## SEASON NOTES

**CONNECTIONS:** Mavericks guard J.J. Barea played his college ball at Northeastern in Boston...Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Celtics forward Brian Scalabrine played together with the Nets from 2001-05...Mavericks Coach Rick Carlisle played for the Celtics for three seasons and was a member of the 1986 World Championship team...Celtics guard Marquis Daniels played for the Mavericks from 2003-2006 and was a member of the Mavericks Western Conference Championship squad...Mavericks guard Matt Carroll and Celtics center Rasheed Wallace played in Portland together from 2003-2004...Both Mavericks guard Jason Terry and Celtics point guard Nate Robinson hail from Seattle.

**FYI:**

- The Mavs got their 1<sup>st</sup> win of the season when allowing the opposition to shoot 60% FG in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half (CHI was .622 on 23-37 FGs)...Dallas is 1-4 in such games
- Dallas improved to 7-1 when all 5 starters score 10+ points vs. NJ (3/10) – Jason Kidd (20), Caron Butler (18), Shawn Marion (14), Dirk Nowitzki (12), Brendan Haywood (11)
- Jason Kidd has made the 2<sup>nd</sup>-most 3s in the NBA since 2/1 with 55 (LAC Rasual Butler, 57)...he has the T3rd-most for the season (143)...his 143 3-pointers (with 15 games remaining in the season) mark a career-high for 3s in a season (139 in 2005-06). Kidd is on pace for around 173 3s. He is also shooting a career-high 41.9% 3FG
- Dallas is 11-0 when dishing 30+ assists which the 2<sup>nd</sup>-most such games in the NBA (UTA 14-2)...the Mavs and Jazz are the only teams in the league to have 10+ games with 30 assists (ATL and BOS have 9; DEN has 8)
- Dallas has now won 4 straight in the 2<sup>nd</sup> game of a back-to-back (vs. PHO 2/17, vs. MIA 2/20, at CHA 3/1, at CHI 3/6)
- Jason Kidd came away with a career-high 7 steals vs. PHO (2/17)...his previous high was 6 (24 times). Kidd is 1 of 4 players to have a 7-steal game this season (also NO Paul and OKC Westbrook (8) and GS Watson (7))
- Dallas is 28-6 when scoring 100+ points (with 3 of those losses in OT) and 15-2 when scoring 110+
- Following the game vs. MIN (3/3), the Mavericks are now 14-3 when both Jason Terry (26) and Dirk Nowitzki (22) score 20+ points...a season ago, the team was 25-8 in such instances
- Nowitzki and Terry are the 1<sup>st</sup> set of Mavericks teammates to score 30 points in the same game since the duo did so (Nowitzki 34, JET 33) vs. WAS (3/7/09)
- Dallas is 5-0 when both Nowitzki and Caron Butler score 20+ (recently: vs. CHI, 3/17)...Nowitzki has scored 20+ points in each of the 5 games Butler has since the trade
- The Mavericks have now hit at least 1 3-pointer in 924 consecutive games
- Of Dallas' 46 wins, 16 have come by at least 10 points (recently: 125-112 at MIN, 3/8)
- Dallas is 22-6 when outrebounding the opposition (recently: L, 43-32 vs. NY, 3/13)
- The Mavericks captured a Western Conference-best 22<sup>nd</sup> road victory at MIN (3/8)...last season, Dallas won 18 road games
- Jason Kidd recorded his 23<sup>rd</sup> double-double of the season (team-best) at MIN (3/8) with 12 points, 4 rebounds, 10 assists and 3 steals in 37 minutes...for the season, he has 18 with points-assists. Kidd is 1 of 7 players to have 10+ points-assists double-doubles this season (PHO Nash leads league with 40 followed by UTA Williams 35, BOS Rondo 30, NO Paul 22, CLE James 22, LAC Davis 15)
- The Mavericks will next be in action at home on 3/23 when they host Chris Kaman and the L.A. Clippers at 7:30 p.m. on FSSW

**30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

**OH WHAT A NIGHT!:** For the 9<sup>th</sup> consecutive season, Dirk Nowitzki represented the Western Conference in the 59<sup>th</sup> NBA All-Star Game. Nowitzki and his teammates played before a record 108,713 fans in the largest crowd to ever watch a basketball game as the East was victorious (141-139). Originally voted into the game as a reserve, Nowitzki was named to the starting lineup by George Karl in place of an injured Kobe Bryant. Nowitzki finished the game with an All-Star career-high 22 points (8-15 FGs, 6-6 FTs), 4 rebounds, 2 assists and 1 steal in 28 minutes. He has made more appearances than any player in franchise history and, along with Jason Kidd, is the only Maverick to start an All-Star Game (also Las Vegas, 2007).

