CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Spurs forward Richard Jefferson were teammates in New Jersey for seven seasons from 2001-2008...Mavericks guard Matt Carroll played in San Antonio for a brief stint in 2004...Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Spurs forward Antonio McDyess played together in Phoenix from 1997-1998...Spurs guard Keith Bogans played with Mavericks guard Matt Carroll in Charlotte from 2005-2006.

PLAYOFF NOTES

SPRINGTIME TRADITION: Dallas is making its 10th straight appearance, and 16th overall, in the NBA Playoffs. This extends the longest streak in franchise history and is currently the second-longest in the NBA, trailing only San Antonio's 13 consecutive postseasons. Dallas is the Western Conference's two seed after finishing the season 55-27 and will face seventh-seeded San Antonio (50-32) in the first round.

FIRST ROUND KNOCKOUTS: The Mavericks are 10-9 all-time in first-round series. Dallas won 3-2 vs. Seattle in 1984, 3-1 vs. Utah in 1986, 3-1 vs. Houston in 1988, 3-2 vs. Utah in 2001, 3-0 vs. Minnesota in 2002, 4-3 vs. Portland in 2003, 4-3 vs. Houston in 2005, 4-0 vs. Memphis in 2006 and 4-1 vs. San Antonio in 2009. The Mavericks lost 3-1 to Portland in 1985, 3-1 to Seattle in 1987, 3-0 to Portland in 1990, 4-1 to Sacramento in 2004, 4-2 to Golden State in 2007 and 4-1 to New Orleans in 2008. Dallas is 24-11 at home and 13-23 on the road all-time in the first round.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF DALLAS: In 15 previous playoff appearances, the Dallas Mavericks have made three Western Conference Finals appearances (1988, 2003, 2006) and advanced to the NBA Finals once (2006).

DÉJÀ VU: Dallas and San Antonio meet for the 5th time in the postseason and the 2nd consecutive time in the opening round. For the first time in franchise history, the Mavericks play the same opponent in the opening round for consecutive postseasons.

7 V. 2: Since 1984, when the NBA implemented the current 16-game playoff format, the No. 2 is 162-66 (.711) vs. No. 7 and has won 48 of 52 series (.923). Both No. 2 seeds were victorious last season with Denver defeating New Orleans in 5 games and Boston besting Chicago in 7 contests. This season, in the East, #2 Orlando swept #7 Charlotte in 4 games.

EXPERIENCE MATTERS: Dallas boasts a roster of 4 players with Finals experience. Three of those players were members of the Mavericks' 2006 Western Conference Championship team that was defeated 4-2 by Miami in the NBA Finals (Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Erick Dampier). Jason Kidd reached the Finals in both 2002 and 2003 with New Jersey. Rodrigue Beaubois is the only Maverick without postseason experience.

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki owns franchise playoff marks in points (2,599), field goals (848), 3-pointers (114), free throws (789), rebounds (1,113), steals (124), blocks (105), games and starts (102).

TOPPING THE NBA'S LISTS: Jason Kidd and Dirk Nowitzki sit at or near the top of many of the NBA's all-time playoff lists.

TRENDS TO WATCH:

- Dallas outshot SA in Game 5 (4/27) for the 1st time in the series. DAL shot 44.0% (37-84 FGs, 6-24 3FGs) while SA shot 35.9% (28-78 FGs). SA had outshot DAL by an average of nearly 6% in the previous 4 games (SA: .481 FG, DAL: .423 FG)
- In Game 5 (4/27), San Antonio's bench outscored Dallas' bench 45-25 led by 18 from Tony Parker. The team whose reserves have scored more points have lost every game in the series
- The team that has won the 1st quarter is 5-0 in the series (DAL won 1Q of Game 5, 27-21)
- The Mavs have won both games in which they have outrebounded SA (52-41 in Game 5). Dallas' 52 boards marked a postseason-high. In the regular season, Dallas was 8-2 when coming down with 50+ boards
- Dallas is 15-15 when facing elimination (4-2 vs. SA)
- Caron Butler and Dirk Nowitzki are the 1st set of teammates in the 2009-10 postseason to record 35+ points in games for their team
- For the 2nd time this postseason, Dallas forced 10+ steals. In Game 5, led by Caron Butler's 3, the Mavs came away with 14 steals – the most by any team in the postseason. In Game 1 (4/18), the Mavs forced 10 steals led by Jason Kidd's 4. The Mavs were 19-2 in the regular season when forcing double-digit steals
- Over the last 2 games, Dirk Nowitzki is averaging 16.0 points (.458 FG, 1.000 FT), 10.0 rebounds and 37.0 minutes
- JJ Barea scored a playoff career-high 14 points (6-13 FGs, 2-4 3FGs) with 4 rebounds and 4 assists in 32 minutes in Game 3 at SA (4/23). He scored 8 of those 14 in the 2nd quarter. His previous high was 13 (2 times)
- Dirk Nowitzki and Caron Butler continued their regular season trend of winning when both players score 20+ points. The Mavs were led by Nowitzki's 36 points while Butler added 22 (9th 20-point game of playoff career) in Game 1 (4/18). The Mavs were 6-0 in the regular campaign when both scored 20
- Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2nd double-double of the postseason with 17 points (3-10 FGs, 9-9 FTs), postseason-high 11 rebounds and 4 assists in 43 minutes in Game 3 at SA (4/25)
- Roddy Beaubois made his playoff career debut in Game 3 at SA (4/23). In 5 minutes, he recorded 2 points, 1 rebound and 2 assists. Beaubois is the 1st rookie to appear in a playoff game since Josh Powell (2005-06)
- Matt Carroll made his postseason debut in the 4th quarter of Game 5 (4/27) with 2 points and 1 rebound in 5 minutes
- The Mavericks played before 20,557 fans in Game 5 for their 47th consecutive postseason sellout

