SERIES NOTES: Dallas has won four straight regular season meetings with San Antonio including five of the last six...Dirk Nowitzki shot an incredible 12-of-14 (.857) from the floor en route to a team-high 26 points in the win over San Antonio on Nov. 26...The Mavericks have taken the last three meetings in Dallas and have won five of the last seven games played at American Airlines Center...The Mavericks concluded the 2009-10 regular season with a win at home against San Antonio on 4/14/10...Dallas is 26-47 all-time on the road against San Antonio...The Mavericks have managed to win six of the last 10 meetings in San Antonio...Dirk Nowitzki averaged 28.8 points and 8.5 rebounds vs. San Antonio in 2009-10...Jason Terry averaged 15.8 points and 5.3 assists against the Spurs last season.

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Spurs forward Richard Jefferson were teammates in New Jersey for seven seasons from 2001-2008... Mavericks guard Jason Terry played with Jefferson at the University of Arizona...Kidd and Spurs forward Antonio McDyess played together in Phoenix from 1997-1998...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion and McDyess played in the same Phoenix frontcourt in 2004...Mavericks center Ian Mahinmi played for the Spurs from 2007-2010...Spurs guard Tony Parker hails from France, as do Mahinmi and Mavericks center Alexi Ajinca.

NOTABLES: Dallas opened the game on a 14-2 run and went up by 13 (23-10) with just under 3 minutes to go in the first quarter...But Miami used a 17-0 blitz from the 2:10 mark of the first quarter through the 11:02 mark of the second period to take a four-point lead (27-23) with less than a minute gone by in the second...The Mavericks shot 44.4 percent (16-of-36) from the field in the first half, while the Heat went 18-of-45 (.400) from the floor in the first 24 minutes...Miami held a 44-43 lead at the half...The Mavs used a 12-2 run beginning at the 10:53 mark of the third quarter to open up a seven-point advantage (55-48) with just over 8 minutes to go in the period, but the Heat fired back with a 13-0 run and took a 61-55 lead with 4:20 to go in the quarter...Dallas trailed by five (70-65) at the start of the fourth period but began the quarter on a 7-0 run...The Mavs went 12-of-13 (.923) from the line in fourth period and finished 24-of-28 (.857) from the stripe in the game...Dallas outrebounded Miami 48-44.

- The Mavericks, who were without their leading scorer Dirk Nowitzki (24.1 ppg), recorded a season-low 76 points in the 84-76 loss to the Raptors on 12/28 (previous low 83 vs. Chicago 11/19). The Mavericks failed to score 80 points just once in 2009-10 (80-75 loss to Atlanta on 12/5/09). Dallas is 8-4 on the season when both teams score under 100 points in a game.
- Dallas led by just one (1-0) in the game against Toronto on 12/28. It marked only the fifth time this season Dallas didn't own a double-digit lead at any point during the game (3-2 record).

- With a win over Oklahoma City on 12/27, Dallas improved to 14-3 against plus-.500 teams.
- Dallas defeated Oklahoma City 103-93 on 12/27 and improved to 16-0 when scoring at least 100 points in a game.
- The Mavericks connected on 11-of-23 (.478) 3-point attempts at Oklahoma City (12/27) and improved to 5-0 on the year when making at least 10 3-pointers in a game. The Mavs are 11-0 when they shoot at least 40 percent from deep.
- The Mavericks broke the Heat's 12-game winning streak with a win in Miami on 12/20 and have now ended six streaks of at least five consecutive wins.
- For the first time this season, all five starters (Butler, Nowitzki, Chandler, Stevenson and Kidd) scored in double figures in the win at Orlando on 12/21. The Mavs are 7-0 when at least six Mavs score 10-plus points and 13-1 when at least five players score in double figures.
- Dallas shot 50 percent (38-of-76) from the floor in the win over Orlando on 12/21. The Mavericks are 10-1 on the year when they shoot at least 50 percent from the field. What's more, not one opponent has managed to shoot 50 percent against the Mavericks this season.

The Heat were averaging 101.9 ppg and allowing just 86.7 points per contest during their 12-game winning streak. The Mavericks were the last team to defeat the Heat before their winning streak began.
- Dallas edged out Miami 98-96 on 12/20 and improved to 9-4 in games decided by five points or less.
- The Mavericks went 5-1 in their longest homestand of the season (12/7-12/17). The Mavericks' one loss during that stretch was a 103-99 decision to Milwaukee on 12/27.
- Dallas committed just nine turnovers in the win over Phoenix on 12/17. The Mavs are 12-2 on the year when they record fewer turnovers than their opponents. They are 8-1 when they commit 12 or fewer turnovers in a game.
- The Mavericks recorded a 103-97 win over Utah on 12/11 and moved to 19-4 on the year. The Mavs improved their all-time record to 1226-1225. It marked the first time that Dallas has had a record above .500 since the Mavs won their first game as a franchise, 103-92, over the Spurs in 1980.
- Shawn Marion (20) and Jason Terry (13) both scored in double figures off the Dallas bench in the win over Oklahoma City on 12/27. Dallas is 15-1 on the year when at least two of its reserves score 10-plus points.

