SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks have defeated the Clippers 12 out of the last 13 times...Chris Kaman was impressive for the Clippers in the three losses last season, as he averaged 22.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.7 blocks while shooting .549 from the field during the 2009-10 season series...The Clippers' last win over the Mavericks came on 11/9/08 in Los Angeles...it's the only time Los Angeles has defeated Dallas since 11/8/06, when the Clippers recorded a 103-92 win at home...The Mavericks have won seven in a row at home...Los Angeles hasn't beaten Dallas on the road since 4/19/06, when Dallas posted just 71 points in a 71-85 loss...The Clippers took the season series, 2-1, in 2004-05...it was the first time Los Angeles won a season series against Dallas since 1997-98...The Mavericks faced the Clippers in Los Angeles in their third regular season game in 2009-10 on the same date (Oct. 31) and came away with a 93-84 victory.

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki and Clippers center Chris Kaman were teammates on the German National Team and represented the nation at the 2008 Summer Olympics...Mavericks center Tyson Chandler was originally draft No. 2 overall by the L.A. Clippers in the 2001 NBA Draft, but was traded to Chicago...Mavericks center Tyson Chandler was born in Hanford, Calif. and attended high school at Dominguez HS in Compton, Calif...Clippers guard Willie Warren was born in Dallas and attended high school at North Crowley in Fort Worth...Clippers forward Rasual Butler played together with Mavericks center Tyson Chandler from 2006-2009 with the New Orleans Hornets and was also a teammate of Mavericks guard Caron Butler from 2003-04 with the Miami Heat.

SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks have struggled against the Nuggets as of late, as Denver has taken six of the last eight games in the series...Dirk Nowitzki averaged 21.3 points, 8.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists against Denver in 2009-10...Nowitzki is 28-13 vs. the Nuggets all-time and holds career averages of 22.6 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game against Denver...Carmelo Anthony has averaged 23.0 points, 6.8 rebounds and 3.6 assists against the Mavericks in his career...Anthony averaged 17.5 ppg in the two games vs. Dallas at Denver last season, but was held to just 10 points (3-of-16 FGs) in the loss to Dallas on 3/29/10... Anthony scored a series-high 43 pnts for Denver on 3/27/09...the Mavericks' 124-123 overtime win on 11/12/94 marked their largest comeback win, overcoming a 25-point deficit 1:05 in the first period en route to the win...Mark Aguirre recorded the Mavericks' first triple-double with 30 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists, in the 149-139 win on 1/14/83...the 12 3-pointers made by Dallas in the first half of the 2/29/96 contest set an NBA half record.

He made his last seven shots vs. Charlotte on 10/27 and finished 11-of-13 for the game. Nowitzki opened the game vs. Memphis on 10/29 3-for-3 before missing his fourth field goal attempt of the contest. He finished the game vs. Memphis 11-of-15 from the floor.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** has begun the 2010-11 season shooting 22-of-28 (.786) from the field through two games.
- **Jason Kidd** dished out 18 assists to go with 12 points, three steals and two rebounds in the season opener vs. Charlotte on 10/27/10. His previous high assist total on opening night was 16, which he recorded against the L.A. Clippers on 10/31/97.
- **Jason Kidd** recorded 35 games with 10+ assists last season (30-5). He led the team with 28 double-doubles (21 points-assists) and also recorded two triple-doubles in 2009-10. Dallas was 19-2 when Kidd recorded a points/assists double-double last season. The Mavericks were 2-0 when Kidd registered a triple-double.
- **Shawn Marion** came off the bench for the second time in as many games and recorded 12 points (4-11 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 3-4 FTs), seven rebounds and one steal in 24 minutes vs. Memphis on 10/29. Marion started all 75 games he appeared in in 2009-10 and averaged 12.0 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 31.8 minutes.
- The Mavericks' starting backcourt of **Jason Kidd** (18) and **Jason Terry** (6) combined for more assists than the entire Bobcats team (22) vs. Charlotte on 10/27.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** recorded a game-high 28 points (11-13 FGs, 6-6 FTs) and added 13 rebounds in the season opener vs. Charlotte on 10/27. It was his sixth time he's posted a double-double on opening night in his career but the first time he's done so since 2006-07. He recorded a double-double on opening night in five consecutive seasons from 2002-03 to 2006-07.
- The Mavericks were 32-12 when Nowitzki scored 25+ points in 2009-10. He notched 30+ points 20 times in the 2009-10 regular season. Dallas was 16-4 when Nowitzki scored at least 30 last season and 7-2 when he added at least 10 boards in those games.