DOWN NOT OUT: The Dallas Mavericks are facing extreme adversity as their first-round series continues. In 189 series that have gone to a 3-1 deficit, only 8 teams have rallied from that margin. But the Mavericks have 2 members with experience in coming back from 3-1. Rick Carlisle has been here before. He coached the Detroit Pistons back from a 3-1 deficit against Orlando in the 2002-03 first round. The series was tied 1-1 before Orlando won a pair of games and forced Detroit to win 3 straight games. The Pistons would go on to lose in the Eastern Conference Finals. Shawn Marion, as a member of the 2-seeded Suns, fell into a 3-1 hole to the Lakers after winning Game 1 and then losing 3 straight. The Suns rallied to win in 7 and would go on to fall to Dallas in the Western Conference Finals.

BUTLER-KICKING: Caron Butler is proving to be the Mavericks' wild card in the first-round series. In 2 wins, the guard is averaging 28.5 points. He's averaging just 12.0 points in 3 losses. Butler enjoyed a playoff career night in Game 5 (4/27). He started hot (12 1st quarter points) and stayed that way as he poured in a playoff career-high 35 points (12-24 FGs, 3-8 3FGs, 8-9 FTs), postseason-high 11 rebounds (10 DR), 1 assist, 3 steals and 1 block in 37 minutes. The game was the 2nd of Butler's postseason career with 30+ points and his 6th career double-double (1st of 2009-10). Butler became the 1st Maverick, other than Dirk Nowitzki, to score 30+ in a playoff game since Jason Terry scored 35 in Game 5 of the NBA Finals at MIA (6/18/06).

HARD HITTING HAYWOOD: Brendan Haywood made his 1st start of the 2010 postseason in Game 5 vs. SA (4/27). In his new role, the center scored 8 points (1-3 FGs, playoff career-highs 6-12 FTs) with 8 rebounds, 2 assists and a postseason-high 4 blocks in 31 minutes. His defense stymied Tim Duncan who finished the game with 11 points on 3-9 FGs, 5-6 FTs and 6 rebounds in 24 minutes. For the series, Haywood has 2 games with 10+ points and 3 games with 2+ blocks (including 3.5 in his last 2 games).

THE MATRIX: Into Game 4 (4/25), Shawn Marion was averaging 7.3 points in the series. He scored 12 points in the 1st half of Game 4 alone (6-10 FGs) and would go on to finish the game with postseason-highs of 14 points and 7 rebounds (3 OR) in 28 minutes. Over his last 2 outings, Marion is averaging 12.0 points and 5.5 rebounds.

35 TIMES 2: Dirk Nowitzki scored 35 points in a game for the 2nd time of the series with a game-high 35 (13-23 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 8-8 FTs) with 7 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 steals and 1 block in 42 minutes in Game 3 at SA (4/23). In Game 1 (4/18), Nowitzki scored 19 of his 36 points in the 1st half, matching his total for any 1st half in the regular season (19 at IND, 11/27). Upon finishing the game with 36 points, Nowitzki had turned out the 12th 35-point game of his playoff career. Nowitzki's 13 35-point playoff games are the 4th-most since the 2000-01 season.

JET REFUELS: After scoring a playoff career-low 5 points in Game 1 (4/18), Jason Terry turned out a game-high 27 points (9-19 FGs, 3-7 3FGs, 6-6 FTs) with 2 rebounds, 3 assists and 1 block in 41 minutes off the bench. Terry single-handedly outscored the NBA's best regular season bench (SA reserves averaged 39.3 ppg) 27-24. Through the 2009-10, Dallas was 9-4 when Terry single-handedly matched or outscored the opposing bench. Terry accomplished the feat in 2 first-round against the Spurs last season.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Jason Kidd led the Mavs with 28 regular season double-doubles. In Game 1 (4/18), he was the only player to record a double-double. He contributed 13 points (5-12 FGs, 3-6 3FGs) with 8 rebounds, 11 assists and 4 steals in a game-high 41 minutes. The double-double was the 35th of his playoff career with a points-assists double-double, and the 3rd (in 116 games) with 13 points, 11 assists and 4 steals. The game was the 1st of his postseason career with Dallas that the point guard recorded double-digit assists.