**KIDD TURNS 10:** Jason Kidd was honored as an All-Star for the 10<sup>th</sup> time in his career after being named a replacement (Kobe Bryant) by Commissioner David Stern. Kidd cut short a planned trip to Phoenix to participate in the All-Star Game. He played 6 minutes off the bench and came down with 2 rebounds, dished 1 assist and grabbed 1 steal. Kidd and Dirk Nowitzki became the first set of Mavs teammates to play on the same All-Star team since Nowitzki and Josh Howard (Las Vegas, 2007).

**SHOOTING STAR:** Dirk Nowitzki, San Antonio Silver Stars guard Becky Hammon and TNT analyst/Houston Rockets legend Kenny Smith won the 2010 Haier Shooting Stars contest as members of the Team Texas contingent. In the final round, Nowitzki hit a half court shot giving the team a total time of 39.3 seconds and the victory over Team Los Angeles.

**JET ON THE RUNWAY:** Jason Terry underwent surgery to repair facial injuries sustained in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter vs. MIN (3/3). Now in his 11<sup>th</sup> season, Terry has missed just 25 games which is the 2<sup>nd</sup>-fewest among players with at least 10 seasons (Andre Miller has missed 5). Dallas is 13-5 (.722) when Terry does not play (5-3 last season when he broke his hand; 4-1 this season). Dirk Nowitzki has missed just 31 in his career (3<sup>rd</sup>-fewest). Terry returned to the lineup vs. CHI (3/17).

**GONE STREAKING:** The Mavericks won 13 straight between vs. PHO (2/17) and vs. NJ (3/10). Below is a list of the longest streaks in franchise history.

**MORE ON THE STREAK:** Dallas put together its 8<sup>th</sup> 10+ game winning streak in franchise history and the T-longest in the NBA this season (CLE: also 13 between @ LAC 1/16 and vs. ORL 2/11).

**SINCE ASW:** The Mavs own the highest winning percentage of any team in the NBA since the All-Star Break (14-2, .875). Dallas is the only team to record just 2 losses since the Break.

**CARLISLE'S FIRST 13-GAME STREAK:** According to Elias, Rick Carlisle has a .587 career winning percentage (376-265) as a head coach in the NBA. Only 13 men who coached at least 500 NBA games have a winning percentage as high as Carlisle's, but until the win vs. NJ (3/10), he was the only one of them without a winning streak of at least 13 games on his resume. Among that group of coaches, Carlisle, Tom Heinsohn, Chuck Daly and Gregg Popovich remain the only ones without a winning streak of more than 13 games.

**THE BUTLER DID IT:** For the 1<sup>st</sup> time since joining the Mavericks at All-Star Break, Caron Butler led the team in scoring vs. CHI (3/17). He recorded 27 points (6-11 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 14-16 FTs) with 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 1 steal in 35 minutes. His makes and attempts at the FT line marked season highs while he was just 1 short of tying career-high in both FTM and FTA. Butler has scored 27+ points on 4 occasions this season and has scored 20+ in 5 games with Dallas.

**MATRIX:** Over his last 7 games, Shawn Marion is averaging 16.5 points, 8.5 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.1 blocks while shooting 55.8% (53-95 FGs) from the floor including a season-high 29 points with 14 rebounds for his 5<sup>th</sup> double-double at MIN (3/8)...Marion posted 14 points and 13 rebounds (season-high 11 DR) vs. NJ (3/10) to record back-to-back double-doubles for the first time since last April with TOR (at WAS 4/13, at CHI 4/14/09).

**ON TOP OF HIS GAME:** Since the All-Star Break, Jason Kidd has been throwing up the best numbers since rejoining Dallas in Feb., 2008. In 15 games post-All-Star, Kidd is averaging 12.8 points, 6.6 rebounds, 9.2 assists, 2.0 steals and 37.0 minutes. He has notched 7 double-doubles and 1 triple-double in that span. Kidd earned a well-deserved night off vs. MIN (3/3). In 6 games since his rest, Kidd has recorded 3 double-doubles (2 with points-assists) and recorded his 3<sup>rd</sup> 20-point night of the season (team-best 20 vs. NJ, 3/10).

