**SERIES NOTES:** The Timberwolves have taken the first two meetings in the 2011-12 season series and will look to sweep the Mavericks in the regular season for the first time since 1995-96 with a victory at home on 2/10/12 (Minnesota won all four meetings with Dallas in 1995-96)...Despite losing the last two, Dallas has still won 18 of the last 21 regular-season meetings with Minnesota...The Timberwolves snapped a five-game losing streak against the Mavericks with a 99-82 win in Minnesota on 1/1/12...The Mavericks had won nine straight on the road against the Timberwolves before falling to Minnesota on New Year's Day...On 1/1/12, Nowitzki became the sixth player to score 1,000 points against the Timberwolves franchise (joining Karl Malone, Hakeem Olajuwon, Shaquille O'Neal, David Robinson and Kobe Bryant)...He has now scored 1,012 points against Minnesota in his career...The Mavericks have won 10-of-12 in Dallas, but dropped the most recent meeting on 1/25/12...Rick Carlisle recorded his 400<sup>th</sup> career victory versus Minnesota on 12/1/10...The home win was also the 300<sup>th</sup> by the Mavericks at American Airlines Center...Dirk Nowitzki scored a team-high 21 points in the first matchup with Minnesota this season on 1/1/12, but did not play in the second meeting on 1/25/12 due to a sore right knee...Jason Terry has averaged 13.5 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 3.5 apg, 1.0 spg and 29.0 mpg in two meetings with Minnesota this season...Shawn Marion is averaging 11.5 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 2.0 spg, 2.0 bpg and 29.5 mpg against the Timberwolves in 2011-12...Brendan Haywood is averaging 7.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 2.0 bpg and 20.0 mpg...Delonte West is averaging 8.0 ppg, 2.5 apg, 1.0 spg and 20.5 mpg against Minnesota this season.

**CONNECTIONS:** Timberwolves guard Jose Juan Barea signed with Dallas as a rookie free agent in 2006 and played for the Mavericks from 2006-11...He averaged career highs in points (9.5), assists (3.9) and minutes (20.5) for Dallas last season, and helped the Mavericks capture their first championship in franchise history...Mavericks guard Jason Terry and Timberwolves guard Martell Webster are cousins and both hail from Seattle...Dallas forward Shawn Marion and Timberwolves forward Michael Beasley played in the same Miami frontcourt in 2008-09...Mavericks forward Brian Cardinal played for Minnesota from 2008-10...Cardinal and Timberwolves center Brad Miller played together at Purdue from 1995-98...Mavericks guard Delonte West was a teammate of Timberwolves guard Luke Ridnour in Seattle for the first half of the 2007-08 season...Timberwolves guard Wayne Ellington and Mavericks forward Brandan Wright were both freshmen on North Carolina's 2006-07 ACC championship team...Timberwolves guard Wesley Johnson hails from Corsicana, Texas.

Kevin Love registered a game-high 31 points (9-16 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 9-10 FTs) and a game-high-tying 10 boards for Minnesota.

**NOTABLES:** Dallas began the second quarter on a 17-6 run and opened up a 12-point lead (44-32) 4:21 into the quarter...The Mavericks led by 10 (54-44) with less than 1 minute to go in the second, but Minnesota ended the first half on an 8-0 run...The Mavericks outshot the Timberwolves 50 percent (25-of-50) to 41.5 percent (17-of-41) from the field in the first half, but led by just two (54-52) at the break...Minnesota went 14-of-17 (.824) from the line in the first half...Lamar Odom (1-2 FTs) attempted Dallas' only two foul shots in the opening 24 minutes...The Mavericks did not attempt another free throw until the 3-minute mark of the third quarter...After Shawn Marion tied the game at 70 with a pair of free throws at the 3-minute mark of the third, the Timberwolves went on a 16-3 run that lasted until the 9:29 mark of the fourth, and broke open a 13-point lead (86-73)...Minnesota outshot Dallas 28-of-33 (.848) to 6-of-10 (.600) from the line in the game...A ring ceremony was held prior to the game...Members of the Mavericks' 2011 title team were presented their championship rings.

Nowitzki became the sixth player to score 1,000 points against the Timberwolves franchise (Karl Malone, Hakeem Olajuwon, Shaquille O'Neal, David Robinson, Kobe Bryant). Delonte West (13) and Jason Terry (10) were the only other Mavericks in double figures. With his third rejection, Brendan Haywood recorded his 1,000 career block. Kevin Love posted a game-high 25 points (9-16 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) and a game-high 17 rebounds for the Timberwolves in the win.