SEASON NOTES

FYI:

- Dallas was 1 of 2 teams to defeat every team in the NBA this season (also ORL)
- Dallas improved to 7-1 when all 5 starters score 10+ points vs. NJ (3/10) – Jason Kidd (20), Caron Butler (18), Shawn Marion (14), Dirk Nowitzki (12), Brendan Haywood (11)
- Dallas was 13-0 when dishing 30+ assists which was the 2nd-most such games in the NBA (UTA 19-2)...the Mavs, Jazz and Celtics (11) were the only teams in the league to have 10+ games with 30 assists
- Dallas was 35-7 when scoring 100+ points (with 3 of those losses in OT) and 19-3 when scoring 110+
- The Mavericks were 16-3 when both Dirk Nowitzki and Jason Terry scored 20+ points

ELITE COMPANY: The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least 10 consecutive 50-win seasons. Dallas has now won 50 games in 10 consecutive seasons, which is the 3rd-longest such streak in league history, dating back to 2000-01.

NIFTY FIFTY: The Mavericks took Memphis to overtime (3/31) to secure their 50th victory of the season. With the win, Dallas now owns the most 50-win seasons in the NBA since the 2000-01 campaign. Following is a list of the most 50-win seasons since 2000-01. Overall, there have been 78 50-win seasons in the last 10 years. Dallas' 55 wins were the fourth-most in franchise history (67 in 2006-07; 60 in 2005-06; 57 in 2001-02; 55 also in 1986-87).

TOE THE LINE: The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, shot an NBA-best 81.6% (1,526-1,870 FTs) from the line. Since the 2000-01 season, the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.4% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 5 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08, 2009-10). Dallas has now shot at least 80% FT in 4 straight seasons, setting an NBA record (they shared the previous record of 3 seasons with BOS, 1989-90 to 1991-92). In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 88.1% FT (7th in NBA) and has hit 4,896 FTs (3rd). This season, the Mavericks shot 90% from the line an NBA-best 15 times (POR did so 10 times).

WORKIN' OVERTIME: The Mavericks played their 8th overtime game (5-3 record) of the season in MEM (3/31) – more than the last 2 seasons combined (Dallas played 6 total OT games in 2007-08 and 2008-09). The last time Dallas played 8 OT games was in 1997-98. Dallas' 5 OT wins is a franchise record. Stellar play by Dirk Nowitzki, who scored the last 10 points in the final 3:00 of regulation, forced the OT period. He added 6 more points in OT.

RUNNING UP THE SCORE: Dallas scored 60+ 1st half points 16 times this season. Dallas was 15-1 when scoring 60 1st half points and 19-4 when scoring 30+ 1st quarter points.

21K AND COUNTING: Dirk Nowitzki became the 34th player in NBA history to score 20,000 career points with a 30-point night vs. LAL (1/13) and now ranks 27th all-time on the NBA's scoring list. He scored his 20,000th and 20,001st points at the 10:57 mark of the 4th quarter on a 14-foot jumper over Lamar Odom. He now has 21,111 career points (passed 21,000 with 40 points at POR, 4/9). Nowitzki, the Mavericks' leading scorer, was 2nd player to reach the 20,000-point plateau this season joining BOS Ray Allen who accomplished the feat at WAS (12/10/09). Nowitzki ranks 5th among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Allen Iverson and Kevin Garnett. Nowitzki is the 4th player born outside the U.S. to score 20,000 points joining Patrick Ewing (Jamaica, 24,815), Hakeem Olajuwon (Nigeria, 26,946) and Dominique Wilkins (France, 26,668).

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki appeared in his 920th game as a Maverick at SAC (4/10). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Mav in franchise history at PHO (1/28). Nowitzki, the franchise's all-time scoring leader, is 1 of 2 active players who leads his team in career games (CHA's Gerald Wallace). Nowitzki is the 3rd-longest tenured player with his original team (LAL Bryant 1996-97; SA Duncan 1997-98).

PLETHORA OF POINTS: Dirk Nowitzki scored 2,027 points through 81 games this season. Nowitzki, who owned the NBA's 7th-highest scoring average, poured in his 20th 30-point game of the season at SAC (4/10) with a game-high 39 points (24 in the 2nd half). A season ago, Nowitzki had 26 30-point games, tying his career high (also 2005-06). He added 3 40-point games (15 for his career, 11-4 Mavs record), and was 1 of 7 players to have at least 3 40-point games on the year.

DIRK GOES FOR 30/10 AGAIN: Dirk Nowitzki had 9 games with 30+ points and 10+ rebounds. Dallas was 7-2 in those games. Since 1/1/2009, Nowitzki owns the 4th-most 30/10 games in the NBA and the 3rd-most for the 2009-10 campaign.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 386-270 (.589); Playoff Coaching Record: 37-40 (.481)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In eight seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on seven occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