TEAM STATS

- **The Mavericks have held their opponents to just .392 (60-153 FGs) shooting from the field through two games while shooting .510 (75-147) from the floor themselves.**
- Dallas shot 11-of-18 (.611) from the field in the first period vs. Memphis on 10/29 after shooting 11-of-19 (.579) in the first quarter the previous game vs. Charlotte on 10/27.
- The Mavericks led at the end of every quarter in the 2010-11 prior to the loss against Memphis on 10/29 in which they moved to 1-1 on the year.
- The Mavericks committed 20 turnovers that led to 19 Memphis points in the loss to the Grizzlies on 10/29. The Grizzlies turned the ball over just 13 times for 14 Mavericks points.
- The Mavericks have used the same lineup (Butler, Nowitzki, Chandler, Terry and Kidd) in both regular season games so far in 2010-11. They used 18 different lineups over the course of the 2009-10 regular season.
- Dallas recorded a 101-86 win in the home opener vs. Charlotte on 10/27. In 2009-10, **Dallas was 35-7 (.833) when it scored 100 points or more.**
- The Mavericks went 41-of-75 (.547) from the floor in the first game of the season vs. Charlotte on 10/27. **Dallas was 11-0 when they shot at least .540 from the field in 2009-10 (and 22-3 when they shot at least .500).**
- The Mavericks moved to 18-13 all-time in season openers (11-7 when the first game of the season was played at home) with the win over Charlotte on 10/27. Dallas is now 19-12 in its home openers.

- **Dirk Nowitzki** ranked 7th in the NBA in scoring in 2009-10 with 25.0 ppg and 2nd in free throw percentage at 91.5 percent (536-586 FTs). He went 11-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 6-6 of six from the line in the Mavericks' home opener vs. Charlotte on 10/27.
- **Jason Terry** tallied 22 points (10-15 FGs, 2-4 3FGs) to go with one rebound, six assists and four steals vs. Charlotte on 10/27. The Mavericks were 10-1 when Terry recorded 20+ points and 5+ assists in 2009-10.

TEAM STATS

- As a result of the victory over Houston on 10/22, the Mavericks wrapped up the 2010 preseason at .500 (4-4).
- Since 2000, the Mavericks have concluded the preseason at or above .500 eight times and posted a franchise-high six preseason wins in 2000 and 2005. The Mavericks have recorded 50-plus wins in every regular season dating back to 2000.
- Dallas has finished the preseason at or above .500 five out of the past six years (2005-2010). The Mavericks have won the most regular season games in the NBA since 2005.

MAVERICKS NOTES

STILL GOT IT

Jason Kidd (17th season) and Dirk Nowitzki (13th season) will have combined for 30 years of NBA experience when the 2010-11 NBA season is all said and done, but the two future Hall of Famers have showed no signs of slowing down so far in 2010-11. Both players are averaging a double-double through two games in the 2010-11 campaign. Nowitzki has shot an incredible .786 (22-of-28) from the field and is averaging 27.5 points, 10.0 rebounds and 1.0 assists in 37 minutes per game. Kidd has recorded double-digit assists in both regular season games thus far in 2010-11 and is averaging 10.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 14.0 assists, 2.5 steals in 33.0 minutes per game. The two veteran superstars combined for 46 double-doubles in 2009-10. Dallas was 23-4 when Kidd recorded double-digits in at least two categories last season and 13-6 when Nowitzki posted a double-double in 2009-10.

NO KIDDING AROUND

Jason Kidd wasted no time showing why is still considered to be one of the elite point guards in the NBA today. The 16-year veteran dished out 18 assists on opening night vs. Charlotte on 10/27/10. His previous high assist total on opening night was 16, which he recorded vs. the L.A. Clippers on 10/31/97 as a member of the Phoenix Suns. The 18 assists marked the most assists by a Maverick on opening night (previous high 13, by Steve Nash recorded on 10/30/2002). It's tied for the second-most assists on opening night in NBA history (Tim Hardaway also recorded 18 assists with Golden State vs. Denver on 11/2/1990). John Stockton holds the record for the most assists in a season opener with 19 (11/3/89 vs. Denver).

