## SEASON NOTES

**CONNECTIONS:** Mavericks assistant coach Terry Stotts got his coaching start under Nuggets head coach George Karl when they worked together in Seattle (five seasons) and Milwaukee (four seasons)...Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin hails from Dallas and makes his offseason home in Arlington, Texas...Mavericks player development coach Popeye Jones played for the Nuggets (1999-2000)...Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin played together in New Jersey for 2001-2004 where they advanced to the NBA Finals in 2002 and 2003...Denver forward Malik Allen finished the 2007-08 season with Dallas.

### FYI:

- Over the last 3 games, Jason Kidd is averaging 4.3 steals...after coming up with a career-high tying 6 steals vs. GS (2/3), Kidd added 4 more vs. MIN (2/5) and 3 at GS (2/8)
- The Mavs hit a season-high tying 12 3-pointers (22 attempts) at GS (2/8) led by a season-high 6 makes from Jason Terry
- Terry was 1 of many Mavs to record season-highs at GS (2/8)...he posted season marks in points (36), 3FGs (6), FTs (12), DR (6) and rebounds (tied, 6)...Terry scored 19 1<sup>st</sup> half points for the most in the 1<sup>st</sup> all season
- Meanwhile, Josh Howard had a season-high 25 points (S-Hs 10-12 FTs), Shawn Marion dished 5 assists, Drew Gooden scored 24 points

- The Mavs recorded season-highs in FTM and FTA at GS (2/8)...they hit 41-46 FTs (.891) led by 2 players who scored 10+ points at the line (Terry 12-13, Howard 10-12)
- Dallas is 19-6 when scoring 100+ points (with 3 of those losses in OT)...the Mavs are 10-2 when scoring 110+
- Since at MIL 11/16, the Mavericks have won 23 of 28 games when scoring 97+ points and have lost 11 of 13 games when scoring 96-or-less (wins vs. NO, 12/14 and at WAS, 1/20)
- Following the game vs. MIN (2/5), the Mavericks are now 11-3 when both Dirk Nowitzki (21) and Jason Terry (20) score 20+ points...a season ago, the team was 25-8 in such instances
- Dallas is 15-4 in games after a loss – the best mark in the NBA
- The Mavericks lead the league in wins when trailing at halftime with 12
- Dallas shot 55%-or-better for the 7<sup>th</sup> time this season at NY (1/24) with 58.1% FG
- The Mavericks have now hit at least 1 3-pointer in 907 consecutive games
- Dallas won by double digits (127-117) at GS (2/8) for the first time since winning (128-78) at NY (1/24)...of Dallas' 32 wins, 12 have come by at least 10 points...the Mavs have not won by double digits at home since (121-103) vs. HOU (11/10)
- Dallas is 18-4 when outrebounding the opposition (recently: L, 42-40 vs. MIN, 2/5)
- The Mavericks captured a Western Conference-best 17<sup>th</sup> road victory at GS (2/8)...a season ago, Dallas won just 18 total road games
- Jason Kidd recorded his 15<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season (team-best) at GS (2/8) with 17 points (5-9 FGs, 4-6 3FGs), 4 rebounds, 12 assists and 3 steals in 40 minutes...the double-double was his 12<sup>th</sup> with points-assists. Kidd is 1 of 7 players to have 10+ points-assists double-doubles this season (PHO Nash leads league with 31 followed by NO Paul 22, UTA Williams 21, BOS Rondo 21, CLE James 15, LAC Davis 12)
- The Mavericks will next be in action at home on 2/17 when they host Steve Nash and the Phoenix Suns at 8:00 p.m. on TXA and ESPN

**30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

**THE WEST'S BEST:** For the 9<sup>th</sup> consecutive season, Dirk Nowitzki was named to the Western Conference All-Star Team after being chosen by the conference's coaches as a reserve for The 59<sup>th</sup> NBA All-Star Game. He has made more appearances than any player in franchise history and, along with Jason Kidd, is the only Maverick to start an All-Star Game (2007, Las Vegas).

