SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks have won eight straight and 18 of the last 21 meetings with the 76ers...Philadelphia's last win over Dallas came at the Wells Fargo Center on 11/27/12 (Philadelphia won 100-98)...The Mavericks' eight-game winning streak against the Sixers is their second-longest active win streak against any team (Dallas has won 14 straight against the L.A. Lakers)...The Mavericks have defeated the Sixers by an average margin of 16.5 points during their eight-game winning streak against the club (12/18/12-2/1/17)...The Mavericks have taken 11 straight and 13 of the last 14 meetings in Dallas...It's their longest active home winning streak against any club...The Sixers' last road win over the Mavericks occurred on 1/29/05 (when Philadelphia defeated Dallas 93-89 at American Airlines Center)...The Mavericks have also won three straight and 11 of the last 16 showdowns in Philadelphia...Dallas leads the 2016-17 season series, 1-0, having defeated Philadelphia by 18 (113-95) at home on 2/1/17...The Mavericks swept the 2015-16 season series, 2-0, marking their third straight season sweep of the Sixers...The Mavericks set a new franchise record for largest margin of victory (53) in a 123-70 win over the Sixers at home on 11/13/14 (the previous record was 50, set at New York on 1/24/10, when the Mavericks defeated the Knicks 127-78 at Madison Square Garden)...On 2/21/16, the Mavericks beat the Sixers by 26 (129-103) – their second-largest margin of victory in a game in 2015-16 (Dallas defeated Minnesota by 27, 128-101, at American Airlines Center on 2/28/16).

CONNECTIONS: Nerlens Noel was acquired by Dallas in a trade-deadline deal that sent Justin Anderson, Andrew Bogut and a protected 2017 first-round pick to Philadelphia on 2/23/17...Noel played his first 171 career NBA games (140 starts) with the Sixers, averaging 10.2 points, 7.6 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 1.7 steals, 1.6 blocks and 28.3 minutes while shooting 50.5 percent (715-1,415 FGs) from the field...Anderson was drafted by Dallas with the 21st overall pick in the 2015 NBA Draft and averaged 5.1 points, 2.7 rebounds and 12.8 minutes in 106 games (11 starts) with the Mavericks...Mavericks big man Dwight Powell (Toronto) and Sixers guard Nik Stauskas (Mississauga) are both from Canada and have been teammates on the Canadian national team...Sixers assistant coach Jim O'Brien served as the lead assistant for the Mavericks in 2012-13.

PLAYER NOTES: Mavericks guard Seth Curry tallied a game-high 22 points (8-14 FGs, 3-7 3FGs, 3-4 FTs) to go along with three rebounds, a game-high six assists and a game-high four steals in 34 minutes. Salah Mejri posted his first double-double of the season with 16 points (7-9 FGs, 2-4 FTs), including 10 on a perfect 5-of-5 shooting in the fourth quarter, to go along with a game-high 17 rebounds (8 OR), one steal and one block in 21 minutes off the bench. Harrison Barnes had 15 points, seven boards and two steals in 32 minutes. Devin Harris recorded 14 points (3-5 FGs, 3-3 3FGs, 5-5 FTs), including 11 in the third quarter, to go along with three assists in 19 minutes off the bench. Yogi Ferrell chipped in 11 points, three rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block in 38 minutes. Sixers forward Ersan Ilyasova produced a double-double with 13 points and a team-high 10 boards in 31 minutes. Jahlil Okafor scored a team-high 16 points in 24 minutes for Philadelphia in the loss.