**NOTABLES:** Minnesota trailed by two (39-37) with just over 3 minutes remaining in the second quarter, but ended the first half on a 13-2 run and led by nine (50-41) at intermission...The Timberwolves opened up a 15-point lead (60-45) with less than 4 minutes gone by in the third, but the Mavericks countered with a 14-3 run to trim the deficit to four (63-59)...After Dallas used a 10-0 rally in the fourth to cut Minnesota's 12-point lead to two (84-82), the Timberwolves finished the game on a 15-0 run en route to a 99-82 victory...Minnesota outrebounded Dallas, 54-35...The Mavericks shot just 37.7 percent (29-of-77) from the field, while the Timberwolves shot 42.4 percent (36-of-85)...With the win, the Timberwolves recorded their first victory of the season and ended an 18-game losing streak dating back to the 2010-11 season...Dallas fell to 1-4 on the 2011-12 season.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Mavericks have won 21 of the last 28 regular-season meetings with the Blazers, but the Blazers have won five of the last eight (including the most recent two matchups in Portland)...The two teams split the 2010-11 season series (2-2), with the home team winning each time...The Mavericks have won 19 of the last 23 regular-season matchups with the Blazers at home...Despite losing both games at Portland in 2010-11, Dallas has still won nine of the last 14 on the road against the Blazers...But the Mavericks have struggled overall in Portland, where they hold an all-time record of just 18-46 in the regular season...The Mavericks shot a season-high 59.7 percent (40-of-67) from the field in the 104-101 loss to the Blazers on 3/15/11...Prior to the game at Portland on 3/15/11, the last time the Mavericks shot that high of a percentage in a losing effort was exactly 20 years ago to the day on 3/15/91 (shot .600 in the 127-117 loss to Atlanta)...Dirk Nowitzki averaged 21.7 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 2.3 apg, 1.0 spg and 36.0 mpg in three regular-season games against Portland last season...He missed the game vs. Portland on 1/4/11 with a sprained right knee, but Dallas still recorded an 84-81 win...Rodrigue Beaubois averaged 17.0 ppg, 4.0 apg and 23.5 mpg in two games against the Blazers in 2010-11...Shawn Marion averaged 13.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 29.8 mpg in four games against Portland last season...Jason Terry averaged 12.3 ppg, 3.0 apg and 31.3 mpg in four regular-season matchups with the Blazers in 2010-11...Dallas defeated Portland in six games in the first round of the 2011 NBA Playoffs...The Mavericks snapped an eight-game road losing streak in the playoffs with the Game 6 win at Portland on 4/28/11...Prior to the Game 6 victory, Dallas hadn't won on the road in the playoffs since 4/28/09 at San Antonio...The Mavericks had also lost 18 of their previous 20 road playoff games...The home team won all nine of the previous meetings between the Blazers and the Mavericks in 2010-11 (including all four regular-season matchups) before the Mavericks took Game 6 at Portland on 4/28/11...It was the Mavericks' first playoff win in Portland since 4/25/03.

**CONNECTIONS:** Mavericks Head Coach Rick Carlisle was an assistant coach with the Trail Blazers from 1994-97...Blazers forward LaMarcus Aldridge was born in Dallas and attended Seagoville High School before going on to play his college ball at the University of Texas...Blazers forward Nicholas Batum was a teammate of Mavericks center Ian Mahinmi on the French National team that competed in Turkey at the 2010 FIBA World Championship...Mavericks big man Sean Williams and Blazers forward Craig Smith were college teammates at Boston College from 2004-06...Blazers forward Kurt Thomas attended Hillcrest High School in Dallas and played at TCU...He played in five games for the Mavericks in 1997-98.

Vince Carter tallied 17 points (7-12 FGs, 3-7 3FGs), five rebounds, a team-high eight assists, two steals and one block for the Mavericks in the win. Nene (16 points and a game-high 10 rebounds) and Ty Lawson (16 points and a game-high 10 assists) both posted double-doubles, and Rudy Fernandez and Al Harrington both scored 17 points apiece off the bench for Denver in the loss.

**NOTABLES:** The Mavericks outshot the Nuggets 56 percent (14-of-25) to 47.6 percent (10-of-21) in the first quarter and led by eight (33-25) after one...Dallas went 6-of-17 (.353) from deep in the first half compared to Denver's 3-of-11 (.273) clip and led by 11 (64-53) at the break...The Nuggets committed nine first-half turnovers (for nine Dallas points), while the Mavericks recorded just four giveaways in the opening 24 minutes (for four Denver points)...Dallas led by 17 (83-66) midway through the third quarter, but Denver used a 10-0 spurt to trim the deficit to seven (83-76) with 1:23 remaining in the period...But the Mavericks began the fourth quarter on a 6-1 run to extend their lead to 12 (93-81) and led by double digits the rest of the way...The Nuggets' only lead (3-2) came 51 seconds into the start of the first quarter...The Mavericks outscored the Nuggets 13-6 in second-chance points...With the win, Dallas snapped a four-game losing streak against Denver.