**RODDY, PROUD AND LOUD:** Roddy Beaubois has put together a career stretch between vs. MIN (3/3) and vs. CHI (3/17). After scoring a career-high tying 17 points at MIN (3/3), Beaubois became the 1<sup>st</sup> Maverick rookie since 2006-07 to score 20 points in a game with 22 vs. SAC (3/5). Previously, Maurice Ager scored 20 at GS (4/17/07). Beaubois followed that with a career-high 24 points (10-17 FGs, 1-6 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) in a career-high 35 minutes at CHI (3/6). He scored 18 of his 24 points in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter (7-8 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 3-3 FTs in 12 minutes). In the month of March (7 games, 2 starts), Beaubois is averaging 16.3 points, 2.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 24.0 minutes while shooting 56.3% (45-80 FGs) from the floor, 34.5% (10-29 3FGs) from 3-point range and 77.8% (14-18 FTs) from the line. Beaubois has scored 11+ points in each game during that span (11 vs. CHI).

**ELIAS SAYS:** According to Elias Sports Bureau, Roddy Beaubois became the 5<sup>th</sup> rookie this season to score 18+ points in a quarter (18 in 3<sup>rd</sup> at CHI, 3/6). The others are Tyreke Evans (18, 2nd, vs. GS 11/8), Brandon Jennings (29, 3<sup>rd</sup>, vs. GS 11/14), AJ Price (19, 4<sup>th</sup>, at OKC 1/9) and Marcus Thornton (23, 2<sup>nd</sup>, at CLE 2/23).

**3-POINT RANGE:** Jason Kidd hit a 3-pointer in 31 straight games between vs. DET (1/5) and vs. NY (3/13) to set a personal best of consecutive games with a 3. His streak was the 2nd-longest current in the NBA behind HOU's Brooks (39, active) when it ended vs. CHI (3/17). In that span, Kidd shot 45.1% (83-184 3FGs) from 3-point range.

**MARQUEE NIGHT:** Jason Kidd earned his 104<sup>th</sup> career triple-double with 19 points (7-18 FGs, 4-10 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), season-high 16 rebounds, season-high tying 17 assists and 2 steals in 46 minutes at ATL (2/26). Kidd is the first NBA player to record 15, 15 and 15 in the same game since he did so with 21 points, 16 rebounds and 16 assists (with DAL) on 1/30/96. He is only the 4<sup>th</sup> player to have 19, 15, 15 since the 1986-87 season (Kidd twice, Magic Johnson twice, Fat Lever once, Larry Bird once). In fact, in league history, Kidd is 1 of 4 players to reach those levels (19, 16, 17) in an NBA game (Oscar Robertson and Wilt Chamberlin twice, Guy Rodgers and Johnson once). Kidd is 1 of 11 players in the NBA to record a triple-double this season. CLE's James leads the league with 3 and is the only player with multiple.

**MAVS PART OF NBA HISTORY IN OT WIN:** The Mavericks played their 7<sup>th</sup> overtime game (4-3 record) of the season in ATL (2/26) – more than the last 2 seasons combined (Dallas played 6 total OT games in 2007-08 and 2008-09). The last time Dallas played 8 OT games was in 1997-98. The Mavs and Hawks were part of NBA history in Friday night. Three other games required overtime to determine a winner. According to Elias Sports Bureau, that ties an NBA record for most OT games in one day (it has happened 4 times with the most recent being 1/24/07).

**ALL ABOARD!:** Brendan Haywood came down with a career-high tying 20 rebounds (career-high 18 DR) vs. IND (2/22). In addition, he scored 13 points and had 3 blocks for his 15<sup>th</sup> double-double (2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive). The game was his 2<sup>nd</sup> of the season with 20 boards – he also had 20 at CHI (1/15) as a member of the Wizards. Haywood becomes the 3<sup>rd</sup> player in the last 20 seasons to record that many rebounds in games with two teams in one season joining Dikembe Mutombo (ATL, PHI in 2000-01) and Olden Polynice (PHO, SAC in 1993-94). Haywood and Erick Dampier (20 vs. HOU, 11/10) are the first Mavericks teammates to have 20-rebound games in the same season since Shawn Bradley and Samaki Walker (1997-98 season). Haywood returned to the starting lineup vs. NJ (3/10) after missing 2 games (lower back tightness) and recorded his 18<sup>th</sup> double-double (4<sup>th</sup> w/ DAL) with 11 points and 10 boards in 24 minutes. Following are Dallas' records when Haywood posts various stats: 12-1 (as starter), 7-0 (10+ pts), 5-0 (10+ rebs), 4-0 (double-double), 8-1 (2+ blocks).

