SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks have won 20-of-26 and 24 of the last 32 regular-season games against the Thunder franchise...Dallas has won 15 of the last 18 at American Airlines Center...Oklahoma City took the first of four regular-season meetings between the two clubs this season in dramatic fashion on 12/29/11, claiming a 104-102 victory on a last-second 3-pointer by Kevin Durant...The Mavericks handed the Thunder their first loss of the 2011-12 season with a 100-87 victory at American Airlines Center on 1/2/12 (Oklahoma City entered the game owning a 5-0 record)...The 2011-12 season series is currently tied at 1-1...Dirk Nowitzki is averaging 27.5 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 3.5 apg and 37.5 mpg in two games against the Thunder this season...He recorded his 8,000th career made field goal vs. Oklahoma City on 1/2/12...Jason Terry is averaging 15.5 ppg, 6.0 apg, 1.5 spg and 31.5 mpg against Oklahoma City in 2011-12...Shawn Marion is averaging 12.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 29.0 mpg...Vince Carter is averaging 11.0 ppg and 20.0 mpg...Ian Mahinmi is averaging 9.5 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 21.0 mpg...Delonte West is averaging 9.5 ppg, 2.5 rpg, 3.0 apg, 1.5 spg and 19.5 mpg in two games against Oklahoma City in 2011-12...The Mavericks are 7-5 against the Thunder since the franchise began playing in Oklahoma City in 2008 (4-2 at home and 3-3 on the road)...Dallas won four of the first five meetings between the two clubs after the Thunder franchise moved to Oklahoma City, but the Thunder have taken four of the last seven...The Mavericks defeated the Thunder in five games in the 2011 Western Conference Finals...Dirk Nowitzki gave a performance for the ages in Game 1, posting a playoff-high 48 points (12-15 FGs, 24-24 FTs)...The 48 points were the most by any player in a playoff game who shot at least 80 percent from the field...He went 24-of-24 from the line, including 13-of-13 from the stripe in the third quarter alone...It set an NBA playoff record for the most free throws made in a game without a miss...What's more, it was the most free throws made in a regulation-length playoff game...Nowitzki's shooting clinic overshadowed a 40-point effort from the Thunder's Kevin Durant...Dallas used late game rallies (came back from 15 down in the fourth quarter of Game 4 and eight down in the fourth quarter of Game 5) to finish off the Thunder in five games and advance to the 2011 NBA Finals.

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Rodrigue Beaubois was originally drafted by the Thunder (25th overall pick) in the 2009 NBA Draft, before having his draft rights traded to the Mavericks for the draft rights to Byron Mullens (24th overall selection)...Thunder head coach Scott Brooks played for the Mavericks from 1995-96...Mavericks guard Delonte West played with Thunder center Kendrick Perkins in Boston from 2004-07 and again in 2010-11...West also played briefly with Thunder forward Nick Collison in Seattle in 2007-08...Thunder forward Kevin Durant attended the University of Texas for one year before being taken with the second overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft.

It was his fourth basket of the game and he finished 10-of-16 from the floor en route to a team-high 26 points. Shawn Marion contributed 17 points and four rebounds. Jason Terry (15), Vince Carter (14) and Ian Mahinmi (10) all scored in double figures off the Mavericks' bench. Kevin Durant posted a game-high 27 points (10-21 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 4-7 FTs) for the Thunder in the loss.

NOTABLES: The Mavericks led by four (43-39) with just over 4 minutes to go in the second quarter...A Jason Terry jumper with 9.9 seconds to go in the period capped an 11-5 spurt by the Mavericks that saw them go up by 10 (54-44)...But the Thunder's James Harden beat the second-quarter buzzer with a 3-pointer to trim the deficit back down to seven (54-47) going into the half...Dallas used a 12-2 run (from the 8:46 mark of the third quarter through the 5:32 mark of the period) to open up a 15-point lead (68-53)...The Mavericks' bench outscored the Thunder's bench, 47-25...Dallas outshot Oklahoma City 48.8 percent (39-of-80) to 40.3 percent (31-of-77) for the game...Dallas led by as many as 16 points, while Oklahoma City led by just two (in the first quarter)...Dallas handed the Thunder its first loss of the season (Oklahoma City entered the game owning a 5-0 record).

PLAYER NOTES: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki recorded his first double-double of the season with a team-high 29 points (9-17 FGs, 1-4 3FGs, 10-10 FTs) and a team-high 10 rebounds. Delonte West tallied 15 points (5-10 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 4-4 FTs) and six assists. Jason Terry registered 16 points and nine assists off the bench for Dallas in the loss. Kevin Durant totaled a game-high 30 points (10-16 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 7-9 FTs), game-high 11 rebounds and a team-high six assists for Oklahoma City. He hit a 3-pointer as time expired to give the Thunder a 104-102 win.