NOTABLES: The Sixers began the game on a 9-2 run and led 23-20 after one...The Mavericks used a 26-8 run (spanning from the 8:59 mark of the second quarter through the 1:44 mark of the period) to turn a nine-point deficit (33-24) into a nine-point advantage (50-41)...Philadelphia scored the final six points of the quarter and trailed by three (50-47) at the half...Philadelphia was within two (62-60) with just over 5 minutes remaining in the third quarter, but Dallas closed the period on a 19-9 run and took a 12-point advantage (81-69) into the fourth...The Mavericks led the entire fourth quarter and went on to win by a final score of 113-95...After being outscored 23-20 in the first quarter, the Mavericks produced 30-plus points in each of the final three frames...Dallas outscored Philadelphia 30-24 in the second period, 31-22 in the third, and 32-26 in the fourth (Dallas won each of the final three quarters)...The Mavericks outscored the Sixers 63-48 after intermission...For the game, Dallas outshot Philadelphia 46.5 percent (40-of-86) to 45.5 percent (35-of-77) from the field, 38.5 percent (10-of-26) to 27.3 percent (6-of-22) from 3-point range, and 82.1 percent (23-of-28) to 73.1 percent (19-of-26) from the foul line...The Mavericks outrebounded the Sixers, 51-39 (including 15-5 on the offensive glass)...Dallas recorded 10 steals, while Philadelphia managed five thefts...The Sixers outscored the Mavericks 52-46 in the paint and 14-11 on the fast break...Dallas outscored Philadelphia 13-6 in second-chance opportunities...The game saw three ties and six lead changes...The Mavericks led by as many as 22, while the Sixers' largest lead was nine.

SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks have won three straight, four of the last five, and 24 of the last 32 matchups with the Nets...The two teams will meet twice in a span of 10 days in 2016-17 (at Dallas on 3/10/17 and at Brooklyn on 3/19/17)...Dallas took the first meeting, 105-96, at American Airlines Center on 3/10/17...The Mavericks have now won two straight and 13 of the last 17 showdowns in Dallas (the Mavericks won 11 straight at home against the Nets from 3/13/01-12/9/10)...Prior to the Mavericks' 91-79 win at American Airlines Center last year on 1/29/16, the road team had won eight of the previous nine meetings in the series...The Mavericks have also won two straight and five of their last six road games against the Nets...Dallas swept the 2015-16 season series, 2-0...The last time the Mavericks visited Brooklyn on 12/23/15, Dirk Nowitzki passed Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with a 17-foot baseline jumper over Andrea Bargnani at the 9:51 mark of the second quarter (the basket gave him 10 points for the game and 28,597 for his career)...Nowitzki also made the game-winning layup with 19.2 seconds left in overtime in Dallas' 119-118 win over Brooklyn on 12/23/15...J.J. Barea, who assisted Nowitzki on the shot that moved him past Shaq for sixth place on the all-time scoring list, posted a career-high (game-high) 32 points (13-21 FGs, 5-8 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) to go along with a season-high (game-high) 11 assists in Dallas' 119-118 overtime win over the Nets on 12/23/15.

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Devin Harris played in 212 games (started 206) for the Nets from 2008-11, averaging 17.7 points, 6.9 assists and 1.3 steals in 34.3 minutes...In 2008-09, Harris averaged a career-high 21.3 points, 3.3 rebounds, 6.9 assists, 1.6 steals and 36.1 minutes in 69 games (all starts) en route to being named an Eastern Conference All-Star...Mavericks rookie point guard Yogi Ferrell appeared in 10 games for Brooklyn this season, averaging 5.4 points, 1.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 15.1 minutes...Ferrell also appeared in 18 games (all starts) for Brooklyn's D-League affiliate, the Long Island Nets, averaging 18.7 points, 2.9 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 1.6 steals in 35.7 minutes...Nets forward Quincy Acy appeared in six games for Dallas this season, averaging 2.2 points and 1.3 rebounds in 8.0 minutes...Jeremy Lin began his NBA career with the Mavericks' Las Vegas summer league team in 2010...Mavericks big man Nerlens Noel and Nets guard Archie Goodwin were college teammates at Kentucky in 2012-13 and both declared for the NBA Draft following their freshman seasons...Mavericks forward Dwight Powell (Toronto) and Nets forward Andrew Nicholson (Mississauga) are both from Canada and have played together on the Canadian national team...Mavericks head coach Rick Carlisle played one season with the Nets in 1989-90 before taking an assistant coaching position with the franchise...Mavericks assistant coach Darrell Armstrong played his final NBA season with the Nets in 2007-08...Mavericks scout Eduardo Najera played a season-and-a-half for the Nets from 2008-10.

PLAYER NOTES: Mavericks forward Harrison Barnes registered a team-high 22 points (10-16 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), including 13 in the third quarter, to go along with a team-high-tying nine rebounds and two assists in 40 minutes.