INDIVIDUAL STATS

- **Alexis Ajinca** recorded a career-high six rebounds and a career-high two blocks to go along with three points (1-4 FGs, 1-2 FTs) in 9 minutes vs. Golden State on 12/7. He appeared in just one game (at San Antonio 11/26) and played a total of 2 minutes and 35 seconds prior to the Golden State game.
- **Jose Barea** came off the bench to dish out a career-high 13 assists in 27 minutes vs. New Jersey on 12/9. His previous high assist total in a game was 12, which he recorded vs. Toronto on 11/7/09. Barea's 13 dimes marked the most assists by any Maverick reserve since Derek Harper handed out 13 assists in 22 minutes on Feb. 27, 1987.
- **Jose Barea** recorded a game-high 19 points (7-14 FGs, 1-4 3FGs, 4-4 FTs) to go along with two assists vs. Philadelphia on 11/12. It was the first time this season he's led Dallas in scoring, and he did so just two times in 2009-10. It marked the third straight game he scored in double figures after he failed to do so in the first five games of the season. The Mavs are 7-0 on the year when Barea scores 10-plus points in a game.
- **Caron Butler** recorded a team-high 21 points (9-22 FGs, 3-5 3FGs) at Oklahoma City on 12/27. It was his fourth 20-point performance of the season and Dallas improved to 5-0 on the year when he leads the team in scoring.
- **Caron Butler** scored a team-high 20 points (8-14 FGs, 4-6 3FGs) and added four rebounds in the victory over Orlando on 12/21. It marked the second time this season he's connected on four 3-pointers in a game.
- **Brian Cardinal** tallied a season-high eight points (2-4 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) and a season-high seven rebounds in 21 minutes vs. Toronto on 12/28. It marked the third time this season he's made at least two treys in a game (2-1 record).
- **Tyson Chandler** recorded his fourth double-double of the season vs. Miami on 11/27 with 14 points (6-10 FGs, 2-4 FTs) and 17 rebounds (7 OR). The Mavs are 4-0 on the year when Chandler registers a double-double.
- **Tyson Chandler** went 7-of-7 from the floor in the game against Orlando on 12/21 and finished with 16 points (7-7 FGs, 2-3 FTs) on the night. It marked the second straight game he was perfect from the field (3-of-3 at Miami on 12/20).