REDIRKULOUS STREAK

Dirk Nowitzki made 82 consecutive free throws over the course of 11 regular season games from 3/29/10-10/29/10. He saw his streak come to an end in the second game of the 2010-11 regular season vs. Memphis on 10/29/10 (finished 4-of-6 from the line in the game). The streak began vs. Denver on 3/29/10 in the Mavericks' 109-93 win at home. Nowitzki finished 16-of-17 from the line against Denver en route to a game-high 34 points. He missed his fifth free throw attempt of the contest at the 3:48 mark of the second quarter after connecting on his first four attempts. Nowitzki went on to make his next 12 free throw attempts in the game and would continue his streak from there. Minnesota's Michael Williams holds the record for the most consecutive free throws made with 97 (March 24-Nov. 9, 1993).

NEW FLIGHT PLAN FOR JET IN 2010-11?

Jason Terry has started at shooting guard for Dallas in both games in the 2010-11 campaign. He's averaging 17.5 points, 2.0 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 2.0 steals in 36.0 minutes. On opening night vs. Charlotte, Terry poured in 22 points (10-15 FGs, 2-4 3FGs) to go along with six assists, two rebounds and four steals. Terry started just 12 games (5-7) for the Mavericks in 2009-10. He averaged 19.5 points, 1.9 rebounds and 4.6 assists in 37 minutes as a starter compared to 16.1 points, 1.8 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 32 minutes as a reserve last season. Dallas went 5-7 when Terry was featured in the starting lineup and 46-19 when he appeared as a sub last season. Terry single-handedly matched or outscored the opposing team's bench 13 times (9-4) last season as the Mavericks' sixth man. He recorded 24 games with 20-plus points in 2009-10 (17-7).

FRANCHISE PLAYER

Dirk Nowitzki entered his 13th NBA season having already shattered numerous franchise records. Nowitzki began the 2010-11 season as the Mavericks' all-time leader in points (21,111), rebounds (7,802), field goals (7,348), 3-pointers (1,131), free throws (5,284), free throw percentage (.876), starts (895), games (920) and minutes (33,732) played. He appeared in his 920th game vs. San Antonio on April 14. He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Maverick in franchise history (vs. Phoenix 1/28). Nowitzki is just one of two active players in the NBA who leads his team in career games (Charlotte's Gerald Wallace is the other). He is also the third-longest tenured player with his original team (behind Lakers' Kobe Bryant, 1996-97, and San Antonio's Tim Duncan, 1997-98). Through two games in 2010-11, Nowitzki has shot the ball at a ridiculous clip, going 22-of-28 (.786) from field. He's averaging 27.5 points, 10.0 rebounds, 1.0 and 37.0 minutes so far in 2010-11.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE

The Mavericks have recorded 939 consecutive games with a 3-pointer made. The streak began on 2/27/99 and is second only to the Toronto Raptors, whose streak began just one game prior to the day the Mavericks' streak began. The next closest team to the Mavericks is the Los Angeles Lakers. A decade has gone by and Dallas looks to continue its consistency from long range. In 2009-10, Dallas shot 558-of-1,498 (.372) from behind the arc, the fifth-highest percentage in the league (behind Phoenix, Cleveland, Orlando and Golden State).

LONG STREAK OF SUCCESS

The Mavericks own the best record in the NBA since 2005-06. Dallas has racked up 283 total wins over the course of the past five regular seasons and are 283-127 (.690) from 2005-06 through 2009-10. Dirk Nowitzki has averaged 25.1 ppg, 8.5 rpg, 3.0 apg in 37.1 mpg during that span. The Mavericks' Southwestern Division rival San Antonio Spurs hold the second-best won-lost record from 2005-06 through 2009-10 at 281-129 (.685) followed by Cleveland at 272-138 (.663). Dallas' 2009-10 playoff appearance marked the 10th straight season the Mavericks made the trip to the postseason. Only the Spurs (13 consecutive playoff appearances) have a longer active streak. Dallas is just the fourth franchise (since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967) to record at least 10 consecutive 50-plus win seasons. The Mavericks' streak of 10 consecutive postseason appearances is the third-longest streak of its kind. The Spurs (11 consecutive seasons) are the only other team with an active streak of at least 10 straight seasons with 50-plus wins.