NOTABLES: The Thunder outshot the Mavericks 60.6 percent (20-of-33) to 44.7 percent (21-of-47) in the first half and led, 56-52, at the break...Oklahoma City trailed by eight (73-65), but used a 17-3 run (from the 3:51 mark of the third quarter through the 10:57 mark of the fourth) to claim a six-point advantage (82-76)...After the Thunder's Serge Ibaka missed a pair of free throws with 9.7 seconds remaining, Dallas called a timeout, down by two (101-99)...Following the timeout, Dirk Nowitzki drove the lane and kicked to Vince Carter for an open three from the top of the key...Carter connected and gave Dallas a 102-101 lead with just 1.4 seconds remaining...But on the ensuing possession, the Thunder's Kevin Durant beat the buzzer with a 3-pointer from the right wing and the Thunder came away with a 104-102 victory...Oklahoma City turned the ball over 26 times for 33 Dallas points...The Mavericks recorded only 12 giveaways for 11 Oklahoma City points...Oklahoma City outscored Dallas 17-10 in transition...With the win, Oklahoma City improved to 4-0 to begin the 2011-12 season, while Dallas moved to 0-3.

SERIES NOTES: The game at American Airlines Center on 2/3/12 will mark the only meeting between the Mavericks and the Pacers in 2011-12...Dallas has won 10 of the last 12 meetings with Indiana...The two teams split the 2010-11 season series, with the home team winning both times...The Mavericks have won seven straight and 11-of-12 at home against the Pacers...The Pacers' lone win in their last 12 trips to Dallas came on 1/9/04...The Pacers snapped a five-game losing streak against the Mavericks with a 102-89 win in Indiana on 1/12/11...The Pacers have now taken 13 of the last 19 games in Indiana...Jason Kidd moved into third place on the all-time 3-point field goals made list at Indiana (1/12/11)...Dirk Nowitzki (sprained right knee) did not play in the first meeting against Indiana (1/12/11) last season, but dropped a game-high 29 points on 10-of-12 shooting (9-of-10 free-throw shooting) in the second matchup at American Airlines Center on 3/4/11...Jason Terry averaged 19.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 4.5 apg and 30.5 mpg against the Pacers last season...Jason Kidd averaged 14.0 ppg, 4.5 rpg, 6.0 apg, 2.0 spg, 1.0 bpg and 32.5 mpg...Shawn Marion averaged 9.5 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 3.0 apg, 2.0 spg and 29.5 mpg in two matchups with Indiana in 2010-11.

CONNECTIONS: Rick Carlisle coached the Pacers for three seasons (2003-07)...He amassed a 181-147 (.552) record with Indiana, while leading the team to three straight postseason appearances...In his first year with Indiana in 2003, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division Championship...He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion attended junior college at Vincennes University in Indiana before transferring to UNLV...Pacers assistant coach Brian Shaw was an assistant with the L.A. Lakers from 2004-11, and coached Mavericks forward Lamar Odom for seven seasons in Los Angeles...Odom attended high school at Christ the King in Queens, N.Y., the birthplace of Pacers center Roy Hibbert...Mavericks center Brendan Haywood was also born in New York...Mavericks forward Brandan Wright was a college teammate of Pacers forward Tyler Hansbrough at the University of North Carolina in 2006-07...Mavericks forward Brian Cardinal attended Purdue University in West Lafayette, Ind.

NOTABLES: The Mavericks scored 30-plus points in each of the first three quarters...Lamar Odom beat the first-quarter buzzer with a 16-foot jumper to give the Mavericks a 31-24 lead going into the second...The Mavericks closed the first half on an 11-1 run...Delonte West made a layup just before time expired to give the Mavericks an 18-point lead (66-48) going into the break...The Mavericks outshot the Suns 10-of-16 (.625) to 4-of-7 from beyond the arc in the opening 24 minutes...Dallas broke open a 27-point lead in the third quarter...Delonte West hit a jumper with 0.4 seconds remaining in the third to give Dallas a 96-70 advantage going into the final period...Dallas cruised to a 122-99 win...The Mavericks outshot the Suns 55.2 percent (48-of-87) to 43.8 percent (35-of-80) from the floor in the game...Dallas outscored Phoenix 52-34 in the paint and 23-8 in second-chance opportunities...The Suns outscored the Mavericks 21-12 on the fast break...The Mavericks recorded their eighth straight win over the Suns...It marks the longest winning streak for any team against the Suns in 14 years, since the Lakers won eight in a row against them from November 1995 to January 1998.