**RUNNING UP THE SCORE:** For the 12<sup>th</sup> time this season, the Mavericks scored 60+ points in the 1<sup>st</sup> half vs. CHI (3/17). They finished the half with 64 points on 65.8% (25-38 FGs) from the field, 37.5% (3-8 3FGs) from 3-point range and 91.7% (11-12 FTs) from the line. Dallas is 11-1 when scoring 60 1<sup>st</sup> half points.

**HAPPY TRAILS:** The Mavericks own the most wins and have the best winning percentage in the league this season after trailing by 10+ points in a game. Meanwhile, they have the fewest losses in the NBA (4) when running out to a 10+ point lead. Vs. NJ (3/10), Dallas overcame an 18-point 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter deficit to earn a 96-87 win

**PERFECT 10:** For the 7<sup>th</sup> time this season (3-4 record), Dirk Nowitzki shot 100% from the free throw line when attempting at least 10 FTs. He was a perfect 10-10 FTs vs. NY (3/13). OKC's Durant also has 7 such games. TOR's Bosh and DEN's Billups have 4. LAL's Bryant has 3 perfect games (min. 10 attempts). For the season, Nowitzki ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> among NBA players and shoots 90.5% from the FT line.

**DIRK HAS THE EDGE:** Dirk Nowitzki has outscored his opposing power forward by 10+ points in 41 games this season. Below is a list of starting power forwards who have the most games in which they outscored their opposing power forward by 10+ points

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** For the 3<sup>rd</sup> time this season, 7 Mavericks scored in double figures at NY (1/24). Dirk Nowitzki and Jason Terry (20 each) paced the balanced attack while Shawn Marion, Drew Gooden (15), Roddy Beaubois (13), JJ Barea (11) and James Singleton (10) also finished with at least 10 points. In back-to-back games vs. MEM (12/26) and at DEN (12/27), 7 Mavs scored 10+. A season ago, Dallas recorded just 1 game with 7 players having 10+ points each.

**POURING IT IN DOWN THE STRETCH:** At CHI (3/6), Dirk Nowitzki scored 13 of Dallas' 28 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points. Nowitzki (6.9) owns the 2nd-highest final period average while Jason Terry's 6.1 ppq rank T-5th.

**REMARKABLE STREAK:** The Mavericks' 108-107 win vs. MIL (1/26) was their 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive win in a 1-point game dating back to Jan. 14, 2007. That's tied for the longest streak in NBA history. The St. Louis Hawks won 10 straight 1-point games from 1959 to 1960. This season, Dallas has gone 5-0 in 1 point games

**HIS PLACE IN HISTORY:** Dirk Nowitzki became the 34<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to score 20,000 career points with a 30-point night vs. LAL (1/13) and now ranks 32<sup>nd</sup> all-time on the NBA's scoring list. He scored his 20,000<sup>th</sup> and 20,001<sup>st</sup> points at the 10:57 mark of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter on a 14-foot jumper over Lamar Odom. He now has 20,760 career points. Nowitzki, the Mavericks' leading scorer, was 2<sup>nd</sup> player to reach the 20,000-point plateau this season joining BOS Ray Allen who accomplished the feat at WAS (12/10/09). Nowitzki passed George Gervin (20,708) for 30<sup>th</sup> position with 12 points vs. NJ (3/10). He now trails David Robinson (20,790). Nowitzki ranks 5<sup>th</sup> among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Allen Iverson and Kevin Garnett. Nowitzki is followed by Allen (20,725), Tim Duncan (20,401) and Paul Pierce (19,614).

**MORE ON DIRK'S FEAT:** Dirk Nowitzki is the 4<sup>th</sup> player born outside the U.S. to score 20,000 career points. He joins Patrick Ewing (Jamaica, 24,815), Hakeem Olajuwon (Nigeria, 26,946) and Dominique Wilkins (France, 26,668). Of the 33 players who reach the 20,000-point plateau before Nowitzki, all of them who were eligible to be in the Hall of Fame have done so aside from Mitch Raymond (20,497) and Tom Chambers (20,049).

**FRANCHISE PLAYER:** Dirk Nowitzki appeared in his 906<sup>th</sup> game as a Maverick vs. CHI (3/17). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Mav in franchise history at PHO (1/28). Nowitzki, the franchise's all-time scoring leader, is 1 of 2 active players who leads his team in career games (CHA's Gerald Wallace). Nowitzki is the 3<sup>rd</sup>-longest tenured player with his original team (LAL Bryant 1996-97; SA Duncan 1997-98).