TOE THE LINE

Dallas looks to continue to win close games at the charity stripe this season. In 2009-10, Dallas shot an NBA-best 81.6 percent (1,526-1,870 FTs) from the line. The Mavericks led the league in free throw percentage in 2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08 and 2009-10. Through two games in 2010-11 the Mavericks have gone 10-of-33 (.303) from beyond the arc.

THE FRENCH CONNECTION

Roughly one-third of the French players in the NBA play for the Dallas Mavericks. This year's team features three players who have all represented France in international play during their careers. Newly acquired Mavericks Alexi Ajinca (ah-lek-SEE ah-Gin-sa) and Ian Mahinmi (Yan me-HEEN-me) join Rodrigue Beaubois (rod-REEG BOH-bwah) on the Mavericks roster. No other NBA team currently features more French players on its roster. Beaubois, who was born in Pointe-à-Pitre, Guadeloupe, played three professional seasons for Cholet (France) after making his debut in 2006-07. Beaubois has participated in France's senior and junior national team program. He was chosen to represent France in the FIBA World Championship this past summer but was unable to participate due to a fractured left foot he suffered in training camp. Mahinmi, who was born and raised in Rouen, France, did travel to Istanbul this summer and averaged 4.5 points, 3.2 rebounds in 10.0 minutes at the FIBA World Championship. Ajinca, a native of Saint-Étienne, France, played for Hyeres-Toulon of the French ProA League in 2007-08 and averaged 5.0 points and 3.1 rebounds in 10.8 minutes. He also won a Bronze Medal at the Under-19 World Championship in the summer of 2007.

NEW TO BIG D

Even after yet another 50-plus (55) win season in 2009-10, Dallas was quickly looking to improve when the offseason rolled around. The first step the Mavericks took to add depth to their roster occurred when they traded up to get South Florida guard Dominique Jones in the 2010 NBA Draft. Dallas acquired the draft rights to Jones, originally the 25th overall pick, from the Memphis Grizzlies in exchange for cash considerations. After re-signing center Brendan Haywood, Dallas added more length to its roster by acquiring centers Tyson Chandler and Alexis Ajinca from Charlotte in exchange for center Erick Dampier, forward Eduardo Najera, guard Matt Carroll and cash considerations. But Dallas wasn't done there. On the same day (July 13) they traded to get Chandler and Ajinca and signed rookie Dominique Jones, the Mavericks added more size by signing 6-foot-11 center Ian Mahinmi, who played 26 games with the San Antonio Spurs in 2009-10, averaging 3.9 points and 2.0 rebounds in 6.3 minutes. Six days later, the Mavericks re-signed their franchise player, Dirk Nowitzki. Steve Novak, who appeared in 54 games with the L.A. Clippers last season and averaged 2.1 points, 0.6 rebounds in 6.7 minutes, was signed late in September. Brian Cardinal, who played 29 games with Minnesota in 2009-10, was invited to training camp and secured the final roster spot heading into the 2010-11 season. The Mavericks roster currently stands at 15 players.

TYSON CHAMPION OF THE WORLD

Tyson Chandler won a Gold Medal competing for Team USA at the FIBA World Championships in Istanbul, Turkey this past summer. In nine contests, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.7 rebounds in 8.6 minutes for Team USA, who defeated host country Turkey in the championship game. Dallas' head athletic trainer Casey Smith, who also serves as the athletic trainer for the U.S.A. Men's Senior National Basketball Team, also returned home with the gold. Mavericks Director of Basketball Development Rolando Blackman served as an assistant coach for Turkey's National Team in the tournament and came away with the silver.

20,000 MANIACCS

The Mavericks have sold out **360** consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. American Airline Center's listed capacity is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a record of **293-78 (.790)** at home. Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past eight seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE – Virginia - 8 Years Head Coaching Experience

Career Regular Season Record: 386-270 (.588), 9th season

Regular Season Record with Dallas: 105-59 (.640), 3rd season

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas.

In eight seasons as a head coach, Carlisle holds a career regular season record of 386-270 (.588) and has led his team to the postseason on seven occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
