNIVERSARY: The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30th season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

OH WHAT A NIGHT!: For the 9th consecutive season, Dirk Nowitzki represented the Western Conference in the 59th NBA All-Star Game. Nowitzki and his teammates played before a record 108,713 fans in the largest crowd to ever watch a basketball game as the East was victorious (141-139). Originally voted into the game as a reserve, Nowitzki was named to the starting lineup by George Karl in place of an injured Kobe Bryant. Nowitzki finished the game with an All-Star career-high 22 points (8-15 FGs, 6-6 FTs), 4 rebounds, 2 assists and 1 steal in 28 minutes. He has made more appearances than any player in franchise history and, along with Jason Kidd, is the only Maverick to start an All-Star Game (also Las Vegas, 2007).

KIDD TURNS 10: Jason Kidd was honored as an All-Star for the 10th time in his career after being named a replacement (Kobe Bryant) by Commissioner David Stern. Kidd cut short a planned trip to Phoenix to participate in the All-Star Game. He played 6 minutes off the bench and came down with 2 rebounds, dished 1 assist and grabbed 1 steal. Kidd and Dirk Nowitzki became the first set of Mavs teammates to play on the same All-Star team since Nowitzki and Josh Howard (Las Vegas, 2007).

SHOOTING STAR: Dirk Nowitzki, San Antonio Silver Stars guard Becky Hammon and TNT analyst/Houston Rockets legend Kenny Smith won the 2010 Haier Shooting Stars contest as members of the Team Texas contingent. In the final round, Nowitzki hit a half court shot giving the team a total time of 39.3 seconds and the victory over Team Los Angeles.

CRACKING DOWN ON D: After allowing 8 straight opponents between vs. MIL (1/26) and at DEN (2/9) to score 101+ points (112.3 ppg, 3-5 record), the Mavericks have allowed just 93.7 points on 43.4% (108-249) shooting from the field in their last 3 contests (2-1).

ON THE RUN: Dallas scored 19 unanswered points in the 2nd half at ORL (2/19). According to Elias Sports Bureau, the run was the longest against the Magic in nearly 5 years (BOS 22-0, 2/22/05). The Mavericks had another impressive run earlier this season that afforded them a come-from-behind win – they scored 26 straight at HOU on 11/25.

RUNNING UP THE SCORE: For the 7th time this season, the Mavericks scored 60+ points in a half at GS (2/8). They finished the half with 61 points on 56.3% (18-32 FGs, 6-9 3FGs) shooting from the field. Dallas is 6-1 when scoring 60 1st half points.

HAPPY TRAILS: The Mavericks own the most wins in the league this season after trailing by 10+ points in a game. Meanwhile, they have the 2nd-fewest losses in the NBA when running out to a 10+ point lead. At ORL (2/19), Dallas overcame an 11-point 2nd half deficit to steal a 95-85 win.

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki appeared in his 893rd game as a Maverick at ORL (2/19). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Mav in franchise history at PHO (1/28). Nowitzki, the franchise's all-time scoring leader, is 1 of 3 2 active players who leads his team in career games (CHA's Gerald Wallace). Nowitzki is the 3rd-longest tenured player with his original team (LAL Bryant 1996-97; SA Duncan 1997-98).

DIRK HAS THE EDGE: Dirk Nowitzki has outscored his opposing power forward by 10+ points in 31 games this season. Below is a list of starting power forwards who have the most games in which they outscored their opposing power forward by 10+ points

PERFECT 10: For the 4th time this season (1-3 record), Dirk Nowitzki shot 100% from the free throw line when attempting at least 10 FTs. Nowitzki, OKC's Durant and TOR's Bosh are the only players in the NBA to have 4 such games. LAL's Kobe Bryant has 3 perfect games (min. 10 attempts). For the season, Nowitzki ranks 4th among NBA players and shoots 89.8% from the FT line.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: For the 3rd time this season, 7 Mavericks scored in double figures at NY (1/24). Dirk Nowitzki and Jason Terry (20 each) paced the balanced attack while Shawn Marion, Drew Gooden (15), Roddy Beaubois (13), JJ Barea (11) and James Singleton (10) also finished with at least 10 points. In back-to-back games vs. MEM (12/26) and at DEN (12/27), 7 Mavs scored 10+. A season ago, Dallas recorded just 1 game with 7 players having 10+ points each.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: A short-handed and road-weary Mavericks squad earned its biggest win in franchise history at NY (1/24). Dallas, without the services of Jason Kidd (personal reasons) and Erick Dampier (left knee effusion), won 128-78 after leading by as many as 53 points in the game. Previously, Dallas had won by 45 points at GS (1/15/85) in a 149-104 decision. Dallas posted the largest margin of victory in Madison Square Garden – a place the Knicks have called home since February, 1968.