**LOTS OF HELP:** Dallas recorded 30 assists on 48 made field goals at MIN (3/8) led by Jason Kidd's 10. Dallas improved to 24-1 when dishing 25+ assists and 11-0 when dishing 30+. Dallas is 25-5 when Kidd dishes 10+ assists. The Mavericks rank 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league at 23.5 apg.

**DIFFERENT KIND OF DOUBLE-DOUBLE:** Jason Kidd recorded his 4<sup>th</sup> rebounds-assists double-double (has 2 in OT) of the season with a 11 rebounds (9 DR) and 15 assists with 6 points and 1 steal in 39 minutes at CHI (3/6). He is the only player in the NBA this season to record a double-double of this variety. Since 2006-07, there have been 19 rebounds-assists double-doubles with Kidd owning 12 of them.

**DIRK GOES FOR 30/10 AGAIN:** Dirk Nowitzki turned out his 6<sup>th</sup> 30-point/10-rebound effort of the season with game-highs of 31 points (12-26 FGs, 7-7 FTs) and 12 rebounds in 42 minutes vs. SAC (3/5). Dallas is 5-1 in those games. Since 1/1/2009, Nowitzki owns the T5th-most 30/10 games in the NBA and the T4th-most for the 2009-10 campaign.

**ANOTHER NIGHT OF 90:** For the 14<sup>th</sup> time this season, the Mavericks shot 90% from the free throw vs. SAC (3/5). The Mavs made 17 of their 18 attempts (.944). Dirk Nowitzki (7-7 FTs) led the Mavericks. The Mavs are 10-4 (.714) when shooting such a high percentage from the line and have the most games at 90+ percent. POR (7-2), HOU (4-4), IND (4-4), ATL (4/3) and PHI (1-6) are the only other teams to have 7+ such games.

**CLOSE CALL:** Dallas is 16-5 (.762) in games decided by 5 points or less. Recently, the Mavs defeated MIN (3/3) 112-109. Since naming Rick Carlisle head coach, the Mavericks are 34-10 (.773) in games decided by that margin. Additionally, the Mavs have the best winning percentage in the league in games decided by 3 points or less.

**BOUNCING BACK:** Since the 2000-01 season (1<sup>st</sup> of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have suffered just 57 losses (in 806 games) of 15+ points. Seven of those losses have come this season (94-128 vs. NY, 2/13). What's more impressive though, is that the Mavs have won 41 of the games following their 15-point losses (41-16, .719). This season, Dallas is 4-3 in games following 15-point losses. Dallas has lost back-to-back by at least 15 just once in that span (2001-02 season).

**PRISTINE 15:** Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 45<sup>th</sup> 15-point half of the season vs. CHI (3/17) with 17 points in 16 2<sup>nd</sup> half minutes. For the season, Nowitzki has 11 20-point performances in a half – all of which have come after halftime. **GOOD NIGHT FROM THE FIELD:** The Mavericks shot 52.6% (41-78 FGs, 6-18 3FGs) from the field vs. CHI (3/17). The game was the 39<sup>th</sup> of the season (31-8 record, .795) in which the Mavs shot at least 45% FG.

**HOT SHOT:** Dallas poured in another great shooting effort vs. CHI (3/17). The Mavericks, for the game, shot 52.6% (41-78 FGs, 6-18 3FGs) from the floor for the game. Dallas owns 2 of the top 5 shooting games of the season. The Mavs shot 65.5% (55-84 FGs) from the floor at HOU (11/25) and 62.4% in a win vs. TOR (11/7). **IN SPITE OF THE RIM:** The Mavericks are 10-14 when shooting 44% FG or less (recently, L vs. NY, 3/13). A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has 5 wins when shooting 40% or less FG (5-9 overall; W vs. IND, 2/22). Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting 40% or worse.

**OVERCOMING ADVERSITY:** The Mavericks have used 19 different starting lineups through 68 games this season.

**MOVING UP THE RANKS:** Jason Terry now has 7,495 points as a Maverick and moved into 7<sup>th</sup> place all-time among Mavs, passing Sam Perkins (6,766) with 18 points at NJ (12/2). Terry now trails Mavericks player development coach Brad Davis, one of only two players to have his jersey retired by the franchise, for 6<sup>th</sup> place. If JET sustains his 16.8 points per game pace, he can overtake Davis (7,623) by the end of the season.