PLAYER NOTES: Jason Terry scored a game-high 34 points (14-23 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) for Dallas in the win. He hit a jumper with 0.5 seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime. Terry also scored Dallas' final four points in overtime to propel the Mavericks to a 101-100 win. Vince Carter totaled 21 points in 31 minutes. Dirk Nowitzki returned to the starting lineup after missing four games with a sore right knee and recorded his second double-double of the season with 10 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. Gary Neal tallied a team-high 19 points and a game-high-tying seven assists for the Spurs in the loss.

NOTABLES: The Mavericks used a 26-8 run (from the 7:14 mark of the first quarter through the 9:33 mark of the second period) to turn a six-point deficit (10-4) into a 12-point advantage (30-18)...The Mavericks outshot the Spurs 52.2 percent (24-of-46) to 35.7 percent (15-of-42) in the first half and led by 11 (51-40) at the break...Dallas used a 10-2 spurt (from the 10:03 mark of the third quarter through the 6:09 mark of the third) to open up a 17-point lead (61-44)...But San Antonio closed the quarter on a 9-2 run and trailed by 11 (69-58) after three...The Spurs trailed, 67-49, but used a 35-8 run (from the 3:24 mark of the third quarter through the 5:33 mark of the fourth period) to take a 84-75 lead...Dallas outscored San Antonio 9-2 in the final 1:22 of regulation to force overtime...Jason Terry (five) and Rodrigue Beaubois (four) combined to score the Mavericks' final nine points in the fourth...Terry forced overtime with a jumper with 0.5 seconds left on the clock...The last time a San Antonio player scored in the game was at the 4:28 mark of the third quarter (a 3-pointer by Richard Jefferson)...The Spurs went 12-of-25 (.480) from deep compared to the Mavericks' 4-of-20 (.200) clip.

- The Mavericks have won three straight and 13 of their last 17 games.
- The Mavericks scored a season-high 122 points in the 122-99 win at Phoenix on 1/30 (previous high 116 vs. Utah 1/27). Dallas has now scored 100-plus points in three straight games (averaging 113.0 ppg in that span). The Mavericks had not scored 100-plus points in back-to-back games prior to the games vs. Utah (1/27) and vs. San Antonio (1/29).
- The Mavericks shot a season-high 55.2 percent (48-of-87) from the field in the win over Phoenix on 1/30. The Mavericks are 5-0 when they shoot at least 50 percent from the floor this year. Dallas made a season-high 14 3-pointers at Phoenix (1/30), shooting an impressive 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from deep.
- Delonte West (25), Vince Carter (21) and Shawn Marion (20) all scored 20-plus points for the Mavericks in the win over the Suns on 1/30. It was the first time this season that Dallas had three players score 20-plus points in a game. The Mavericks were 5-0 when they had three players score at least 20 in a game in 2010-11.
- Dallas won at Phoenix on 1/30, after defeating the Spurs in overtime the previous night on 1/29. The Mavericks won their fourth straight game on the second night of a back-to-back, and improved to 6-2 in such games this season.
- Dallas played its 22nd game of the season against Phoenix on 1/30. The Mavericks have gone 14-8 one-third of the way through the 66-game regular season.
- The Mavericks took sole possession of first place in the Southwest Division with the 101-100 overtime win over San Antonio on 1/29. Dallas (14-8) currently sits one game ahead of San Antonio (13-9) and 1.5 games ahead of Houston (12-9) in the division.
- The Mavericks played a franchise-high 18 games during the month of January and finished with a record of 13-5 (.722) in the month. It marked their highest winning percentage in the month since the 2007-08 season (went 11-3, .786).
- Dallas has managed 13-or-fewer turnovers in six consecutive games, including a season-low eight turnovers in the win over San Antonio on 1/29.
- Eight different players have led Dallas in scoring this season.
- Dallas has played in six games decided by three points or less this season (3-3 record), which is tied with the Spurs (2-4) for the most in the NBA this season.
- With the win over San Antonio on 1/29, the Mavericks improved to 9-3 at home this season. Since opening the season with back-to-back home losses, Dallas has now won nine of its last 10 games at American Airlines Center. The Mavericks are averaging 98.4 ppg on 44.6 percent shooting at home compared to 90.3 ppg on 43.8 percent shooting on the road this season (Dallas is 5-5 on the road).
- The Mavericks are 13-1 when leading at the half this season.
- Rodrigue Beaubois (22), Lamar Odom (19), Jason Terry (18), Shawn Marion (16), Brendan Haywood (12) and Vince Carter (12) all scored 12-plus points for the Mavericks in the win over Utah on 1/27. It was just the second time this season that Dallas has had six players score in double figures (also had six in win over New Orleans on 1/7/12).
- Jason Terry (17), Shawn Marion (15) and Rodrigue Beaubois (11) were the only Mavericks that scored in double figures in the loss to the Timberwolves on 1/25. Dallas is 0-5 when it has fewer than four players in double-digits compared to 14-3 when it has at least four players score 10-plus in a game.