**PLAYER NOTES:** Dirk Nowitzki netted a game-high 24 points (9-15 FGs, 2-2 3FGs, 4-5 FTs) to go along with eight rebounds and two blocks in 35 minutes. Delonte West got the start at the point for Dallas and tallied 11 points (4-7 FGs, 3-3 FTs) and seven assists in 28 minutes. Jason Terry pitched in 17 points and four rebounds off the bench for the Mavericks in the loss. Kyrie Irving scored a team-high 20 points to go along with seven assists and two steals for Cleveland. Anderson Varejao posted a double-double with 17 points (8-13 FGs, 1-2 FTs) and a game-high 17 rebounds for the Cavaliers in the win.

**NOTABLES:** The Mavericks outshot the Cavaliers 58.1 percent (18-of-31) to 33.3 percent (15-of-45) from the field in the first half and led by eight (51-43) at the break...Cleveland outscored Dallas 16-8 to begin the third quarter and tied the game at 59 midway through the period...But the Mavericks responded with a 7-0 spurt and took a 66-59 lead with 4:36 to go in the third...Dallas led, 86-83, with less than 4 minutes remaining in regulation, but Cleveland closed the game on an 8-2 run en route to a 91-88 win...The Mavericks committed 21 turnovers for nine Cleveland points, while the Cavaliers turned it over just nine times for only six Dallas points...The Cavaliers outscored the Mavericks 54-38 in the paint, 17-6 in second-chance points and 8-2 in transition...Cleveland recorded 17 offensive rebounds, while Dallas managed only four...The Mavericks outshot the Cavaliers 47.8 percent to 39.8 percent from the field in the game, but Dallas attempted only 67 shots (32-of-67), while Cleveland attempted 93 (37-of-93).

### TEAM STATS

- After failing to score 90 points in their previous three games (all losses), the Mavericks posted 105 points in the win over Denver on 2/8. The Mavericks improved to 7-1 when they score 100-plus points in a game this season. The last time Dallas scored 100 points in back-to-back games this year was 1/29 vs. San Antonio and 1/30 at Phoenix (Dallas actually managed 100 points in three consecutive games from 1/27 vs. Utah to 1/30 at Phoenix).
- After committing a season-high 21 turnovers in the loss to Cleveland on 2/4, Dallas recorded only 13 giveaways in the win over Denver on 2/8. It marked the first time in the past four games that the Mavericks recorded fewer than 15 turnovers. The Mavericks are 11-2 when they commit less than 15 turnovers in a game this season compared to 4-9 when they record 15-or-more.
- The Mavericks lost a 91-88 decision at Cleveland on 2/4. Dallas has now played in seven games decided by three points or less (3-4 record), which is the most by any team in the NBA this season.
- The Mavericks scored a season-high 122 points in the 122-99 win at Phoenix on 1/30 (previous high 116 vs. Utah 1/27). It marked their third straight game scoring 100-plus points, after they hit the century mark just four times in their previous 19 games. Dallas had not managed 100-plus points in back-to-back games prior to the games vs. Utah (1/27) and vs. San Antonio (1/29).
- The Mavericks shot a season-high 55.2 percent (48-of-87) from the field in the win over Phoenix on 1/30. The Mavericks are 5-0 when they shoot at least 50 percent from the floor in a game this year. Dallas made a season-high 14 3-pointers at Phoenix (1/30), going an impressive 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from deep.
- Delonte West (25), Vince Carter (21) and Shawn Marion (20) all scored 20-plus points for the Mavericks in the win over the Suns on 1/30. It was the first time this season that Dallas had three players score 20-plus points in a game. The Mavericks were 5-0 when they had three players score at least 20 in a game in 2010-11.
- Eight different players have led Dallas in scoring this season. Eight Mavericks have also scored 19-plus points in a game this year.