Dirk Nowitzki totaled 20 points, including 10 in the fourth quarter, to go along with four rebounds, two assists and one block in 32 minutes. Seth Curry had 19 points, including 10 in the fourth quarter, to go along with two steals in 34 minutes.

Nerlens Noel (12), Nicolas Brussino (11) and Devin Harris (10) all scored in double figures off the Mavericks' bench. Brussino added a team-high-tying nine boards and two steals in 23 minutes. J.J. Barea handed out a game-high 13 assists to go along with six points and two boards in 20 minutes off the pine. Wizards point guard John Wall posted a double-double with a game-high 26 points (10-20 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 4-6 FTs), including 13 in the fourth quarter, to go along with a team-high 11 assists and a game-high three steals in 36 minutes. Bradley Beal tallied 24 points (9-20 FGs, 4-12 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), including 12 in the first quarter, to go along with two rebounds and five assists in 38 minutes. Otto Porter Jr. also had a double-double with 14 points, 10 boards and five assists in 37 minutes. Bojan Bogdanovic scored 19 points (4-5 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 8-9 FTs) in 24 minutes off the Wizards' bench.

NOTABLES: The Wizards never trailed in the opening half (the score was tied once – at 2-2)...Despite never leading in the first half, the Mavericks were down only four (57-53) at the break...Washington used a 17-7 run in the third quarter to open up a 12-point advantage (74-62)...The Mavericks were down 10 (80-70) with a minute to go in the third frame, but Harrison Barnes hit a big 3-pointer with 14.9 seconds left to bring Dallas to within seven (80-73) going into the fourth...The Mavericks began the fourth quarter on a 24-7 run and went up by 10 (97-87) midway through the period...The Mavericks' run was 27-7 spanning the third and fourth quarters...Dallas held on for a 112-107 win...Dallas outscored Washington 39-27 in the final period...For the game, Dallas outshot Washington 50.6 percent (40-of-79) to 48.8 percent (40-of-82) from the field, 43.8 percent (14-of-32) to 40 percent (12-of-30) from beyond the arc and 72 percent (18-of-25) to 71.4 percent (15-of-21) from the foul line...The Wizards recorded 30 assists on 40 made field goals, while the Mavericks managed 24 assists on 40 made baskets...Washington outscored Dallas 17-2 on the fast break...The game saw only three ties and one lead change...The Wizards led by as many as 12, while the Mavericks' largest lead was 10.

PLAYER NOTES: Mavericks forward Harrison Barnes netted a team-high 18 points in 36 minutes. Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki had 17 points, seven rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 29 minutes. Toronto native Dwight Powell posted his second double-double of the season with 10 points and a team-high 10 boards in 21 minutes off the Mavericks' bench. Raptors guard DeMar DeRozan tallied a game-high 25 points (10-17 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 4-4 FTs), including 10 in the first quarter and 11 in the third, to go along with six rebounds, two assists and two steals in 32 minutes. Norman Powell had 19 points (6-8 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 5-5 FTs), five rebounds and three assists in 31 minutes. Jonas Valanciunas posted a double-double with 14 points and a game-high 12 boards in 23 minutes. Delon Wright and Patrick Patterson pitched in 11 points apiece off the Raptors' bench.

NOTABLES: Toronto used a 13-2 run in the second quarter to turn a four-point deficit (39-35) into a seven-point advantage (48-41)...The Raptors outscored the Mavericks 25-20 in the second stanza and led by four (50-46) at the half...The Mavericks were within five (69-64) with under 4 minutes to go in the third quarter, but the Raptors closed the period on a 10-2 run and took a 13-point cushion (79-66) into the fourth...Toronto held Dallas to only 12 points in the fourth quarter (Toronto outscored Dallas 21-12 in the fourth) and went on to win by a final score of 100-78...The Raptors outscored the Mavericks 75-52 in the final three quarters...For the game, the Raptors outshot the Mavericks 47.4 percent (37-of-78) to 36.5 percent (31-of-85) from the field, 36 percent (9-of-25) to 28 percent (7-of-25) from 3-point range and 94.4 percent (17-of-18) to 69.2 percent (9-of-13) from the foul line...Toronto outrebounded Dallas, 55-34...The Mavericks recorded only seven turnovers (for eight Toronto points)...The Raptors committed 14 miscues, but they also resulted in only eight points for Dallas...Toronto outscored Dallas 10-2 in transition...The game saw six ties and eight lead changes (all in the first half)...The Raptors led by as many as 23, while the Mavericks' largest lead was five.