POURING IT IN DOWN THE STRETCH: Vs. PHO (2/17), Dirk Nowitzki (10) and Jason Terry (9) combined for 19 of Dallas' 25 4th quarter points. And it seems that strong performances in the final period have become the norm for the duo. Nowitzki (6.7) owns the 5th-highest final period average while Jason Terry's 6.0 ppg rank 6th.

REMARKABLE STREAK: The Mavericks' 108-107 win vs. MIL (1/26) was their 10th consecutive win in a 1-point game dating back to Jan. 14, 2007. That's tied for the longest streak in NBA history. The St. Louis Hawks won 10 straight 1-point games from 1959 to 1960. This season, Dallas has gone 5-0 in 1 point games

HIS PLACE IN HISTORY: Dirk Nowitzki became the 34th player in NBA history to score 20,000 career points with a 30-point night vs. LAL (1/13) and now ranks 33rd all-time on the NBA's scoring list. He scored his 20,000th and 20,001st points at the 10:57 mark of the 4th quarter on a 14-foot jumper over Lamar Odom. He now has 20,416 career points. Nowitzki, the Mavericks' leading scorer, is 2nd player to reach the 20,000-point plateau this season joining BOS Ray Allen who accomplished the feat at WAS (12/10/09). Nowitzki passed Tom Chambers (20,049) for 33rd position with 19 points at TOR (1/17). He now trails BOS's Ray Allen and Mitch Raymond (20,497). Nowitzki ranks 6th among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Allen Iverson, Kevin Garnett and Allen. Nowitzki is followed by Tim Duncan (20,193) and Paul Pierce (19,441).

MORE ON DIRK'S FEAT: Dirk Nowitzki is the 4th player born outside the U.S. to score 20,000 career points. He joins Patrick Ewing (Jamaica, 24,815), Hakeem Olajuwon (Nigeria, 26,946) and Dominique Wilkins (France, 26,668). Of the 33 players who reach the 20,000-point plateau before Nowitzki, all of them who were eligible to be in the Hall of Fame have done so aside from Mitch Raymond (20,497) and Tom Chambers (20,049).

GOOD NIGHT FROM THE FIELD: The Mavericks shot 45.2% (38-84 FGs, 5-15 3FGs) from the field at ORL (2/19). The game was the 30th of the season (22-8 record, .733) in which the Mavs shot at least 45% FG.

LOTS OF HELP: Dallas recorded 33 assists on 37 made field goals at GS (2/8) led by Jason Kidd's 12. Dallas improved to 20-1 when dishing 25+ assists. Dallas is 18-4 when Kidd dishes 10+ assists. The Mavericks rank 3rd in the league at 23.1 apg.

DIFFERENT KIND OF DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Jason Kidd recorded his 3rd rebounds-assists double-double (2nd in an OT game) of the season with a season-high tying 11 rebounds (11 DR) and 10 assists with 8 points and 4 steals in 43 minutes vs. HOU (12/18). He is the only player in the NBA this season to record a double-double of this variety. Since 2006-07, there have been 18 rebounds-assists double-doubles with Kidd owning 11 of them.

DIRK GOES FOR 30/10 AGAIN: Dirk Nowitzki turned out his 5th 30-point/10-rebound effort of the season with game-highs of 30 points (11-22 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 7-7 FTs) and 16 rebounds in 43 minutes vs. LAL (1/13). Dallas is 4-1 in those games. In the 2009 calendar year, Nowitzki had the 4th-most 30/10 games in the NBA and he currently has the 3rd-most in the 2009-10 season.