### INDIVIDUAL STATS

- **Brandan Wright** recorded 10 points (5-8 FGs) in 16 minutes off the bench at Denver on 2/8. It marked his third double-figure scoring effort in his last four games (11 points at Cleveland 2/4, season-high 12 points vs. Oklahoma City 2/1), after he went his first 11 games of the season without a double-digit scoring game.
- **Vince Carter** tallied 17 points (7-12 FGs, 3-7 3FGs) to go along with five rebounds, a season-high eight assists, two steals and one block in 29 minutes at Denver on 2/8. The Mavericks are now 5-0 when Carter scores 16-plus points in a game.
- **Lamar Odom** logged 19 minutes at Denver on 2/8 and has now played over 30,000 minutes in his NBA career.
- **Jason Terry** will be appearing in his 583<sup>rd</sup> game in a Dallas uniform at Minnesota (2/10), which will move him past Shawn Bradley (582) and into sixth place on the Mavericks' all-time list for games played. Terry enters the game against the Timberwolves having played in 985 regular-season games and needs 15 to reach 1,000 for his career. He currently ranks 94<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time scoring list with 15,921 career points and needs 28 points to pass "Pistol Pete" Maravich for 93<sup>rd</sup> place.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** poured in a season-high 30 points (12-17 FGs, 1-4 3FGs, 5-6 FTs) to go along with seven rebounds in 33 minutes vs. Indiana on 2/3. His previous high scoring game was 29 at Oklahoma City on 12/29. It marked the 216<sup>th</sup> time in his career that Nowitzki has scored at least 30 in a regular-season game. Nowitzki went 12-of-17 (.706) from the floor against Indiana on 2/3, after he went just 11-of-39 (.282) from the field in his previous three contests. He made nine of his first 10 shots in the game and led all scorers with 20 points at the half (went 9-of-11 from the field in the first half). Just two of his 20 first-half points came in the paint. It was the first time he's scored 20 points in the first half of a game since 11/3/10 (20 at Denver) and the first time he's tallied 20 in any half since 3/24/11 (20 in second half vs. Minnesota).
- **Jason Terry** netted a team-high 25 points (7-10 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 9-9 FTs) vs. Oklahoma City on 2/1. It marked the eighth time this season that Terry has led the team in scoring, including the third time in the past five games. It was also his fourth 20-point effort of the season.
- **Shawn Marion** notched his third double-double of the season (395<sup>th</sup> career) with 12 points (6-15 FGs) and a team-high 10 rebounds vs. Oklahoma City on 2/1. It was his first double-figure rebounding effort since 1/21 (12 at New Orleans).
- **Delonte West** scored a season-high 25 points (9-12 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) in 28 minutes at Phoenix on 1/30 (previous high 17 at L.A. Clippers 1/18). He added six assists and two steals in 28 minutes off the bench. West tied a career high with five 3-pointers in the game (made five 3s on three other occasions). It was the first time he's made five treys in a game since 2/22/09 (Cleveland vs. Detroit). He made his first five 3-point attempts against the Suns and finished 5-of-6 from deep in the game. West scored 25 in a game for the eighth time in his NBA career and the first time since 3/6/10 (27, Cleveland at Milwaukee).
- **Vince Carter** moved past George "The Iceman" Gervin (20,708) and into 34<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with his first made basket against Oklahoma City on 2/1. Carter currently has 20,750 career points and needs 41 points to pass "The Admiral" David Robinson (20,790) for 33<sup>rd</sup> place on the all-time list.
- **Jason Terry** recorded in a season-high 34 points (14-23 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) against the Spurs on 1/29 (previous high 23 vs. Miami on 12/25). He hit a jumper with 0.5 seconds remaining that tied the game at 91 and forced overtime. Terry also scored Dallas' final four points in overtime to lift the Mavericks to a 101-100 victory. Deron Williams is the only other player to score the final points of regulation and the game-winner in the final minute of overtime this season (New Jersey at Philadelphia 1/25/12).
- **Rodrigue Beaubois** made his first start of the season (43<sup>rd</sup> career) vs. Utah on 1/27. He scored a season-high 22 points (9-15 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) (previous high 17 at Utah on 1/19/12) to go along with a season-high-tying six rebounds, a career-high seven assists and a career-high four blocks in 36 minutes. It was the fourth time he's scored 20-plus points in a game in his career and the first time he has done so since 3/27/10 (career-high 40 points at Golden State). It was the second time in his career that Beaubois led Dallas in scoring and the fourth time he has led his team in assists. But it was the first time he led his team in both categories in one game. Beaubois became one of only two guards (also Dwyane Wade vs. Boston 12/27/11) to record four blocks in a game this season. Since 1986-87, Michael Finley (vs. Portland 2/28/04), Jason Kidd (at Phoenix 4/6/08) and Derek Harper (vs. Utah 4/17/90) are the only other Maverick guards to block four shots in a game.
- **Lamar Odom** scored a season-high 19 points (7-12 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 2-4 FTs) against Utah on 1/27 (previous high 16 at New Orleans 1/21/12). It was his sixth double-figure scoring effort of the season (and the fourth in his last five games).
- **Brendan Haywood** posted his first double-double of the season (67<sup>th</sup> career) with a season-high 12 points and a season-high-tying 12 rebounds vs. Utah (1/27). It was his fifth double-digit rebounding effort of the season (4-1 record).
- **Shawn Marion** dropped a season-high 29 points (11-21 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 3-5 FTs) against Phoenix on 1/23 (previous high 22 at Utah 1/19). It tied his Maverick-high (29 at Minnesota 3/8/10). Marion, who made a total of eight 3-pointers (8-52 3FGs) his first two seasons with Dallas (2009-11), went 4-of-6 from beyond the arc against the Suns. It was the first time he's made four triples in a game since 1/18/08. His career high for 3-pointers made in a game is five (on six occasions). The Mavericks are 10-1 this season when Marion scores 13-plus points in a game.
- **Ian Mahinmi** recorded 17 points and nine rebounds in 29 minutes vs. Phoenix on 1/23. He tied his second-highest career scoring output (also had 17 at Memphis 1/15/11). Dallas is 5-1 when Mahinmi scores 10-plus points in a game this season. He had four double-figure scoring efforts all of last year.