INDIVIDUAL STATS

- **Delonte West** scored a season-high 25 points (9-12 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) in 28 minutes at Phoenix on 1/30 (previous high 17 at L.A. Clippers 1/18). He added six assists and two steals in 28 minutes off the bench. West tied a career with five 3-pointers in the game (made five 3s on three other occasions). He made his first five 3-point attempts in the game and finished 5-of-6 from deep. West scored 25 in a game for the eighth time in his NBA career.
- **Vince Carter** scored a season-high 21 points in back-to-back games vs. San Antonio (1/29) and at Phoenix (1/30). He shot a combined 16-of-28 (.571) from the floor in the two games. Carter made a season-high five 3-pointers (5-7 3FGs) in the game at Phoenix on 1/30.
- **Jason Terry** scored a season-high 34 points (14-23 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) against the Spurs on 1/29 (previous high 23 vs. Miami on 12/25). He hit a jumper with 0.5 seconds remaining that tied the game at 91 and forced overtime. Terry also scored Dallas' final four points in overtime to lift the Mavericks to a 101-100 victory. It was the seventh time that Terry has led the Mavericks in scoring this season (4-3 record). Deron Williams is the only other player to score the final points of regulation and the game-winner in the final minute of overtime this season (New Jersey at Philadelphia 1/25/12).
- **Dirk Nowitzki** returned to the starting lineup vs. San Antonio (1/29) after missing four games with a sore right knee. He recorded his second double-double of the season (360th career) with 10 points and a season-high 13 rebounds in 38 minutes.
- **Rodrigue Beaubois** made his first start of the season (43rd career) vs. Utah on 1/27 in place of Delonte West (strained right hamstring). He scored a season-high (game-high) 22 points (9-15 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) (previous high 17 at Utah on 1/19/12) to go along with a season-high-tying six rebounds, a career-high seven assists and a career-high four blocks in 36 minutes. It was the fourth time he's scored 20-plus points in a game in his career and the first time he has done so since 3/27/10 (career-high 40 points at Golden State). It was the second time in his career that Beaubois led Dallas in scoring and the fourth time he has led his team in assists. But it was the first time he led his team in both categories in one game. Beaubois became one of only two guards (also Dwyane Wade vs. Boston 12/27/11) to record four blocks in a game this season. Since 1986-87, Michael Finley (vs. Portland 2/28/04), Jason Kidd (at Phoenix 4/6/08) and Derek Harper (vs. Utah 4/17/90) are the only other Mavericks to block four shots in a game.
- **Lamar Odom** scored a season-high 19 points (7-12 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 2-4 FTs) against Utah on 1/27 (previous high 16 at New Orleans 1/21/12). It was his sixth double-figure scoring effort of the season (and the fourth in his last five games).
- **Brendan Haywood** posted his first double-double of the season (67th career) with a season-high 12 points and a season-high-tying 12 rebounds vs. Utah (1/27). It was his fifth double-digit rebounding effort of the season (4-1 record).
- **Shawn Marion** scored a season-high 29 points (11-21 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 3-5 FTs) against Phoenix on 1/23 (previous high 22 at Utah 1/19). It tied his Maverick-high (29 at Minnesota 3/8/10). Marion, who made a total of eight 3-pointers (8-52 3FGs) his first two seasons with Dallas (2009-11), went 4-of-6 from beyond the arc against the Suns. It was the first time he's made four triples in a game since 1/18/08. His career high for 3-pointers made in a game is five (on six occasions). The Mavericks are 9-1 this season when Marion scores 13-plus points in a game.
- **Lamar Odom** appeared in his 200th consecutive game vs. Phoenix on 1/23. He entered the game tied with the Suns' Jared Dudley for fifth place on the list for consecutive games played behind Derek Fisher (513), Russell Westbrook (262), Brook Lopez (246) and Boris Diaw (240).
- **Ian Mahinmi** recorded 17 points and nine rebounds in 29 minutes vs. Phoenix on 1/23. He tied his second-highest career scoring output (also had 17 at Memphis 1/15/11). He posted his sixth double-digit scoring game of the season. Dallas is 5-1 when Mahinmi scores 10-plus points in a game this season. He had four double-figure scoring efforts all of last year.