NOWITZKI EFFICIENCY: Dirk Nowitzki's 35 points at OKC (12/16) came on a very efficient 72.2% (13-18 FGs, 2-2 3FGs) from the floor. The game was the 2nd of the season for Nowitzki in which he scored at least 30 while shooting at least 71% FG (also 31, 10-14 FGs, .714 at IND 11/27). Nowitzki, GS Maggette and POR Roy are the only players in the league to have multiple games of 30 points on 70% FG. There have been 25 such games this season.

ANOTHER NIGHT OF 90: For the 12th time this season, the Mavericks shot 90% from the free throw at DEN (2/9). The Mavs made 26 of their 28 attempts (.929). Jason Terry (9-9 FTs) and Dirk Nowitzki (7-7) led the Mavericks. The Mavs are 8-4 when shooting such a high percentage from the line and have the most games at 90+ percent. NY (2-4), POR (4-2), HOU (2-4) and IND (4-1) are the only other teams to have 3+ such games.

CLOSE CALL: Dallas is 13-5 (.722) in games decided by 5 points or less. Recently, the Mavs lost to POR (1/30) 112-114 in OT. Since naming Rick Carlisle head coach, the Mavericks are 31-10 (.756) in games decided by that margin.

LUCKY #13: Jason Kidd dished 13 assists in a game for the 6th time this season with 16 vs. GS (2/3). Kidd is 1 of 4 players to record 6 13-assist games this season.

PLETHORA OF POINTS: Dirk Nowitzki has scored 1,332 points through 54 games this season. Nowitzki, who owns the NBA's 7th-highest scoring average, poured in his 12th 30-point game of the season at BOS (1/18). Nowitzki scored a game-high 37 points (14-22 FGs, 9-12 FTs) including 22 in the 2nd half. A season ago, Nowitzki had 26 30-point games, tying his career high (also 2005-06). He is on pace for around 18 30-point games this season.

NEARLY-FAULTLESS 4TH: Dirk Nowitzki has missed 4 free throws in the 4th quarter and overtime (3 games). Nowitzki is 107-112 from the line (4-4 in OT) down the stretch. Between the late 4th quarter vs. NO (4/10/09) and the 2:02 mark of the 4th vs. POR (12/22), Nowitzki had made 66 consecutive FTs down the stretch. Nowitzki missed a season-high 2 4th quarter FTs at BOS (1/18).

PRISTINE 15: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 34th 15-point half of the season at ORL (2/19) with 15 2nd half points in 20 minutes. For the season, Nowitzki has 9 20-point performances in a half – all of which have come after halftime. In halves when Nowitzki scores 15+, he shoots a combined 54.7% (222-406 FGs) from the floor, 53.1% (17-32 3FGs) from 3 and 91.9% (159-173 FTs) from the line.

BOUNCING BACK: Since the 2000-01 season (1st of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have suffered just 56 losses (in 793 games) of 15+ points. Six of those losses have come this season (91-127 at DEN, 2/9). What's more impressive though, is that the Mavs have won 40 of the games following their 15-point losses (40-16, .714). This season, Dallas is 3-3 in games following 15-point losses. Dallas has lost back-to-back by at least 15 just once in that span (2001-02 season).

HOT SHOT: Dallas poured in another great shooting effort at GS (2/8). The Mavericks, for the game, shot 52.1% (37-71 FGs) from the floor for the game. Dallas now owns 3 of the top 15 shooting games of the season, including the 2 of the 3 highest. The Mavs shot 65.5% (55-84 FGs) from the floor at HOU (11/25), 62.4% in a win vs. TOR (11/7) and 58.7% (44-75 FGs) in another win at NJ (12/2). A season ago, DAL just reached the 60% mark at MIA on 1/31/09 (.603). The last the time Mavs had shot that high a clip was when they went 67.7% vs. San Diego Clippers in 1983. The Mavericks are 13-1 when shooting at least 50% FG.

IN SPITE OF THE RIM: The Mavericks are 7-13 when shooting less than 44% FG (recently, L at OKC, 2/16). A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has 4 wins when shooting 40% or less FG (4-9 overall; L at OKC, 2/16). Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting 40% or worse.

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY: The Mavericks have used 15 different starting lineups through 55 games this season. Brendan Haywood made his 1st start as a Maverick vs. PHO (2/17)

TOP 40: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2nd 40-point game of the season (14th of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs) in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 9 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games.