**TOP 40:** Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2<sup>nd</sup> 40-point game of the season (14<sup>th</sup> of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs) in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 11 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games.

**CRASHING THE BOARDS:** Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8<sup>th</sup> of his career (2<sup>nd</sup> with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has 33 14-rebound performances (6 this season) since joining the Mavs in 2004-05 (recently: 15 vs. POR, 12/22). Dallas is 22-11 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

**IRON ERICK:** Erick Dampier recorded his 7<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 35 minutes vs. MEM (12/26). In 2008-09, Dampier had 6 double-doubles for the entire season. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 50 double-doubles (39-11 record, .780). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 78-21 (.788). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 18 regular season games – including the 26 this season.

**DIRK and KIDD FOR 3:** For his career, Dirk Nowitzki has 1,112 3-pointers and ranks T-42<sup>nd</sup> all-time among NBA players (needs 12 3s to overtake David Wesley for 41st). In fact, Nowitzki (7,689 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,629 3FGs, 7,762 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in the NBA to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also BOS Rasheed Wallace, 1,055 3s and 7,257 rebounds).

**CLUTCH:** Dirk Nowitzki was once again the hero for the Mavericks vs. CHA (12/12) as he boosted them in overtime. Despite struggling from the field throughout the game, the German scored a 6-0 run over the last 1:20 of regulation to force the extra 5:00. Then, with 1.7 seconds remaining in OT, Nowitzki hit a 10-foot fade away to secure the win. The game-winner is Nowitzki's 2<sup>nd</sup> of the season (also in OT at MIL, 11/16) and the 8<sup>th</sup> of his career when there are less than 5 seconds remaining. Since 2005-06, Nowitzki owns the most game-winners (put team ahead for good in final 2 seconds) of any player in the NBA.

**TOE THE LINE:** The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 81.7% (1,282-1,570 FTs) from the line and lead the league in FT%. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.4% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.9% FT (7<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and has hit 4,808 FTs (4<sup>th</sup>).

**MR. TRIPLE-DOUBLE:** Jason Kidd earned his 1<sup>st</sup> triple-double of the season (104<sup>th</sup> of career, trailing Oscar Robertson's 181 and Magic Johnson's 138) with 19 points, season-high 16 rebounds, season-high tying 17 assists and 2 steals in 46 minutes at ATL (2/26/10). He posted 11 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists and 1 steal in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter alone of the ATL game. The point guard has a team-high 24 double-doubles.

**STOLE THE SHOW:** With 2,321 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 5<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals vs. NO (2/28/10), Kidd surpassed Maurice Cheeks (2,310). The point guard is 124 steals away from taking 3<sup>rd</sup> position from Gary Payton (2,445).

**ALL ALONE IN SECOND PLACE:** Jason Kidd now ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,809 assists). With 7 assists at HOU (11/25/09), he passed Mark Jackson (10,334) for 2<sup>nd</sup> position. More specifically, Kidd dished his 10,335<sup>th</sup> assists on an alley-oop lob to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 to play in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of the HOU game. Kidd now trails only John Stockton (15,806). For the season, the guard averages 9.2 assists (5<sup>th</sup> among NBA leaders).

**IN THE TOP 5:** Jason Kidd hit 2 3-pointers at TOR (1/17) to move into 5<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,561 (surpassing Glen Rice, 1,559 3FGs). For his career, Kidd has 1,629 3-pointers. Kidd now trails NO's Peja Stojakovic and Dale Ellis (1,719 3FGs). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (2<sup>nd</sup> at 10,809 career assists, 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.2 apg; 3<sup>rd</sup> with 104 triple-doubles; 4<sup>th</sup> with 2,321 steals).

**A STRING OF STARTS:** Jason Kidd has the 7<sup>th</sup>-most starts in NBA history and has started 98.9% (1160-1173) of the games he has played. Only 2 other players with 1,000 career games have started a higher percentage than Kidd (Karl Malone: 99.7%, 1471-1476; Shaquille O'Neal: 99.2%, 1161-1170). Kidd ranks 29<sup>th</sup> in career games (1<sup>st</sup> among active players).

Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 13-4 (.765) in the first game of a back-to-back and 10-7 (.588) in the second game.

Eduardo Najera is the only Maverick to be drafted in the second round. Two Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll).

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)  
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)  
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out 351 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 288-74 (.796). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

## HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

**Regular Season Coaching Record: 377-265 (.587); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)**

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