- **Brendan Haywood** collected 10 boards to go with six points (2-3 FGs, 2-8 FTs) in 21 minutes vs. Phoenix on 12/17. Dallas is 3-0 on the year when Haywood pulls down at least 10 rebounds in a game.
- **Jason Kidd** recorded his fourth double-double of the season (480th career) with 10 points and 10 assists at Oklahoma City on 12/27. He added nine rebounds in the game, finishing just one board shy of a triple-double. Kidd has led the team in assists 24 times this season (19-5). Dallas is 10-2 on the year when Kidd drops at least 10 dimes. He recorded 35 games with 10-plus assists last season (30-5).
- **Jason Kidd** scored a season-high 16 points (6-8 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 1-2 FTs) to go with eight rebounds and six assists in 35 minutes vs. New Orleans on 11/15. Dallas is 9-2 on the year when Kidd scores 10-plus points.
- **Ian Mahinmi** recorded his first career double-double with 12 points (2-5 FGs, 8-10 FTs) and 10 rebounds in 21 minutes vs. Golden State (12/7). The eight made free throws set a new career-high and he tied a career-high with 21 minutes played. Prior to the game against Golden State on 12/7, he averaged 0.8 points, 0.8 rebounds and 3.3 minutes in 12 appearances on the year.
- **Shawn Marion** tallied 20 points (10-15 FGs) and nine rebounds in 32 minutes at Oklahoma City on 12/27. It marked his second 20-point performance of the season (2-0 record).
- **Shawn Marion** posted his second double-double of the season (382nd career) vs. Houston on 11/29. He finished with 14 points (5-10 FGs, 4-5 FTs) and 10 rebounds. Dallas was 6-0 when Marion recorded a double-double in 2009-10 and 2-0 in such games this season.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** did not dress vs. Toronto (12/28) due to a sprained right knee. He suffered the injury at the 9:10 mark of the second quarter at Oklahoma City on 12/27. Nowitzki, who is in his 13th season, missed just 32 career games due to injury prior to the meeting with Toronto on 12/28. It equaled the third-lowest total among active players with 10-plus years of playing experience. Trail Blazers guard Andre Miller (six) and Mavericks guard Jason Terry (25) are the only two 10-year vets who have missed fewer games than Nowitzki in their careers.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** recorded his second straight 30-point performance vs. Milwaukee on 12/13. He finished with 30 points (12-24 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) and seven rebounds in 39 minutes. The Mavs are 4-2 this season when Nowitzki drops at least 30. Nowitzki notched 30-plus points 20 times in 2009-10. Dallas was 16-4 when Nowitzki scored at least 30 last season and 7-2 when he added at least 10 boards in those games.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** registered 31 points (10-12 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 8-11 FTs) and 15 rebounds vs. Utah on 12/11. Nowitzki made his first 9-of-10 shots in the game en route to his 350th career double-double (eighth of the season). Dallas improved to 8-0 on the year when Nowitzki records at least 10 points and 10 rebounds in a game.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** recorded a season-high 42 points (13-23 FGs, 3-3 3FGs, 13-16 FTs), 12 rebounds (5 OR), one assist and two blocks vs. Detroit en route to his fifth double-double of the season (347th career). The 42 points tied a series scoring record vs. Detroit (Michael Finley had 42 vs. Detroit on 11/27/02). It was his first 40-point performance of 2010-11. He notched 40-plus points three times last season (3-0).
- **DeShawn Stevenson** tallied 12 points (3-4 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) at Oklahoma City (12/27). It marked the sixth time he's scored in double figures this season. Dallas is 12-1 on the year when Stevenson makes at least two 3-pointers in a game.
- **DeShawn Stevenson** scored a season-high 17 points (5-9 FGs, 5-7 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) and added four assists in 22 minutes vs. Utah on 12/11. All five of his field goals were 3-pointers. The most 3-point field goals he made prior to the Utah game was three (on three occasions).
- **Jason Terry** recorded 20 points (8-12 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) and added four assists in the win over Golden State on 12/7. It marked the seventh time this season he's scored 20-plus points in a game (6-1). It also marked the second straight game in which he single-handedly outscored the opposing team's bench.
- **Jason Terry** registered a game-high 18 points (8-19 FGs, 2-8 3FGs) and added six assists vs. Toronto on 12/28. It was the sixth time this season he's recorded 15-plus points and five-plus assists in a game (4-2 record).

MAVERICKS NOTES

STREAK STOPPERS

The Mavericks have ended six winning streaks that have lasted at least five games this season. They first took down the Celtics early on in the year, ending Boston's five-game winning streak on Nov. 8. The Mavs then handed the Hornets their first loss of the season on Nov. 15, after New Orleans entered the meeting with Dallas owning an 8-0 record. Dallas defeated the Thunder, ending Oklahoma City's five-game winning streak on Nov. 26. The Mavs continued their streak-busting spree by snapping San Antonio's 12-game winning streak on Nov. 26. They next put a halt to Utah's seven-game winning streak with a victory on the road on Dec. 3. The Mavs had lost five straight in Salt Lake City before taking down the Jazz on Dec. 3.

Most recently, Dallas busted the Heat's 12-game winning streak with a win in Miami on Dec. 20. The Mavericks became just the fifth team in NBA history to snap two 12-game winning streaks in a single season (also Rochester 1949, Phoenix 1990, Portland 2001, L.A. Lakers 2008). The Mavs were also the last team to defeat the Heat before they went on their 12-game run. The longest winning streak ever ended by the Mavs prior to this season lasted 11 games. They snapped two 11-game runs in franchise history, defeating the Kings on 4/14/02 and the Rockets on 4/24/93. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Dallas became the 10th team in NBA history to break six streaks of at least five consecutive wins in a season. The 1990 Phoenix Suns hold the record with eight. BEST START SINCE 2002-03

The Mavericks used a 12-game winning streak (11/20/10-12/11/10) to help propel them to their second-best start in franchise history through 25 games. With a win over Portland on Dec. 15, Dallas improved to 20-5 on the year. It marked just the second time in team history Dallas has recorded at least 19 wins through 25 games. Dallas was 22-3 after 25 games in 2002-03, marking the only time in team history that the Mavs had a better after 25 games. Dallas has had 18 wins through 25 games three times in franchise history, all coming since 2005-06. Below is a look at how Dallas has fared through 25 games since 2002-03:

RACKING UP THE ROAD WINS

The Mavericks opened the 2010-11 season with three straight road victories at L.A. Clippers (10/31), Denver (11/3) and Memphis (11/10). The last time the Mavericks opened the season with a record of 3-0 on the road was in 2002-03, when Dallas won its first 14 games of the season. Dallas suffered its first road loss of the year at New Orleans on Nov. 17, after the Mavericks handed the Hornets their first loss of the season in their previous game at Dallas on Nov. 15. Dallas went on to defeat San Antonio (11/26), Utah (12/3) and Sacramento (12/4) on the road and moved to 8-1 away from home. The Mavs snapped the Heat's 12-game winning streak with a 98-96 win at Miami on Dec. 20 and improved to 9-1 on the road. It marked the best road start through 10 games in franchise history. Dallas opened the season with a road record of 8-2 (17-2 overall) in 2002-03, marking the next best road start by the Mavs through 10 games. The Mavs beat the Magic in Orlando the next night (12/21) to improve to 10-1 away from home. With a win at Oklahoma City on Dec. 27, Dallas moved to 11-1 on the road. Dallas finished with a record of 27-14 on the road in 2009-10.

RIDING THE JET HOME

Jason Terry recorded all 19 of his points in the fourth quarter at Miami on Dec. 20 en route to a 98-96 win. It marked the second-highest scoring total he's posted in the fourth quarter of a game in his career (had 20 in the fourth vs. New Jersey on 4/12/04) and the 10th time he's tallied 15-plus points in the final period of a game. Terry was also the first player to score 19 or more points in a game, all in the fourth quarter, since Vladimir Radmanovic had 19 points with the Sonics on Dec. 7, 2002. Terry went 6-of-10 from the field, including 3-of-4 from beyond the arc, and 4-of-4 from the line in the fourth quarter against Miami. He missed his first five shots of the game (0-5 FGs, 0-2 3FGs) and was scoreless through three quarters of play. But Terry played all 12 minutes of the fourth period and finished with 19 points (6-15 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 4-4 FTs) on the night. Terry has scored 10-plus points in the fourth quarter six times this season (6-0 record).

CENTURY MARK SUCCESS

The Mavericks' defense has been a huge key to their success this season. But in order to win basketball games, you still have to score the rock. With the 103-93 victory over Oklahoma City on Dec. 27, Dallas improved to 16-0 when recording 100-plus points in a game. In the 16 wins, Dallas has shot .490 from the floor, .382 from 3-point range and .799 from the line. The Mavs have held their opponents to 94.8 points in those 16 games. The Mavs were 35-7 (.833) when they scored at least 100 points in a game last season. Only six opponents have scored 100 points against Dallas this season. Dallas is 4-2 in those games.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Rick Carlisle's club has made huge strides at the defensive end this season. In his first two seasons with Dallas (2008-09 and 2009-10), opponents averaged a combined 99.5 points per game and shot 45.6 percent against Carlisle's squad. In 2010-11, the Mavericks are allowing just 99.3 points per contest and opponents are shooting only 43.5 percent against Dallas.

The Mavericks won 12 straight games from Nov. 20-Dec. 11 and held a record of 19-4 after 23 games. It marked the ninth time in franchise history Dallas had recorded a double-digit winning streak and the seventh time the Mavs won at least 12 consecutive games. The Bucks snapped the Mavericks' 12-game winning streak with a 103-99 win at Dallas on Dec. 13. During the winning streak, the Mavericks averaged 101.3 points per game, while holding their opponents to 93.0 points per contest. The Mavericks also shot 47.5 percent from the floor during the 12-game span, while allowing their opponents to shoot just 43.4 percent from the field. The longest winning streak ever recorded by Dallas lasted 17 games (1/27/07-3/11/07). Eight of the Mavericks' nine double-digit winning streaks have come since 2001-02.

DIRTY'S FILTHY GOOD SHOOTING START IN 2010-11

Dirk Nowitzki is shooting 54.5 percent from the field this season. He's on pace to post a career-high for field goal percentage in a season and to finish above 50 percent for the second time in his career. The highest percentage he's ever shot in a season was 50.2 percent in 2006-07. That year, Nowitzki was named the league's MVP after he was the only player in the NBA to shoot 50 percent from the field, 40 percent from 3-point range and 90 percent from the foul line. Nowitzki has had 10 games in his career in which he's shot at least 80 percent from the floor (minimum 10 field goal attempts). Four of those games have come in 2010-11, including back-to-back outings vs. New Jersey (12/9) and Utah (12/11).