**PRETTY PASSING:** At GS (2/8), the Mavericks dished 33 assists on 37 FGM including 18 assists on 18 FGM in the 1<sup>st</sup> half. The Mavs posted assists on 89.2% of their made field goals led by Jason Kidd's 12. The last team to record that high a percentage (min. 30 FGM) was NJ (28 asts on 31 FGM, .903) on 4/18/08.

**GOODEN PLENTY:** Drew Gooden recorded his 9<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season with a season-best 24 points (8-14 FGs, 8-8 FTs) and 10 rebounds (5 OR) in 41 bench minutes at GS (2/8). According to Elias Sports Bureau, Gooden is only the 2<sup>nd</sup> Maverick in the last 10 seasons to record a 20-point/10-rebound effort off the bench joining Antawn Jamison (who had 2 such games in 2003-04).

**HOT ROD:** Rick Carlisle has given rookie Rodrigue Beaubois the nod as Jason Kidd's backup. He has seen significant minutes in the last 2 games (and was on his way to playing considerable time in UTA on 2/1 before bruising his back). Beaubois enjoyed his best game of the season vs. MIN (2/5) when he scored a career-high 17 points (6-10 FGs, 4-5 3FGs, 1-2 FTs) with 1 rebound, 2 assists and 2 steals in season-high tying 24 minutes. He made 4 of the team's 9 3s for the game, also setting career mark for 3s in a game and FGs in a contest.

**RUNNING UP THE SCORE:** For the 7<sup>th</sup> time this season, the Mavericks scored 60+ points in a half at GS (2/8). They finished the half with 61 points on 56.3% (18-32 FGs, 6-9 3FGs) shooting from the field. Over the last 3 1<sup>st</sup> halves, the Mavs are averaging 61.3 points 55.6% (65-117 FGs) from the field and 56.0% (14-25 3FGs) from 3. Dallas is 6-1 when scoring 60 1<sup>st</sup> half points.

**HAPPY TRAILS:** The Mavericks own the most wins in the league this season after trailing by 10+ points in a game. Meanwhile, they have the 2<sup>nd</sup>-fewest losses in the NBA when running out to a 10+ point lead. At GS (2/8), Dallas overcame a 13-point 2<sup>nd</sup> half deficit to steal a 127-117 win.

**LOOKIN FINE AT 89:** Over their last 10 contests, the Mavericks are shooting 88.3% (203-230 FTs) from the free throw line (season average is league-leading 81.5%). In that span, 6 players (min. 9 attempts) are shooting at least 85% from the stripe. The Mavericks have made at least 20 free throws just 3 times (21-22 vs. POR, 1/30; 29-35 vs. MIN, 2/5; 41-46 at GS, 2/8). In fact, in their last 13 games, Dallas has scored 20+ points at the line only 4 times.

**FRANCHISE PLAYER:** Dirk Nowitzki appeared in his 888<sup>th</sup> game as a Maverick vs. MIN (2/5). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Mav in franchise history at PHO (1/28). Nowitzki, the franchise's all-time scoring leader, is 1 of 3 active players that leads his team in career games joining CLE's Zydrunas Ilgauskas and CHA's Gerald Wallace.

**DIRK HAS THE EDGE:** Dirk Nowitzki has outscored his opposing power forward by 10+ points in 30 games this season. Below is a list of starting power forwards who have the most games in which they outscored their opposing power forward by 10+ points

**PERFECT 10:** For the 4<sup>th</sup> time this season (1-3 record), Dirk Nowitzki shot 100% from the free throw line when attempting at least 10 FTs. He and OKC's Durant are the only players in the NBA to have 4 such games. TOR's Chris Bosh and LAL's Kobe Bryant both have 3 perfect games (min. 10 attempts). For the season, Nowitzki ranks 7<sup>th</sup> among NBA players and shoots 89.3% from the FT line.