BENCH PRODUCTION: The Mavericks are averaging a league-best 45.5 bench points per game this season, slightly below what their starters are averaging (49.2 ppg). Jason Terry has led the Mavericks in scoring seven times as a reserve (including ties). Dallas led the NBA in bench scoring in 2010-11 with 40.4 points per game off the pine.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS: The Mavericks rank near the top in several defensive categories including points allowed, opponent field goal percentage, steals per game, opponent points in the paint and opponent second-chance points. Below is a look at the Mavericks' defensive numbers and where they rank:

15 STRAIGHT GAMES HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 100: The Mavericks held their opponents to under 100 points for 15 straight games from 12/30/11-1/23/12, which set a franchise record for consecutive games holding teams under the century mark (was 13, 1/14/06-2/9/06). Opponents averaged just 84.3 points per game on 39.8 percent shooting against the Mavericks in those 15 games, and Dallas went 11-4 in that span. The Mavericks held their opponents to under 80 points in three straight games during that stretch from 1/13-1/16/12. The Timberwolves ended the Mavericks' run when they defeated Dallas, 105-90, at American Airlines Center on 1/25/12. Minnesota was also the only team to score over 93 points against the Mavericks during their 15-game run (defeated Dallas, 99-82, at Minnesota on 1/11/12).

DIRK REACHES 23K, CLOSING IN ON 20TH ALL-TIME: Dirk Nowitzki scored his 23,000th career point against Milwaukee on 1/13/12 with his first free throw at the 7:17 mark of the second quarter. He became the 23rd player in NBA history (third active player) to achieve the milestone. Nowitzki currently has **23,092** career points and needs **58** to pass Elgin Baylor (23,149) for 22nd place on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Nowitzki passed Hal Greer (21,586), Larry Bird (21,791), Gary Payton (21,813) and Clyde Drexler (22,195) on the all-time scoring list in 2010-11. He ranks third among active players in career scoring, trailing only Kobe Bryant and Kevin Garnett. Only three other players born outside of the United States have more career points than the 7-footer from Germany: Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946, born in Nigeria), Dominique Wilkins (26,668, born in France) and Patrick Ewing (24,815, born in Jamaica). Nowitzki reached the 20,000-point mark during the 2009-10 season, becoming the first European-born player to achieve the milestone.

KIDD PULLING CLOSER TO MJ ON STEALS LIST: At 38 years old, Mavericks point guard Jason Kidd is still averaging 1.6 steals per game this season. He recorded a season-high six steals in his return to the starting lineup against Sacramento (1/14/12), after missing four games with a sore lower back (1/7/12-1/13/12). Kidd, who has been named to the NBA All-Defensive First Team four times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2006) and NBA All-Defensive Second Team five times (2000, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007), recorded two steals at the L.A. Lakers on 1/16/12, giving him 2,500 for his career. He currently has **2,502** career steals and needs just **13** more to pass Michael Jordan (2,514) for second place on the NBA's all-time steals list. John Stockton is the NBA's all-time steals leader with 3,265 career thefts.

GETTING IT TOGETHER: Since opening the season with three consecutive losses, Dallas has locked down on the defensive end. The Mavericks are shooting the ball better as well. Despite losing to the Lakers (1/16) and the Clippers (1/18) on 3-pointers in the final seconds, the Mavericks are still 14-5 over their last 19 games. The Mavericks are 10-1 this season when they hold the opposition to under 90 points, compared to 4-7 when they allow 90-plus points in a game. Below is a look at how the Mavericks' stats from their first three games of the season compare to their stats from their most recent 19 games. Dallas is 13-4 over its last 17 games. To better illustrate what the Mavericks have done as of late, also listed below is a comparison of the Mavericks' stats from their first five games and stats from their last 17 games.

DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE: Dallas' defense shut down Sacramento's offense in the game at American Airlines Center on 1/14/12. The Mavericks held the Kings to just 60 points on 22-of-86 (.256) shooting, setting new franchise opponent lows for points (was 65 at Minnesota 2/27/07), field goals made (was 23 at Indiana, 23-67, 12/6/05) and field goal percentage (was .296, 24-81, at Minnesota 2/27/07). The Mavericks held the Kings to just 23 points in the first half (Dallas led 52-23 at the break). It marked an all-time low for points in a half by a Dallas opponent. The previous franchise opponent low for points in a half was 24 by Vancouver (at Dallas 3/13/99, in the first half). The 23 points recorded by the Kings in the opening 24 minutes also represented an all-time Sacramento franchise low for points in a half (was 25 vs. Boston 2/26/57).