DIRK NAMED POW FOR SECOND TIME IN 3 WEEKS

Dirk Nowitzki was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Dec. 6-12. It marked the second time in three weeks that Nowitzki received the honor (also Nov. 22-28) and the 16th time he's garnered the award in his career. Nowitzki led the Mavericks to a perfect 3-0 week with wins over Golden State (12/7), New Jersey (12/9) and Utah (12/11). He averaged 25.7 points and 9.0 rebounds per game during that stretch, and shot .700 from the field (18-22 FGs), .667 from three-point range (6-9 3FGs) and .789 from the free throw line (15-19 FTs). Nowitzki went a combined 18-of-22 (.818) from the floor in the games against New Jersey and Utah, and recorded a double-double in each of those games. Nowitzki received his first Player of the Week Award this season for games played from Nov. 22-28. He led the Mavericks to four wins in five nights during a (4-0) week that saw them defeat Detroit, Oklahoma City, San Antonio and Miami. Nowitzki received the Player of the Week honor four times in 2009-10, marking the most times he won the award in his career.

10 BELOW

The Mavericks have held 13 of their opponents to at least 10 points below their scoring average this season (10-3 record in such games). They have accomplished this feat nine times at home. Opponents have averaged just 93.1 ppg against Dallas this season. In 2009-10, Dallas allowed 99.3 ppg, which ranked 15th in the NBA. The Mavericks have also held their opponents to just 43.5 percent shooting. In 2009-10, the Mavericks also ranked 15th in the league in opponents' field goal percentage, allowing the opposition to shoot 45.7 percent from the floor.

CHANDLER CLEANS THE GLASS

Tyson Chandler grabbed 14 of his game-high 18 boards in the third quarter vs. Minnesota on Dec. 1. It set a franchise record for the most rebounds in a quarter by a Dallas player. Popeye Jones (third quarter vs. LAC 4/6/96) and Lorenzo Williams (second quarter vs. Sacramento 2/21/96) shared the Dallas record for the most rebounds in a period prior to Chandler snatching 14 in the third against the Timberwolves. Chandler outrebounded the entire Timberwolves team 14-11 in the quarter and posted the same number of rebounds in the period as the Timberwolves (11) and the rest of the Mavericks team (3) combined. Chandler outmatched Minnesota's Kevin Love, who entered the game leading the league in rebounding with 14.9 rebounds per contest. Love finished with 15 rebounds on the night. Chandler also helped the Mavs outrebound the Timberwolves (who entered the meeting with Dallas as the top rebounding club at 46.8 rpg) 50-46 in the game en route to a 100-86 win.

CARLISLE RECORDS 400th WIN

Rick Carlisle recorded his 400th career win against Minnesota on Dec. 1. Carlisle improved to 400-274 (.593) all-time as an NBA head coach and 119-63 (.654) since taking over in Dallas in 2008-09. The win over the Timberwolves on Dec. 1 also marked the 300th win by Dallas at American Airlines Center (where the Mavs began playing their home games in 2001-02). The Mavericks moved to 300-80 (.789) all-time in games played at AAC. An 11-3 (.786) month of November helped Carlisle reach 400 wins on the first day of December in 2010. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, November 2010 was Carlisle's most successful month as a head coach since his Pacers went 12-3 (.800) in January 2004.

HOW SWEEP IT IS

When the Mavericks faced the Heat on Nov. 27, it marked the 108th time in franchise history Dallas played four games in five nights. With wins over Detroit (11/23), Oklahoma City (11/24), San Antonio (11/26) and Miami (11/27) the Mavs completed the four-game sweep (in five nights) for just the third time in team history (also did so in February 1985 and November 2006). The first three wins came as a result of fourth quarter rallies by Dallas.

SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST

The Mavericks used fourth quarter rallies to record three consecutive come-from-behind wins (all part of back-to-backs) against Detroit (11/23), Oklahoma City (11/24) and San Antonio (11/26). After the Mavs defeated San Antonio on Nov. 26, they improved to 4-1 on the year when trailing heading into the fourth quarter. The Mavs were just 10-24 when down heading into the final period last season. Dallas trailed San Antonio by two heading into the fourth period on Nov. 26, but used a 12-2 run with less than 5 minutes to go in the game to open up a 10-point lead and take down the Spurs, 103-94, on the road. In the game at Oklahoma City on Nov. 24 the Thunder led, 90-83, with 7:41 to go in regulation. The Mavericks used a 24-3 blitz to turn a seven-point deficit into a 14-point advantage (107-93) with just under 2 minutes remaining. The late burst proved to be decisive and the Mavericks went on to record a 111-103 road victory. The previous night vs. Detroit, the Mavs faced a 67-61 deficit but utilized a 14-3 run (beginning at the 8:11 mark of the fourth quarter) to take a 75-70 lead with 5:29 remaining in the game. The late surge was too much for Detroit to overcome and the Mavericks held on for a 88-84 win. In the three come-from-behind wins against Detroit, Oklahoma City and San Antonio, opponents averaged just 22.0 points and shot 38.3 percent against the Mavericks in the fourth quarter. Dallas, on the other hand, averaged 33.3 points and shot 63.8 percent from the floor in the fourth period in the three wins. Below are fourth quarter stats that reflect the Mavericks' dominance in the final period of the games on Nov. 23, Nov. 24 and Nov. 26:

SUPER SUBS

Jason Terry (5) and Shawn Marion (4) have each started multiple games for the Mavericks this season. But despite having the capability to be everyday starters on other teams, their primary roles have been to lead the attack off the Dallas bench in 2010-11. Dallas is 8-1 on the year when Terry and Marion both come off the bench to score in double figures. The two players have combined for 25-plus points off the bench on 11 occasions, including four games in which they totaled at least 30 points together. Terry has scored 20-plus points seven times in 2010-11. Marion has posted two doubles-doubles this season. Terry is averaging 15.8 points (second-highest average on the team), 4.6 assists and 1.5 steals in 32.0 minutes. Marion is averaging 10.8 points and 6.1 rebounds in 26.9 minutes per game this year.

NO. 41 POURS IN 42 OF HIS TEAM'S 88

Dirk Nowitzki poured in a season-high 42 points (13-23 FGs, 3-3 FGs, 13-16 FTs) to go with a game-high 12 rebounds, one assist and two blocks en route to his fifth double-double of the season (347th career) on Nov. 23 vs. Detroit. It was his first 40-point effort of 2010-11 and it tied a series scoring record by a Dallas player against Detroit (Michael Finley had 42 vs. Detroit on 11/27/02). Nowitzki finished with nearly half of his team's 88 points (88-84 win) in the contest. According to Elias Sports Bureau, it was only the third time in franchise history that a player scored 40 or more points in a game in which Dallas scored less than 90 points as a team. Nowitzki did it on one other occasion, in an 83-77 win at Portland on April 9, 2010. Mark Aguirre was the only other Mav to record such a feat, as he scored 42 in a 101-85 loss at Portland on Feb. 7, 1984.

MAVS STING HORNETS FOR FIRST TIME THIS SEASON

The Mavericks handed the Hornets their first loss of the season on Nov. 15. Dallas closed the game on a 21-8 run beginning at the 7:04 mark of the fourth quarter en route to a 98-95 win. New Orleans fell to 8-1 on the year, while Dallas improved to 7-2. It marked the second time in the last six years that Dallas has given a team its first loss nine games into the season. The only other time in team history the Mavericks faced an undefeated team that late in the year (at least nine games in) was in 2005-06, when the 8-0 Detroit Pistons visited American Airlines Center on 11/19/2005. Dallas entered its first matchup with the Hornets this season owning a 6-2 record, and also had a 6-2 record going into the meeting with the undefeated Pistons in 2005. Dallas smoked Detroit, 119-82, handing them their first loss of the year. Detroit went on to win 64 games that year, while Dallas finished with a record of 60-22 in the regular season. The Mavericks went on to reach the NBA Finals in 2005-06, falling to the Miami Heat in six games.

KIDD REACHES 11K ASSISTS

Jason Kidd recorded his 11,000th career assist on an alley-oop pass to Tyson Chandler at the 9:51 mark of the first quarter vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 12, 2010. It was the first of eight assists for Kidd on the night, who added 10 points and four steals in the game. He became just the second player in NBA history to reach 11,000 assists for his career. Kidd (**11,183**) ranks second all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders, trailing only John Stockton (15,806). He moved past Mark Jackson (10,334) and into second place on the all-time list with his 10,335th dish on an alley-oop pass to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 left to play in the third quarter of the game at Houston on Nov. 25, 2009.

STILL SEEING DOUBLE

Of the active players in the NBA who have tallied the most double-doubles in their careers, the Mavericks have three players that rank in the top 10. Jason Kidd (16 seasons), Dirk Nowitzki (12 seasons) and Shawn Marion (11 seasons) share a combined 39 years of NBA experience and continue to put up numbers for Dallas. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, **Kidd's 480** career double-doubles rank fourth among active players, followed by **Marion's 382** career double-doubles (fifth). **Nowitzki's 350** double-doubles rank ninth on the current list. Nowitzki and Kidd each posted double-doubles on opening night of the 2010-11 season vs. Charlotte (10/27/10). Nowitzki recorded 28 points and 13 rebounds against the Bobcats. It was the sixth time he's posted a double-double on opening night in his career but the first time he had done so since 2006-07. He recorded a double-double on opening night in five consecutive seasons from 2002-2007. Kidd finished with 12 points and 18 assists in the home opener. The 18 assists were the most he's ever dished out on opening night in his career (previous high 16 vs. L.A. Clippers 10/31/97). Nowitzki has posted eight double-doubles on the year, including most recently vs. Utah on Dec. 11, where he recorded 31 points and 15 rebounds. Kidd has recorded four double-doubles (all points-assists) and Marion has registered two double-doubles in 2010-11. Kidd ranks first among active players (third all-time) with **105** career triple-doubles.