**HELPFUL HOWARD:** Josh Howard scored a season-high 25 points at GS (2/8) for his 2<sup>nd</sup> 20-point outing of the season. In 37 minutes off the bench, Howard hit 7 of his 12 attempts from the floor, 1 3-pointer and added 10 more points on the free throw line. The GS game marked the 8<sup>th</sup> time this season he has shot 50% FG (7-1 record).

**JUMP START:** Jason Terry has made himself right at home in the starting lineup. After first entering the lineup for an ill Josh Howard at WAS (1/20), Terry has remained in the lineup for 10 consecutive games (11 starts for season). In that span, the guard is averaging 20.1 points, 2.2 rebounds, 5.0 assists, 1.9 steals and 37.7 minutes. He is shooting 47.4% (73-154 FGs) from the floor, 45.5% (25-55 3FGs) from 3-point range and 85.7% (30-35 FTs) from the line. Below is a comparison of his numbers as a starter and as a reserve

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** For the 3<sup>rd</sup> time this season, 7 Mavericks scored in double figures at NY (1/24). Dirk Nowitzki and Jason Terry (20 each) paced the balanced attack while Shawn Marion, Drew Gooden (15), Roddy Beaubois (13), JJ Barea (11) and James Singleton (10) also finished with at least 10 points. In back-to-back games vs. MEM (12/26) and at DEN (12/27), 7 Mavs scored 10+. A season ago, Dallas recorded just 1 game with 7 players having 10+ points each.

**HISTORY IN THE MAKING:** A short-handed and road-weary Mavericks squad earned its biggest win in franchise history at NY (1/24). Dallas, without the services of Jason Kidd (personal reasons) and Erick Dampier (left knee effusion), won 128-78 after leading by as many as 53 points in the game. Previously, Dallas had won by 45 points at GS (1/15/85) in a 149-104 decision. Dallas posted the largest margin of victory in Madison Square Garden – a place the Knicks have called home since February, 1968.

**POURING IT IN DOWN THE STRETCH:** At GS (2/8), Jason Terry (10) and Dirk Nowitzki (5) combined for 15 of Dallas' 37 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points. And it seems that strong performances in the final period have become the norm for the duo. Nowitzki (6.8) owns the 5<sup>th</sup>-highest final period average while Jason Terry's 5.8 ppg rank T-6<sup>th</sup>.

**PROTECTING WHAT'S THEIRS:** Dallas committed just 6 turnovers and allowed only 6 points off those turnovers in a win vs. CLE (12/20). For the season, there have been just 11 teams (15 times) that have committed 6 turnovers or less. Dallas had an NBA season-low 5 turns vs. SA (11/18) and is one of only 3 teams (UTA, TOR) to have multiple games with 6 or fewer giveaways. Dallas 13.1 turnovers per game are the 6<sup>th</sup>-lowest committed in the NBA.

**REMARKABLE STREAK:** The Mavericks' 108-107 win vs. MIL (1/26) was their 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive win in a 1-point game dating back to Jan. 14, 2007. That's tied for the longest streak in NBA history. The St. Louis Hawks won 10 straight 1-point games from 1959 to 1960. This season, Dallas has gone 5-0 in 1 point games

**HIS PLACE IN HISTORY:** Dirk Nowitzki became the 34<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to score 20,000 career points with a 30-point night vs. LAL (1/13) and now ranks 33<sup>rd</sup> all-time on the NBA's scoring list. He scored his 20,000<sup>th</sup> and 20,001<sup>st</sup> points at the 10:57 mark of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter on a 14-foot jumper over Lamar Odom. He now has 20,324 career points. Nowitzki, the Mavericks' leading scorer, is 2<sup>nd</sup> player to reach the 20,000-point plateau this season joining BOS Ray Allen who accomplished the feat at WAS (12/10/09). Nowitzki passed Tom Chambers (20,049) for 33<sup>rd</sup> position with 19 points at TOR (1/17). He now trails BOS's Ray Allen and Mitch Raymond (20,497). Nowitzki ranks 6<sup>th</sup> among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Allen Iverson, Kevin Garnett and Allen. Nowitzki is followed by Tim Duncan (20,159) and Paul Pierce (19,389).