HOW SWEEP IT IS!: When the Mavericks faced the Kings at home on 1/14/12, it marked the 111th time in franchise history that Dallas played four games in five nights. With wins at Detroit (1/10), at Boston (1/11), vs. Milwaukee (1/13) and vs. Sacramento (1/14), the Mavericks completed a four-game sweep in five nights for just the fourth time in team history (also 2/19/85-2/23/85, 11/17/06-11/21/06 and 11/23/10-11/27/10). The Mavericks recorded the sweep last season with wins against Detroit (11/23/10), at Oklahoma City (11/24/10), at San Antonio (11/26/10) and against Miami (11/27/10).

JET SEVENTH PLACE ALL-TIME ON TRIPLES LIST: Jason Terry went 2-for-4 from beyond the arc against Sacramento on 1/14. He took sole possession of seventh place on the all-time 3-point field goals made list with his first three of the game (1,681st career) at the 1:26 mark of the second quarter. Terry, who just passed Washington's Rashard Lewis for seventh place all-time, is closing in on former Maverick Dale Ellis (1,719) for sixth place on the all-time list. Terry currently has **1,696** career 3-pointers and needs **24** to pass Ellis.

IAN'S IMPROVEMENT: Ian Mahinmi is having a career year for the Mavericks thus far in 2011-12. With the departure of Tyson Chandler to New York this past offseason (and Brendan Haywood moving back into the starting lineup), Mahinmi has flourished in his role as the Mavericks' backup center. He is averaging career highs in points (7.8), rebounds (5.3) and minutes (20.3) this season. The big Frenchman is shooting 60.2 percent from the field in 2011-12. He has scored in double figures six times this season, after he did so four times all of last year. He's recorded only one double-digit rebounding game this season, but he's grabbed exactly

nine boards on three occasions. Mahinmi, who played in France from 2003-07 and spent time with the Austin Toros of the NBA D-League in 2007-08, appeared in his 100th career NBA game against Milwaukee on 1/13/12.

ANOTHER SHOOTING CLINIC FOR NOWITZKI: Dirk Nowitzki went 9-of-10 (.900) from the field at Detroit on 1/10/12, finishing with a team-high 18 points and seven rebounds in 28 minutes of action. The 90 percent field goal percentage was the highest field goal percentage he's recorded in any game in his career (minimum 10 field goal attempts). The Mavericks are 12-0 all-time in the regular season when Nowitzki shoots at least 80 percent from the floor (minimum 10 field goal attempts). He has averaged 27.0 points per game in those 12 contests. Nowitzki, who shot a career-high 51.7 percent (610-1,179 FGs) from the field during the 2010-11 regular season, had five such games last season. Nowitzki has shot 80-plus percent from the floor (while attempting at least 10 shots) in two postseason games in his career, and Dallas is 2-0 in those games. He went 12-of-15 (.800) from the field (24-of-24 from the line) en route to a playoff-high 48 points in Game 1 of the 2011 Western Conference Finals against Oklahoma City on 5/17/11. The 48 points were the most by any player in a playoff game who shot at least 80 percent from the field. Nowitzki also went 12-of-14 (.857) from the floor in the playoffs against the Spurs on 4/18/10, finishing with 36 points in 40 minutes.

DIRK'S 1,000TH GAME: Dirk Nowitzki played in his 1,000th career regular-season game (975th start) against Phoenix on 1/4/12, becoming the 98th player in NBA history (11th active player) to accomplish the feat. With the win over the Suns, Dallas won its 661st game with Nowitzki in the lineup (went 661-339 in his first 1,000 games). Nowitzki, whose first season in Dallas was in 1998-99, is the third-longest tenured player with his original team (L.A. Lakers' Kobe Bryant 1996-97; San Antonio's Tim Duncan 1997-98). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played in franchise history at Phoenix on 1/28/10. Nowitzki has appeared in an additional 124 playoff games (all starts) over the course of his NBA career.

DIRK RECORDS 8,000TH CAREER FIELD GOAL: With a 10-foot step-back jumper (at the 7:40 mark of the second quarter) against Oklahoma City on 1/2/12, Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 8,000th career regular-season made field goal. He became the 31st player in NBA history to accomplish the feat and he currently ranks fourth among active players in field goals made (behind Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett and Tim Duncan).