**BENCH PRODUCTION:** The Mavericks are averaging a league-best 44.0 bench points per game this season, slightly below what their starters are averaging (50.2 ppg). Jason Terry has led the Mavericks in scoring eight times as a reserve (including ties). Dallas led the NBA in bench scoring in 2010-11 with 40.4 points per game off the pine.

**DEFENSIVE NUMBERS:** The Mavericks rank near the top in several defensive categories including points allowed, opponent field goal percentage, steals per game, opponent points in the paint and opponent second-chance points. Below is a look at the Mavericks' defensive numbers and where they rank:

**DIRK REACHES 23K, CLOSING IN ON 20<sup>TH</sup> ALL-TIME:** Dirk Nowitzki scored his 23,000<sup>th</sup> career point against Milwaukee on 1/13/12 with his first free throw at the 7:17 mark of the second quarter. He became the 23<sup>rd</sup> player in NBA history (third active player) to achieve the milestone. He moved past Elgin Baylor (23,149) and into 22<sup>nd</sup> place on the NBA's all-time scoring list at Cleveland (2/4/12) with a 17-foot fadeaway at the 7:37 mark of the fourth quarter. In his next game at Denver on 2/8/12, he scored a game-high 25 points and passed Adrian Dantley (23,177) for 21<sup>st</sup> place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with a jumper at the 1:36 mark of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter. Nowitzki now has **23,179** career points and needs 156 to pass Robert Parish (23,334) for 20<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Nowitzki passed Hal Greer (21,586), Larry Bird (21,791), Gary Payton (21,813) and Clyde Drexler (22,195) on the all-time scoring list in 2010-11. He ranks third among active players in career scoring, trailing only Kobe Bryant and Kevin Garnett. Only three other players born outside of the United States have more career points than the 7-footer from Germany: Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946, born in Nigeria), Dominique Wilkins (26,668, born in France) and Patrick Ewing (24,815, born in Jamaica). Nowitzki reached the 20,000-point mark during the 2009-10 season, becoming the first European-born player to achieve the milestone.

**GETTING IT TOGETHER:** Since opening the season 1-4, Dallas has locked down on the defensive end. The Mavericks are shooting the ball better as well. Despite losing to the Lakers (1/16) and the Clippers (1/18) on 3-pointers in the final seconds, the Mavericks are still 14-7 over their last 21 games. The Mavericks are 10-1 this season when they hold the opposition to under 90 points, compared to 5-10 when they allow 90-plus points in a game. Below is a look at how the Mavericks' stats from their first five games of the season compare to their stats from their most recent 21 games:

**GROUP EFFORT:** With the departure of Tyson Chandler for New York this past offseason, the Mavericks' big men have all stepped into larger roles for Dallas this season. Brendan Haywood, Ian Mahinmi and Brandan Wright have all split time at the center position for Dallas and are forming a three-headed monster in the middle. Haywood has started 25-of-26 games this year (after he started just eight games for Dallas last season) and is averaging team highs in rebounds (6.7) and blocked shots (1.1). Mahinmi is averaging career highs in points (7.4), rebounds (5.3) and minutes (19.9) as a backup center. He has scored in double figures six times this year, after he did so four times all of last season. The high flyer Brandan Wright, who was signed as a free agent by Dallas in the offseason, has made the most of his minutes at backup center. He is averaging 5.7 points, 2.4 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in just 10.9 minutes per game this season. Wright has scored in double figures three times in 15 appearances this year (all three coming in his last four games).

**15 STRAIGHT GAMES HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 100:** The Mavericks held their opponents to under 100 points for 15 straight games from 12/30/11-1/23/12, which set a franchise record for consecutive games holding teams under the century mark (was 13, 1/14/06-2/9/06). Opponents averaged just 84.3 points per game on 39.8 percent shooting against the Mavericks in those 15 games, and Dallas went 11-4 in that span. The Mavericks held their opponents to under 80 points in three straight games during that stretch from 1/13-1/16/12. The Timberwolves ended the Mavericks' run when they defeated Dallas, 105-90, at American Airlines Center on 1/25/12. Minnesota was also the only team to score over 93 points against the Mavericks during their 15-game run (defeated Dallas, 99-82, at Minnesota on 1/1/12).