**MORE ON DIRK'S FEAT:** Dirk Nowitzki is the 4<sup>th</sup> player born outside the U.S. to score 20,000 career points. He joins Patrick Ewing (Jamaica, 24,815), Hakeem Olajuwon (Nigeria, 26,946) and Dominique Wilkins (France, 26,668). Of the 33 players who reach the 20,000-point plateau before Nowitzki, all of them who were eligible to be in the Hall of Fame have done so aside from Mitch Raymond (20,497) and Tom Chambers (20,049).

**GOOD NIGHT FROM THE FIELD:** The Mavericks shot 52.1% (37-71 FGs, 12-22 3FGs) from the field at GS (2/8). The game was the 28<sup>th</sup> of the season (20-8 record, .714) in which the Mavs shot at least 45% FG.

**LOTS OF HELP:** Dallas recorded 33 assists on 37 made field goals at GS (2/8) led by Jason Kidd's 12. Dallas improved to 20-1 when dishing 25+ assists. Dallas is 18-4 when Kidd dishes 10+ assists. The Mavericks rank 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league at 23.3 apg.

**DIFFERENT KIND OF DOUBLE-DOUBLE:** Jason Kidd recorded his 3<sup>rd</sup> rebounds-assists double-double (2<sup>nd</sup> in an OT game) of the season with a season-high tying 11 rebounds (11 DR) and 10 assists with 8 points and 4 steals in 43 minutes vs. HOU (12/18). He is the only player in the NBA this season to record a double-double of this variety. Since 2006-07, there have been 18 rebounds-assists double-doubles with Kidd owning 11 of them.

**DIRK GOES FOR 30/10 AGAIN:** Dirk Nowitzki turned out his 5<sup>th</sup> 30-point/10-rebound effort of the season with game-highs of 30 points (11-22 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 7-7 FTs) and 16 rebounds in 43 minutes vs. LAL (1/13). Dallas is 4-1 in those games. In the 2009 calendar year, Nowitzki had the 4<sup>th</sup>-most 30/10 games in the NBA and he currently has the 3<sup>rd</sup>-most in the 2009-10 season.

**NOWITZKI EFFICIENCY:** Dirk Nowitzki's 35 points at OKC (12/16) came on a very efficient 72.2% (13-18 FGs, 2-2 3FGs) from the floor. The game was the 2<sup>nd</sup> of the season for Nowitzki in which he scored at least 30 while shooting at least 71% FG (also 31, 10-14 FGs, .714 at IND 11/27). Nowitzki, GS Maggette and POR Roy are the only players in the league to have multiple games of 30 points on 70% FG. There have been 25 such games this season.

**ANOTHER NIGHT OF 90:** For the 11<sup>th</sup> time this season, the Mavericks shot 90% from the free throw vs. GS (2/3). The Mavs made 19 of their 21 attempts (.905). Drew Gooden (6-6 FTs) led the Mavericks. The Mavs are 8-3 when shooting such a high percentage from the line and have the most games at 90+ percent. NY (2-4), POR (4-2), HOU (2-3) and IND (4-1) are the only other teams to have 3+ such games.

**CLOSE CALL:** Dallas is 13-5 (.722) in games decided by 5 points or less. Recently, the Mavs lost to POR (1/30) 112-114 in OT. Since naming Rick Carlisle head coach, the Mavericks are 31-10 (.756) in games decided by that margin.

**LUCKY #13:** Jason Kidd dished 13 assists in a game for the 6<sup>th</sup> time this season with 16 vs. GS (2/3). Kidd is 1 of 4 players to record 6 13-assist games this season.