- Dallas shot 50.6 percent (40-of-79) from the field in its 112-107 win at Washington on 3/15. The Mavericks improved to 5-1 this season when they shoot at least 50 percent from the field.
- The Mavericks recorded only seven turnovers, one shy of their season low, at Toronto on 3/13. It was their ninth game this season with seven-or-fewer miscues.
- The Mavericks are averaging 11.9 turnovers per game this season – the third-fewest in the NBA. Dallas averaged 12.8 turnovers per game in 2015-16 – the second-fewest in the league last year.
- Dallas went 33-of-36 (.917) from the foul line against Phoenix on 3/11. The Mavericks recorded new season highs for free throws made and attempted (they went 27-of-32 from the stripe vs. Portland on 2/7 – their previous highs for FTM and FTA).
- With a 100-98 loss to the Suns on 3/11, the Mavericks saw their four-game winning streak (3/3-3/10) come to an end. It matched their longest winning streak of the season (Dallas also won four straight from 1/29-2/3). It also snapped a six-game home winning streak for Dallas (Dallas won six in a row at home from 2/25-3/10).
- The Mavericks went 4-1 on their recent five-game homestand (3/3-3/11). In a stretch that saw them play 7-of-8 at home from 2/25-3/11, the Mavericks went 6-2 overall and 6-1 at home in that span.
- The Mavericks scored a season-high-tying 122 points in their (122-111) victory over the L.A. Lakers on 3/7. The Mavericks' other 122-point outing this season also came at home against the Lakers on 1/22 (Dallas defeated Los Angeles, 122-73, on 1/22).
- The Mavericks went 17-of-31 (.548) from beyond the arc in their 122-111 win over the Lakers on 3/7. It was tied for the second-most 3-pointers they've made in a game this year (18-of-48, .375, at Indiana 10/26; 17-of-32, .531, vs. Washington 1/3; 17-of-39, .436, vs. the L.A. Lakers 1/22; 17-of-31, .548, at Portland 2/3; 17-of-35, .486, vs. Orlando 2/11). The Mavericks improved to 5-1 this season when they hit 17-plus treys in a game.
- The Mavericks had a season-high-tying seven players in double figures in their 122-111 win over the L.A. Lakers on 3/7. It marked the third time this season that the Mavericks had seven players in double digits and the first since their last meeting with the Lakers on 1/22.
- All five starters scored in double figures for the Mavericks in their 122-111 victory over the L.A. Lakers on 3/7. It marked the second time in their last three games that the Mavericks had all five of their starters in double digits. The Mavericks improved to 4-0 this season when all five of their starters score 10-plus points.
- The Mavericks posted a 70-point first half against the Lakers on 3/7/17 (Dallas led 70-52 at the break). It marked the first time Dallas scored 70-plus points in the opening half of a game since 4/10/15 (73 at Denver).
- The Mavericks defeated the Magic by 32 (112-80) on 2/11. It marked Dallas' second-largest margin of victory in a game this season. The Mavericks' 49-point victory (122-73) over the L.A. Lakers on 1/22 was the only time the Mavericks had a more lopsided win this season.
- The Mavericks recorded a season-high 32 assists on 45 made field goals in their 32-point (112-80) win over the Magic on 2/11. It topped their previous high of 31 helpers, which they collected in their 25-point (107-82) victory over the Bulls on 12/3.
- The Mavericks outrebounded the Magic, 51-40, in their 112-80 win on 2/11. The 51 boards were tied for the most the Mavericks have recorded in a game this season (they also had 51 in their 113-95 win over Philadelphia on 2/1).
- Dallas defeated Washington 112-107 on 3/15. The Mavericks improved to 10-2 this season when they produce at least 110 points in a game.
- The Mavericks are 6-0 this season when they hold their opponent under 40 percent shooting and 4-1 this year when they hold their opponent to 80-or-fewer points.
- Dallas played its fourth overtime game of the season against Utah on 2/9 and won 112-105 (Dallas is now 2-2 in overtime games this year). It was also the first time the Mavericks played an overtime game since their previous meeting with the Jazz on 1/20 (Utah defeated Dallas 112-107 in OT on 1/20).
- Dallas never trailed in its 108-104 win at Portland on 2/3 (the score was tied once – for a total of 15 seconds in the 4th quarter). It was the fourth time this season that the Mavericks won a game without trailing at any juncture (also: 12/3 vs. Chicago, 12/12 vs. Denver, 12/18 vs. Sacramento).
- The Mavericks defeated the Lakers by 49 (122-73) on 1/22. The Mavericks recorded their highest point total of the season (was: 121 at Indiana 10/26), lowest opponent point total of the year (was: 75 vs. Milwaukee 11/6) and their third-largest margin of victory in a game in franchise history. The Mavericks later matched that 122-point total in their next meeting with the Lakers on 3/7 (Dallas defeated Los Angeles 122-111 on 3/7).
- The Mavericks made at least seven 3-pointers in 33 straight games from 11/19/16-1/22/17 – the longest such streak in franchise history. Dallas previously made seven-plus treys in 25 straight games spanning two seasons from 3/9-11/8/16. During the 33-game run, the Mavericks shot 37.6 percent (379-of-1,009) from deep and averaged 11.5 triples per game. The streak came to an end on 1/25/17, when the Mavericks managed only six treys in their 103-95 win over the Knicks.
- The Mavericks are 9-3 this season when they produce at least six double-figure scorers (all 12 of those games have come since 12/12 vs. Denver).
- The Mavericks are 8-0 this season when they score at least 60 points in the opening half. All eight of Dallas' 60-plus point first halves have come since 12/12.
- The Mavericks defeated the Lakers by 11 (122-111) on 3/7. Fourteen of Dallas' 29 wins this season have come by double-digit margins (the Mavericks' average margin of victory in their 29 wins this year is 11.7 points).
- The Mavericks are averaging 104.9 points per game on 47.1 percent shooting in wins this season (compared to 93.3 ppg on .421 shooting in losses). They are also holding opponents to 93.2 points per game on 44 percent shooting in wins this season (compared to 105.0 ppg on .488 shooting in losses).
- The Mavericks have used 19 different starting lineups this season. They used 11 different starting lineups through their first 14 games of the year.
- Dallas is shooting 80.6 percent (1,001-of-1,242) from the foul line this season, which is the fourth-highest free throw percentage in the league.
- The Mavericks lead the NBA in charges drawn this season with 80.