**KIDD PULLING CLOSER TO MJ ON STEALS LIST:** At 38 years old, Mavericks point guard Jason Kidd is still averaging 1.6 steals per game this season. He recorded a season-high six steals in his return to the starting lineup against Sacramento (1/14/12), after missing four games with a sore lower back (1/7/12-1/13/12). Kidd, who has been named to the NBA All-Defensive First Team four times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2006) and NBA All-Defensive Second Team five times (2000, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007), recorded two steals at the L.A. Lakers on 1/16/12, giving him 2,500 for his career. He currently has **2,502** career steals and needs just **13** more to pass Michael Jordan (2,514) for second place on the NBA's all-time steals list. John Stockton is the NBA's all-time steals leader with 3,265 career thefts.

**DOMINANT DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE:** Dallas' defense shut down the Kings in the game at American Airlines Center on 1/14/12. The Mavericks held the Kings to just 60 points on 22-of-86 (.256) shooting, setting new franchise opponent lows for points (was 65 at Minnesota 2/27/07), field goals made (was 23 at Indiana, 23-67, 12/6/05) and field goal percentage (was .296, 24-81, at Minnesota 2/27/07). The Mavericks held the Kings to just 23 points in the first half (Dallas led, 52-23, at the break). It marked an all-time low for points in a half by a Dallas opponent. The previous franchise opponent low for points in a half was 24 by Vancouver (at Dallas 3/13/99, in the first half). The 23 points recorded by the Kings in the opening 24 minutes also represented an all-time Sacramento franchise low for points in a half (was 25 vs. Boston 2/26/57).

**HOW SWEEP IT IS!:** When the Mavericks faced the Kings at home on 1/14/12, it marked the 111<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history that Dallas played four games in five nights. With wins at Detroit (1/10), at Boston (1/11), vs. Milwaukee (1/13) and vs. Sacramento (1/14), the Mavericks completed a four-game sweep in five nights for just the fourth time in team history (also 2/19/85-2/23/85, 11/17/06-11/21/06 and 11/23/10-11/27/10). The Mavericks recorded the sweep last season with wins against Detroit (11/23/10), at Oklahoma City (11/24/10), at San Antonio (11/26/10) and against Miami (11/27/10).

**JET SEVENTH PLACE ALL-TIME ON TRIPLES LIST:** Jason Terry went 2-for-4 from beyond the arc against Sacramento on 1/14. He took sole possession of seventh place on the all-time 3-point field goals made list with his first three of the game (1,681<sup>st</sup> career) at the 1:26 mark of the second quarter. Terry, who passed Washington's Rashard Lewis for seventh place all-time, is closing in on former Maverick Dale Ellis (1,719) for sixth place on the all-time list. Terry currently has **1,704** career 3-pointers and needs **16** to pass Ellis.

**ANOTHER SHOOTING CLINIC FOR NOWITZKI:** Dirk Nowitzki went 9-of-10 (.900) from the field at Detroit on 1/10/12, finishing with a team-high 18 points and seven rebounds in 28 minutes of action. The 90 percent field goal percentage was the highest field goal percentage he has recorded in any game in his career (minimum 10 field goal attempts). The Mavericks are 12-0 all-time in the regular season when Nowitzki shoots at least 80 percent from the floor (minimum 10 field goal attempts). He has averaged 27.0 points per game in those 12 contests. Nowitzki, who shot a career-high 51.7 percent (610-1,179 FGs) from the field during the 2010-11 regular season, had five such games last season. Nowitzki has shot 80-plus percent from the floor (while attempting at least 10 shots) in two postseason games in his career, and Dallas is 2-0 in those games. He went 12-of-15 (.800) from the field (24-of-24 from the line) en route to a playoff-high 48 points in Game 1 of the 2011 Western Conference Finals against Oklahoma City on 5/17/11. The 48 points were the most by any player in a playoff game who shot at least 80 percent from the field. Nowitzki also went 12-of-14 (.857) from the floor in the playoffs against the Spurs on 4/18/10, finishing with 36 points in 40 minutes.

**DIRK'S 1,000TH GAME:** Dirk Nowitzki played in his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career regular-season game (975<sup>th</sup> start) against Phoenix on 1/4/12, becoming the 98<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history (11<sup>th</sup> active player) to accomplish the feat. With the win over the Suns, Dallas won its 661<sup>st</sup> game with Nowitzki in the lineup (went 661-339 in his first 1,000 games). Nowitzki, whose first season in Dallas was in 1998-99, is the third-longest tenured player with his original team (L.A. Lakers' Kobe Bryant 1996-97; San Antonio's Tim Duncan 1997-98). He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played in franchise history at Phoenix on 1/28/10. Nowitzki has appeared in an additional 124 playoff games (all starts) over the course of his NBA career.