**PLETHORA OF POINTS:** Dirk Nowitzki has scored 1,240 points through 50 games this season. Nowitzki, who owns the NBA's 7<sup>th</sup>-highest scoring average, poured in his 12<sup>th</sup> 30-point game of the season at BOS (1/18). Nowitzki scored a game-high 37 points (14-22 FGs, 9-12 FTs) including 22 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half. A season ago, Nowitzki had 26 30-point games, tying his career high (also 2005-06). He is on pace for around 20 30-point games this season.

**NEARLY-FAULTLESS 4<sup>TH</sup>:** Dirk Nowitzki has missed 4 free throws in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and overtime (3 games). Nowitzki is 103-108 from the line (4-4 in OT) down the stretch. Between the late 4<sup>th</sup> quarter vs. NO (4/10/09) and the 2:02 mark of the 4<sup>th</sup> vs. POR (12/22), Nowitzki had made 66 consecutive FTs down the stretch. Nowitzki missed a season-high 2 4<sup>th</sup> quarter FTs at BOS (1/18).

**PRISTINE 15:** Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 31<sup>st</sup> 15-point half of the season at UTA (2/1) with 16 2<sup>nd</sup> half points in 22 minutes. For the season, Nowitzki has 9 20-point performances in a half – all of which have come after halftime. In halves when Nowitzki scores 15+, he shoots a combined 54.6% (203-372 FGs) from the floor, 51.6% (16-31 3FGs) from 3 and 92.1% (152-165 FTs) from the line.

**BOUNCING BACK:** Since the 2000-01 season (1<sup>st</sup> of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have suffered just 55 losses (in 789 games) of 15+ points. Five of those losses have come this season (88-110 at TOR, 1/17). What's more impressive though, is that the Mavs have won 40 of the games following their 15-point losses (40-15, .727). This season, Dallas is 3-2 in games following 15-point losses. Dallas has lost back-to-back by at least 15 just once in that span (2001-02 season).

**HOT SHOT:** Dallas poured in another great shooting effort at GS (2/8). The Mavericks, for the game, shot 52.1% (37-71 FGs) from the floor for the game. Dallas now owns 3 of the top 15 shooting games of the season, including the 2 of the 3 highest. The Mavs shot 65.5% (55-84 FGs) from the floor at HOU (11/25), 62.4% in a win vs. TOR (11/7) and 58.7% (44-75 FGs) in another win at NJ (12/2). A season ago, DAL just reached the 60% mark at MIA on 1/31/09 (.603). The last the time Mavs had shot that high a clip was when they went 67.7% vs. San Diego Clippers in 1983. The Mavericks are 13-1 when shooting at least 50% FG.

**IN SPITE OF THE RIM:** The Mavericks are 7-11 when shooting less than 44% FG (recently, L vs. MIN, 2/5). A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has 4 wins when shooting 40% or less FG (4-7 overall; L at PHI, 1/22). Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting 40% or worse.

**OVERCOMING ADVERSITY:** The Mavericks have used 12 different starting lineups through 51 games this season. Jason Terry has now started the last 10 games

**TOP 40:** Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2<sup>nd</sup> 40-point game of the season (14<sup>th</sup> of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs) in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 9 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games. There have been 47 40-point outings this season.

**MOVING UP THE RANKS:** Jason Terry now has 7,301 points as a Maverick and moved into 7<sup>th</sup> place all-time among Mavs, passing Sam Perkins (6,766) with 18 points at NJ (12/2). Terry now trails Mavericks player development coach Brad Davis, one of only two players to have his jersey retired by the franchise, for 6<sup>th</sup> place. If JET sustains his 17.1 points per game pace, look for him to overtake Davis (7,623) by the end of the season.