RIDIRKULOUS STREAK

Dirk Nowitzki made 82 consecutive free throws over the course of 11 regular season games from 3/29/10-10/29/10. The 82 straight makes is the third longest streak of all-time. Nowitzki saw his streak come to an end in the second game of the 2010-11 regular season vs. Memphis on 10/29/10 (he finished 4-of-6 from the line in the game).

The streak began vs. Denver on 3/29/10 in the Mavericks' 109-93 win at home. Nowitzki finished 16-of-17 from the line against Denver en route to his second career triple-double (game-high 34 points, game-high 10 rebounds, game-high tying 10 assists). He missed his fifth free throw attempt of the contest at the 3:48 mark of the second quarter after connecting on his first four attempts. Nowitzki went on to make his next 12 free throw attempts in the game and would continue his streak from there. Michael Williams holds the record for the most consecutive free throws made with 97 (3/24/93-11/9/93).

NO KIDDING AROUND

Jason Kidd wasted no time showing why is still considered to be one of the elite point guards in the NBA today. The 16-year veteran dished out 18 assists on opening night vs. Charlotte (10/27/10). His previous high assist total on opening night was 16, which he recorded vs. the L.A. Clippers on 10/31/97 as a member of the Phoenix Suns. The 18 assists marked the most assists by a Maverick on opening night in franchise history (previous high 13, by Steve Nash recorded on 10/30/2002). It's tied for the second-most dimes on opening night in NBA history (Tim Hardaway also recorded 18 assists with Golden State vs. Denver on 11/2/1990). John Stockton holds the record for the most assists in a season opener with 19 (1/3/89 vs. Denver).

FRANCHISE PLAYER

Dirk Nowitzki entered his 13th NBA season having already shattered numerous franchise records. Nowitzki began the 2010-11 season as the Mavericks' all-time leader in points (21,111), rebounds (7,802), field goals (7,348), 3-pointers (1,131), free throws (5,284), free throw percentage (.876), starts (895), games (920) and minutes (33,732) played. He appeared in his 920th game vs. San Antonio on April 14, 2010. He passed Brad Davis (883) for the most games played by a Maverick in franchise history (vs. Phoenix 1/28). Nowitzki is just one of two active players in the NBA who leads his team in career games (Charlotte's Gerald Wallace is the other). He is also the third-longest tenured player with his original team (behind the Lakers' Kobe Bryant, 1996-97, and San Antonio's Tim Duncan, 1997-98). Nowitzki moved past Larry Bird (21,791) and into 25th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with a 3-pointer at the 11:18 mark of the fourth quarter at Orlando on Dec. 21. He currently has **21,811** career points. Gary Payton (21,813) ranks 24th on the all-time scoring list ahead of Nowitzki.

BACK-TO-BACKS

The Mavericks went 1-1 in their first back-to-back this season, winning the second game at Atlanta 98-93 on 11/20. Since losing to Chicago on 11/19, the Mavs have gone 10-1 in back-to-backs. Dallas is 5-1 in the first half of back-to-backs and 5-1 in the second half of back-to-backs this season. The Mavericks have 20 back-to-backs scheduled this year, after they played 20 in 2009-10. Dallas went 15-5 in the first game of a back-to-back and 12-8 in the second game of a back-to-back in 2009-10.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE

The Mavericks have recorded **968** consecutive games with a 3-pointer made. The streak began on 2/27/99 and is second only to the Toronto Raptors, whose streak started just one day prior to the day the Mavericks' streak began on. The next closest team to the Mavericks is the Los Angeles Lakers, whose streak began over five years later. A decade has gone by and Dallas looks to continue its consistency from long range. In 2009-10, Dallas shot 55.8-of-1,498 (.372) from behind the arc, the fifth-highest percentage in the league (behind Phoenix, Cleveland, Orlando and Golden State).