JAM-PACKED JANUARY: The Mavericks played a franchise-high 18 games during the month of January and went 13-5 (.722) in those games. It marked their highest winning percentage in the month since the 2007-08 season (went 11-3, .786). Dallas played seven of those games against playoff teams from a season ago (Oklahoma City, San Antonio, New Orleans, Boston, L.A. Lakers), including two games against both the Spurs and Hornets. The month also featured the first of the team's two four-game road trips.

HAYWOOD RECORDS 1,000TH BLOCK, DIRK APPROACHING MILESTONE: Mavericks center Brendan Haywood had three blocks at Minnesota on 1/1/12, giving him 1,000 for his career. Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki currently has 992 career rejections and needs **eight** to reach the milestone himself. Haywood has had six seasons with 100-plus swats, including four straight from 2002-06. Nowitzki is the only player in NBA history to record at least 100 blocks and 150 3-pointers in a single season (2000-01). He ranks second on Dallas' all-time blocks list behind Shawn Bradley (1,250).

A KIDD AT HEART: Jason Kidd ranks first among active players and 14th all-time with 1,283 games played. The 17-year veteran has started 1,268 of the 1,283 games he has appeared in over the course of his NBA career. He needs four games to pass former Maverick Sam Perkins (1,286) for 13th place on the NBA's all-time list.

THREE STREAK: The game vs. Memphis on 3/6/11 marked Dallas' 1,000th straight game with at least one 3-point basket. Since 2/27/99, the Mavericks have gone 1,042 consecutive regular-season games with a 3-pointer made – the longest streak in NBA history. They've made only one trey in a game 15 times in that span. The Raptors went 986 consecutive games with at least one 3-pointer made, but had their streak (which began on 2/26/99) come to an end vs. Memphis on 1/24/11.

BACK-TO-BACKS: The Mavericks have 22 back-to-backs in 2011-12, which includes one back-to-back-to-back set from March 8-10. In total, six of them begin at home and end on the road, six are road-home, eight are on the road and two are at home. Dallas played 20 back-to-backs in 2010-11, finishing 13-7 in the front half and 14-6 in the second half of those sets.

CHAMPIONS AT LAST: After 31 years of waiting, the Mavericks finally brought an NBA championship home to the city of Dallas in 2011. The Mavericks avenged the 2006 loss to the Heat by defeating Miami in the 2011 NBA Finals. After losing Game 3 and falling behind 2-1, Dallas responded with three straight victories and closed out Miami in six games. Of the previous 11 occasions a Finals series had been tied at 1-1 (since the NBA Finals went to the 2-3-2 format beginning in 1985), the winner of Game 3 had gone on to win the championship all 11 times. The Mavericks rewrote history in 2011 and captured their first NBA title in the process.

TITLE DEFENSE: Ten of the last 25 NBA champions have "repeated" beginning with the Lakers in 1987 and 1988. Since the NBA's inaugural season in 1946-47, 21 of the 65 title winners have followed their championship seasons by winning the NBA Finals the next year. Among the other 44 teams, nine lost in the NBA Finals, 17 lost in the Conference Finals, 11 lost in the Conference Semifinals, five lost in the First Round and two failed to make the playoffs.

MOST WINS IN A FIVE-YEAR SPAN: Dallas went 280-130 (.683) over the last five regular seasons (from 2006-07 to 2010-11), which was the highest winning percentage in the league in that span (see right). What's more, Dallas won the most games in the 2010 calendar year. The Mavericks, who entered the year 2011 with a record of 24-7 (held a record of 24-7 going into the game at Milwaukee on 1/1/11), finished the 2010 calendar year with a record of 57-24 (.704). The Spurs (.702, 59-25) finished with the second-highest winning percentage in 2010. Dallas recorded the highest winning percentage in a calendar year on two other occasions: 2007 (.768, 63-19) and 2002 (.744, 61-21, tied with Sacramento).

LONG STREAK OF SUCCESS: With a victory over the Timberwolves on 3/24/11, the Mavericks improved to 50-21 in 2010-11 and recorded their 11th straight 50-win season (13th in franchise history). Dallas became just the third team in NBA history to record 11 straight 50-win seasons (2000-2011). Only four franchises have had at least 10 consecutive 50-win seasons since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967. The Spurs (12 seasons, 1999-2011) and the Lakers (12 seasons, 1979-1991) are the only two teams with longer streaks than the Mavericks (see below). Dallas ended the 2010-11 regular season with a record of 57-25 (.695), which was tied for the fifth-best mark in franchise history (also finished 57-25 in 2001-02). The Mavericks have tallied at least 55 wins seven times in the last 11 seasons. They have finished with a winning percentage of at least .695 six times in that span, including a franchise-high .817 (67-15) in 2006-07. Since 2000-01, the lowest winning percentage the Mavericks have recorded for a season is .610, when they won exactly 50 games in 2008-09. A 50-win season with an 82-game schedule equates to about 40.2 wins with a 66-game schedule. Therefore, the Mavericks will have to win 41-or-more games in 2011-12 to match the 61.0 percent-plus winning percentage they have recorded in each of the past 11 seasons (40 wins will give them a winning percentage of .606, while 41 wins will give them a winning percentage of .621).