**CRASHING THE BOARDS:** Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8<sup>th</sup> of his career (2<sup>nd</sup> with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has 33 14-rebound performances (6 this season) since joining the Mavs in 2004-05 (recently: 15 vs. POR, 12/22). Dallas is 22-11 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

**IRON ERICK:** Erick Dampier recorded his 7<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 35 minutes vs. MEM (12/26). In 2008-09, Dampier had 6 double-doubles for the entire season. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 50 double-doubles (39-11 record, .780). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 78-21 (.788). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 18 regular season games – including the 13 this season.

**DIRK and KIDD FOR 3:** For his career, Dirk Nowitzki has 1,109 3-pointers and ranks T-42<sup>nd</sup> all-time among NBA players (needs 15 3s to overtake David Wesley for 41st). In fact, Nowitzki (7,562 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,584 3FGs, 7,662 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in the NBA to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also BOS Rasheed Wallace, 1,045 3s and 7,190 rebounds).

**CLUTCH:** Dirk Nowitzki was once again the hero for the Mavericks vs. CHA (12/12) as he boosted them in overtime. Despite struggling from the field throughout the game, the German scored a 6-0 run over the last 1:20 of regulation to force the extra 5:00. Then, with 1.7 seconds remaining in OT, Nowitzki hit a 10-foot fade away to secure the win. The game-winner is Nowitzki's 2<sup>nd</sup> of the season (also in OT at MIL, 11/16) and the 8<sup>th</sup> of his career when there are less than 5 seconds remaining. Since 2005-06, Nowitzki owns the most game-winners (put team ahead for good in final 2 seconds) of any player in the NBA.

**TOE THE LINE:** The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 81.5% (958-1,176 FTs) from the line and lead the league in FT%. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.8% FT (7<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and has hit 4,691 FTs (4<sup>th</sup>).

**WHAT A FLIRT:** Jason Kidd is flirting with his 1<sup>st</sup> triple-double of the season (currently he has 103 for career trailing Oscar Robertson's 181 and Magic Johnson's 138). The point guard has 15 double-doubles and has fallen just short of a triple-double in 6 contests.

**STOLE THE SHOW:** With 2,290 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 6<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals at SA (11/11/09), Kidd surpassed Clyde Drexler (2,207). The point guard is 18 steals away from taking 5<sup>th</sup> position from Scottie Pippen (2,307).

**ALL ALONE IN SECOND PLACE:** Jason Kidd now ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,666 assists). With 7 assists at HOU (11/25/09), he passed Mark Jackson (10,334) for 2<sup>nd</sup> position. More specifically, Kidd dished his 10,335<sup>th</sup> assists on an alley-oop lob to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 to play in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of the HOU game. Kidd now trails only John Stockton (15,806). For the season, the guard averages 9.3 assists (5<sup>th</sup> among NBA leaders).

**IN THE TOP 5:** Jason Kidd hit 2 3-pointers at TOR (1/17) to move into 5<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,561 (surpassing Glen Rice, 1,559 3FGs). For his career, Kidd has 1,584 3-pointers. Kidd now trails NO's Peja Stojakovic and Dale Ellis (1,719 3FGs). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (2<sup>nd</sup> at 10,666 career assists, 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.2 avg; 3<sup>rd</sup> with 103 triple-doubles; 6<sup>th</sup> with 2,290 steals).

**A STRING OF STARTS:** Jason Kidd has the 7<sup>th</sup>-most starts in NBA history and has started 98.9% (1144-1157) of the games he has played. Only 2 other players with 1,000 career games have started a higher percentage than Kidd (Karl Malone: 99.7%, 1471-1476; Shaquille O'Neal: 99.2%, 1154-1163). Kidd ranks 33<sup>rd</sup> in career games.

Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 10-3 (.769) in the first game of a back-to-back and 6-6 (.500) in the second game.

**HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT:** Of the 14 players currently on the roster, nine are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Eduardo Najera is the only Maverick to be drafted in the second round. Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)  
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)  
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

**JUST THE TWO OF US:** The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out 341 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 279-73 (.793). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

## HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

**Regular Season Coaching Record: 363-262 (.581); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)**

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