LONG STREAK OF SUCCESS

The Mavericks own the best record in the NBA from 2005-06 to 2009-10. Dallas racked up 283 total wins over the course of the past five regular seasons and went 283-127 (.690) during that span. Dirk Nowitzki averaged 25.1 ppg, 8.5 rpg, 3.0 apg in 37.1 mpg during that time. The Mavericks' Southwestern Division rival San Antonio Spurs hold the second-best won-lost record from 2005-06 through 2009-10 at 281-129 (.685) followed by Cleveland at 272-138 (.663). Dallas' 2009-10 playoff appearance marked the 10th straight season the Mavericks made the trip to the postseason. Only the Spurs (13 consecutive playoff appearances) have a longer active streak. Dallas is just the fourth franchise (since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967) to record at least 10 consecutive 50-plus win seasons. The Mavericks' streak of 10 consecutive postseason appearances is the third-longest streak of its kind. The Spurs (11 consecutive seasons) are the only other team with an active streak of at least 10 straight seasons with 50 wins or more.

TOE THE LINE

Dallas looks to continue to win close games at the charity stripe this season. In 2009-10, Dallas shot an NBA-best 81.6 percent (1,526-1,870 FTs) from the line. The Mavericks led the league in free throw percentage in 2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08 and 2009-10. Dallas is shooting 78.5 percent from the foul line this season.

THE FRENCH CONNECTION

Approximately one-third of the French players in the NBA play for the Dallas Mavericks. This year's team features three players who have all represented France in international play during their careers. Newly acquired Mavericks Alexi Ajinca (ah-lek-SEE ah-Gin-sa) and Ian Mahinmi (Yan me-HEEN-me) join Rodrigue Beaubois (rod-REEG BOH-bwah) on the Mavericks roster. No other NBA team currently features more French players on its roster. Beaubois, who was born in Pointe-à-Pitre, Guadeloupe, played three professional seasons for Cholet (France) after making his debut in 2006-07. Beaubois has participated in France's senior and junior national team program. He was chosen to represent France in the FIBA World Championship this past summer but was unable to participate due to a fractured left foot he suffered in training camp. Mahinmi, who was born and raised in Rouen, France, did travel to Istanbul this summer and averaged 4.5 points, 3.2 rebounds in 10.0 minutes at the FIBA World Championship. Ajinca, a native of Saint-Étienne, France, played for Hyeres-Toulon of the French ProA League in 2007-08 and averaged 5.0 points and 3.1 rebounds in 10.8 minutes. He also won a Bronze Medal at the Under-19 World Championship in the summer of 2007.

NEW TO BIG D

Even after yet another 50-plus (55) win season in 2009-10, Dallas was quickly looking to improve when the offseason rolled around. The first step the Mavericks took to add depth to their roster occurred when they traded to get South Florida guard Dominique Jones in the 2010 NBA Draft. Dallas acquired the draft rights to Jones, originally the 25th overall pick, from the Memphis Grizzlies in exchange for cash considerations. After re-signing center Brendan Haywood, Dallas added more length to its roster by acquiring centers Tyson Chandler and Alexis Ajinca from Charlotte in exchange for center Erick Dampier, forward Eduardo Najera, guard Matt Carroll and cash considerations. But Dallas wasn't done there. On the same day (July 13) they traded to get Chandler and Ajinca and signed rookie Dominique Jones, the Mavericks added more size by signing 6-foot-11 center Ian Mahinmi, who played 26 games with the San Antonio Spurs in 2009-10, averaging 3.9 points and 2.0 rebounds in 6.3 minutes. Six days later, the Mavericks re-signed their franchise player, Dirk Nowitzki. Steve Novak, who appeared in 54 games with the L.A. Clippers last season and averaged 2.1 points, 0.6 rebounds in 6.7 minutes, was signed in late September. Brian Cardinal, who played 29 games with Minnesota in 2009-10, was invited to training camp and secured the final roster spot heading into the 2010-11 season. The Mavericks roster currently stands at 15 players.

TYSON CHAMPION OF THE WORLD

Tyson Chandler won a Gold Medal competing for Team USA at the FIBA World Championship in Istanbul, Turkey, this past summer. In nine contests, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.7 rebounds in 8.6 minutes for Team USA, who defeated host country Turkey in the championship game. Dallas' head athletic trainer Casey Smith, who also serves as the athletic trainer for the U.S.A. Men's Senior National Basketball Team, also returned home with the gold. Mavericks Director of Basketball Development Rolando Blackman served as an assistant coach for Turkey's National Team in the tournament and came away with the silver.

20,000 MANIAACS

The Mavericks have sold out **376** consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. American Airline Center's listed capacity is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into AAC (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a record of **305-82 (.788)** at home. Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past eight seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE – Virginia – 8 Years Head Coaching Experience

Career Regular Season Record: 410-276 (.598), 9th season
Regular Season Record with Dallas: 129-65 (.665), 3rd season

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas.

In eight seasons as a head coach, Carlisle holds a career regular season record of 386-270 (.588) and has led his team to the postseason on seven occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