MOVING UP THE RANKS: Jason Terry now has 7,364 points as a Maverick and moved into 7th place all-time among Mavs, passing Sam Perkins (6,766) with 18 points at NJ (12/2). Terry now trails Mavericks player development coach Brad Davis, one of only two players to have his jersey retired by the franchise, for 6th place. If JET sustains his 17.0 points per game pace, look for him to overtake Davis (7,623) by the end of the season.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8th of his career (2nd with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has 33 14-rebound performances (6 this season) since joining the Mavs in 2004-05 (recently: 15 vs. POR, 12/22). Dallas is 22-11 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

IRON ERICK: Erick Dampier recorded his 7th double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 35 minutes vs. MEM (12/26). In 2008-09, Dampier had 6 double-doubles for the entire season. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 50 double-doubles (39-11 record, .780). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 78-21 (.788). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 18 regular season games – including the 16 this season.

DIRK and KIDD FOR 3: For his career, Dirk Nowitzki has 1,110 3-pointers and ranks T-42nd all-time among NBA players (needs 14 3s to overtake David Wesley for 41st). In fact, Nowitzki (7,586 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,596 3FGs, 7,686 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in the NBA to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also BOS Rasheed Wallace, 1,047 3s and 7,205 rebounds).

CLUTCH: Dirk Nowitzki was once again the hero for the Mavericks vs. CHA (12/12) as he boosted them in overtime. Despite struggling from the field throughout the game, the German scored a 6-0 run over the last 1:20 of regulation to force the extra 5:00. Then, with 1.7 seconds remaining in OT, Nowitzki hit a 10-foot fade away to secure the win. The game-winner is Nowitzki's 2nd of the season (also in OT at MIL, 11/16) and the 8th of his career when there are less than 5 seconds remaining. Since 2005-06, Nowitzki owns the most game-winners (put team ahead for good in final 2 seconds) of any player in the NBA.

TOE THE LINE: The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 81.5% (1,037-1,272 FTs) from the line and lead the league in FT%. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.8% FT (7th in NBA) and has hit 4,712 FTs (4th).

WHAT A FLIRT: Jason Kidd is flirting with his 1st triple-double of the season (currently he has 103 for career trailing Oscar Robertson's 181 and Magic Johnson's 138). The point guard has 16 double-doubles and has fallen just short of a triple-double in 7 contests.

STOLE THE SHOW: With 2,303 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 6th on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals at SA (11/11/09), Kidd surpassed Clyde Drexler (2,207). The point guard is 5 steals away from taking 5th position from Scottie Pippen (2,307).

ALL ALONE IN SECOND PLACE: Jason Kidd now ranks 2nd all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,694 assists). With 7 assists at HOU (11/25/09), he passed Mark Jackson (10,334) for 2nd position. More specifically, Kidd dished his 10,335th assists on an alley-oop lob to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 to play in the 3rd quarter of the HOU game. Kidd now trails only John Stockton (15,806). For the season, the guard averages 9.2 assists (5th among NBA leaders).

IN THE TOP 5: Jason Kidd hit 2 3-pointers at TOR (1/17) to move into 5th place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,561 (surpassing Glen Rice, 1,559 3FGs). For his career, Kidd has 1,596 3-pointers. Kidd now trails NO's Peja Stojakovic and Dale Ellis (1,719 3FGs). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (2nd at 10,694 career assists, 6th at 9.2 avg; 3rd with 103 triple-doubles; 6th with 2,303 steals).

A STRING OF STARTS: Jason Kidd has the 7th-most starts in NBA history and has started 98.9% (1148-1161) of the games he has played. Only 2 other players with 1,000 career games have started a higher percentage than Kidd (Karl Malone: 99.7%, 1471-1476; Shaquille O'Neal: 99.2%, 1158-1167). Kidd ranks 32nd in career games.

Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 11-4 (.733) in the first game of a back-to-back and 7-7 (.500) in the second game.

HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT: Of the 13 players currently on the roster, 10 are former first round draft picks (Rodrigue Beaubois, Caron Butler, Erick Dampier, Brendan Haywood, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, DeShawn Stevenson, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas). Seven were top 10 picks (Butler, Dampier, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Eduardo Najera is the only Maverick to be drafted in the second round. Two Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll).

ELITE COMPANY: The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out 342 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 280-73 (.793). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 365-264 (.580); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