SPRINGTIME TRADITION: Dallas has made 11 consecutive trips to the postseason (17 overall). It's the longest streak in franchise history and currently the second-longest streak in the NBA. San Antonio (14 consecutive playoff appearances) is the only team with a longer active streak (see right). The Mavericks have made three Western Conference Finals appearances in that span (four in franchise history: 1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). They captured their first NBA Championship in 2011.

STILL SEEING DOUBLE: Of the active players in the NBA who have tallied the most double-doubles in their careers, the Mavericks have three players that rank in the top 10. **Jason Kidd's 485** career double-doubles rank third among active players, **Shawn Marion's 394** rank sixth and **Dirk Nowitzki's 360** rank eighth. Kidd ranks first among active players and third all-time (behind Oscar Robertson, 181, and Magic Johnson, 138) with **107** career triple-doubles.

LO-TS OF MOVEMENT: Dallas made at least one roster move every day in a span from 12/9-12/15/11, beginning with the signing of free agent forward Brandan Wright on 12/9. The most notable move came on 12/11, when Dallas traded for the reigning Sixth Man of the Year, Lamar Odom. The Mavericks shipped a protected first-round draft pick to the Lakers in exchange for Odom, a 2012 second-round draft pick and other second-round considerations in 2013. Odom averaged 14.4 points, 8.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 32.2 minutes in 82 games (32 starts) for the Lakers last season. He joins a Mavericks roster that features the player who finished as the runner-up for the Sixth Man of the Year award in 2010-11 (and who won the award in 2008-09), Jason Terry. On 12/12, the Mavericks signed eight-time All-Star Vince Carter and re-signed forward Brian Cardinal. The next day (12/13), Dallas signed free agent guard Delonte West. The Mavericks dealt two players (Rudy Fernandez, who was acquired in a three-team trade with Denver and Portland on 7/23, and Corey Brewer) to Denver for a future second-round draft pick on 12/13. Free agents Tyson Chandler (New York), Caron Butler (L.A. Clippers), Jose Juan Barea (Minnesota) and DeShawn Stevenson (New Jersey) all signed with different clubs this past offseason, and Peja Stojakovic announced his retirement on 12/19. Cardinal was the only Dallas free agent that re-signed with the club. Free agent big man Sean Williams signed with Dallas on 12/21. The Mavericks' most recent signing came on 1/6, when they signed free agent forward Yi Jianlian. The roster currently stands at 15 players.

FIRST-ROUND SELECTIONS: Fourteen of the 15 players currently on the Mavericks' roster are former first-round draft picks (Brian Cardinal is the only Maverick who was drafted in the second round). Seven were top-10 picks: Jason Kidd (second overall in 1994), Vince Carter (fifth overall in 1998), Dirk Nowitzki (ninth overall in 1998), Lamar Odom (fourth overall in 1999), Shawn Marion (ninth overall in 1999), Jason Terry (10th overall in 1999), Yi Jianlian (sixth overall in 2007) and Brandan Wright (eighth overall in 2007). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994).

CENTURY MARK SUCCESS: The Mavericks have reached the century mark in scoring seven times thus far in 2011-12 (6-1 record). The Mavericks were 43-4 (.915) when they scored 100-plus points in 2010-11, including 13-1 (.929) when they recorded 110-plus points in a game. They were 35-7 (.833) when they scored at least 100 points in a game in 2009-10, and 34-11 (.756) when they did so in 2008-09.

20,000 MANIAACS: The season-opener versus Miami on 12/25/11 marked the Mavericks' 400th consecutive sellout. Since 12/15/01, Dallas has sold out **411** regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best-sellout streak. Dallas has also sold out an additional 58 playoff games during that same stretch. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a record of **330-92 (.782)** at home. Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past nine seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Rick Carlisle led the Mavericks to their first NBA Championship in 2010-11. He became one of only 11 men to win an NBA championship as both a player and as a coach (won a title as a player with Boston in 1986).

Carlisle became the ninth Dallas coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas. He began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