**DIRK RECORDS 8,000TH CAREER FIELD GOAL:** With a 10-foot step-back jumper (at the 7:40 mark of the second quarter) against Oklahoma City on 1/2/12, Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 8,000<sup>th</sup> career regular-season made field goal. He became the 31<sup>st</sup> player in NBA history to accomplish the feat and he currently ranks fourth among active players in field goals made (behind Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett and Tim Duncan).

**HAYWOOD RECORDS 1,000TH BLOCK, DIRK APPROACHING MILESTONE:** Mavericks center Brendan Haywood had three blocks at Minnesota on 1/1/12, giving him 1,000 for his career. Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki currently has **995** career rejections and needs **five** to reach the milestone himself. Haywood has had six seasons with 100-plus swats, including four straight from 2002-06. Nowitzki is the only player in NBA history to record at least 100 blocks and 150 3-pointers in a single season (2000-01). He ranks second on Dallas' all-time blocks list behind Shawn Bradley (1,250).

**A KIDD AT HEART:** Jason Kidd ranks first among active players and 14<sup>th</sup> all-time with **1,283** games played. The 17-year veteran has started 1,268 of the 1,283 games he has appeared in over the course of his NBA career. He needs four games to pass former Maverick Sam Perkins (1,286) for 13<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time list.

**THREE STREAK:** The game vs. Memphis on 3/6/11 marked Dallas' 1,000<sup>th</sup> straight game with at least one 3-point basket. Since 2/27/99, the Mavericks have gone 1,046 consecutive regular-season games with a 3-pointer made – the longest streak in NBA history. They've made only one trey in a game 15 times in that span. The Raptors went 986 consecutive games with at least one 3-pointer made, but had their streak (which began on 2/26/99) come to an end vs. Memphis on 1/24/11.

**BACK-TO-BACKS:** The Mavericks have 22 back-to-backs in 2011-12, which includes one back-to-back-to-back set from March 8-10. In total, six of them begin at home and end on the road, six are road-home, eight are on the road and two are at home. Dallas played 20 back-to-backs in 2010-11, finishing 13-7 in the front half and 14-6 in the second half of those sets.

**CHAMPIONS AT LAST:** After 31 years of waiting, the Mavericks finally brought an NBA Championship home to the city of Dallas in 2011. The Mavericks avenged the 2006 loss to the Heat by defeating Miami in the 2011 NBA Finals. After losing Game 3 and falling behind 2-1, Dallas responded with three straight victories and closed out Miami in six games. Of the previous 11 occasions a Finals series had been tied at 1-1 (since the NBA Finals went to the 2-3-2 format beginning in 1985), the winner of Game 3 had gone on to win the championship all 11 times. The Mavericks rewrote history in 2011 and captured their first NBA title in the process.

**TITLE DEFENSE:** Ten of the last 25 NBA champions have "repeated" beginning with the Lakers in 1987 and 1988. Since the NBA's inaugural season in 1946-47, 21 of the 65 title winners have followed their championship seasons by winning the NBA Finals the next year. Among the other 44 teams, nine lost in the NBA Finals, 17 lost in the Conference Finals, 11 lost in the Conference Semifinals, five lost in the First Round and two failed to make the playoffs.

**MOST WINS IN A FIVE-YEAR SPAN:** Dallas went 280-130 (.683) over the last five regular seasons (from 2006-07 to 2010-11), which was the highest winning percentage in the league in that span (see right). What's more, Dallas won the most games in the 2010 calendar year. The Mavericks, who entered the year 2011 with a record of 24-7 (held a record of 24-7 going into the game at Milwaukee on 1/1/11), finished the 2010 calendar year with a record of 57-24 (.704). The Spurs (.702, 59-25) finished with the second-highest winning percentage in 2010. Dallas recorded the highest winning percentage in a calendar year on two other occasions: 2007 (.768, 63-19) and 2002 (.744, 61-21, tied with Sacramento).

**LONG STREAK OF SUCCESS:** With a victory over the Timberwolves on 3/24/11, the Mavericks improved to 50-21 in 2010-11 and recorded their 11<sup>th</sup> straight 50-win season (13<sup>th</sup> in franchise history). Dallas became just the third team in NBA history to record 11 straight 50-win seasons (2000-2011). Only four franchises have had at least 10 consecutive 50-win seasons since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967. The Spurs (12 seasons, 1999-2011) and the Lakers (12 seasons, 1979-1991) are the only two teams with longer streaks than the Mavericks (see below). Dallas ended the 2010-11 regular season with a record of 57-25 (.695), which was tied for the fifth-best mark in franchise history (also finished 57-25 in 2001-02). The Mavericks have tallied at least 55 wins seven times in the last 11 seasons. They have finished with a winning percentage of at least .695 six times in that span, including a franchise-high .817 (67-15) in 2006-07. Since 2000-01, the lowest winning percentage the Mavericks have recorded for a season is .610, when they won exactly 50 games in 2008-09. A 50-win season with an 82-game schedule equates to about 40.2 wins with a 66-game schedule. Therefore, the Mavericks will have to win 41-or-more games in 2011-12 to match the 61.0 percent-plus winning percentage they have recorded in each of the past 11 seasons (40 wins will give them a winning percentage of .606, while 41 wins will give them a winning percentage of .621).

**SPRINGTIME TRADITION:** Dallas has made 11 consecutive trips to the postseason (17 overall). It's the longest streak in franchise history and currently the second-longest streak in the NBA. San Antonio (14 consecutive playoff appearances) is the only team with a longer active streak (see right). The Mavericks have made three Western Conference Finals appearances in that span (four in franchise history: 1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). They captured their first NBA Championship in 2011.

**STILL SEEING DOUBLE:** Of the active players in the NBA who have tallied the most double-doubles in their careers, the Mavericks have three players that rank in the top 10. **Jason Kidd's 485** career double-doubles rank third among active players, **Shawn Marion's 395** rank sixth and **Dirk Nowitzki's 360** rank eighth. Kidd ranks first among active players and third all-time (behind Oscar Robertson, 181, and Magic Johnson, 138) with **107** career triple-doubles.

**LO-TS OF MOVEMENT:** Dallas made at least one roster move every day in a span from 12/9-12/15/11, beginning with the signing of free agent forward Brandan Wright on 12/9. The most notable move came on 12/11, when Dallas traded for the reigning Sixth Man of the Year, Lamar Odom. The Mavericks shipped a protected first-round draft pick to the Lakers in exchange for Odom, a 2012 second-round draft pick and other second-round considerations in 2013. Odom averaged 14.4 points, 8.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 32.2 minutes in 82 games (32 starts) for the Lakers last season. He joins a Mavericks roster that features the player who finished as the runner-up for the Sixth Man of the Year award in 2010-11 (and who won the award in 2008-09), Jason Terry. On 12/12, the Mavericks signed eight-time All-Star Vince Carter and re-signed forward Brian Cardinal. The next day (12/13), Dallas signed free agent guard Delonte West. The Mavericks dealt two players (Rudy Fernandez, who was acquired in a three-team trade with Denver and Portland on 7/23, and Corey Brewer) to Denver for a future second-round draft pick on 12/13. Free agents Tyson Chandler (New York), Caron Butler (L.A. Clippers), Jose Juan Barea (Minnesota) and DeShawn Stevenson (New Jersey) all signed with different clubs this past offseason, and Peja Stojakovic announced his retirement on 12/19. Cardinal was the only Dallas free agent that re-signed with the club. Free agent big man Sean Williams signed with Dallas on 12/21. The Mavericks' most recent signing came on 1/6, when they signed free agent forward Yi Jianlian. The roster currently stands at 15 players.

**FIRST-ROUND SELECTIONS:** Fourteen of the 15 players currently on the Mavericks' roster are former first-round draft picks (Brian Cardinal is the only Maverick who was drafted in the second round). Seven were top-10 picks: Jason Kidd (second overall in 1994), Vince Carter (fifth overall in 1998), Dirk Nowitzki (ninth overall in 1998), Lamar Odom (fourth overall in 1999), Shawn Marion (ninth overall in 1999), Jason Terry (10<sup>th</sup> overall in 1999), Yi Jianlian (sixth overall in 2007) and Brandan Wright (eighth overall in 2007). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994).

**CENTURY MARK SUCCESS:** The Mavericks have reached the century mark in scoring eight times thus far in 2011-12 (7-1 record). The Mavericks were 43-4 (.915) when they scored 100-plus points in 2010-11, including 13-1 (.929) when they recorded 110-plus points in a game. They were 35-7 (.833) when they scored at least 100 points in a game in 2009-10, and 34-11 (.756) when they did so in 2008-09.

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The season-opener versus Miami on 12/25/11 marked the Mavericks' 400<sup>th</sup> consecutive sellout. Since 12/15/01, Dallas has sold out **413** regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best-sellout streak. Dallas has also sold out an additional 58 playoff games during that same stretch. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a record of **330-94 (.778)** at home. Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past nine seasons.

# HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Rick Carlisle led the Mavericks to their first NBA Championship in 2010-11. He became one of only 11 men to win an NBA championship as both a player and as a coach (won a title as a player with Boston in 1986).

Carlisle became the ninth Dallas coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas. He began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