- **Harrison Barnes** registered a team-high 22 points (10-16 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), including 13 in the third quarter, to go along with a team-high-tying nine rebounds and two assists in 40 minutes at Washington on 3/15. Barnes scored 20-plus points for the 34th time this season, after he had 19 20-point efforts in his first four seasons combined with the Warriors.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** totaled 20 points, including 10 in the fourth quarter, to go along with four rebounds, two assists and one block in 32 minutes at Washington on 3/15. He scored 20-plus points for the third time in his last five games (eighth time this season).
- **Dirk Nowitzki** is averaging 19.3 points, 8.2 rebounds and 28.2 minutes per game over his last six games (3/5-3/15). He is shooting 52.9 percent (46-of-87) from the field and 14-of-30 (.467) from 3-point range in that span.
- **Seth Curry** tallied 19 points (6-10 FGs, 3-7 3FGs, 4-6 FTs), including 10 in the fourth quarter, to go along with two steals in 34 minutes at Washington on 3/15. He scored 18-plus points for the eighth time in 11 games since the All-Star break. The Mavericks improved to 12-3 this season when Curry scores 18-plus points.
- **J.J. Barea** handed out a season-high 13 assists in 20 minutes at Washington on 3/15. It was tied for the most assists he's recorded in a Dallas uniform (13 vs. New Jersey 12/9/10). It also marked just the fourth time in his career and the first since 4/11/12 at Denver (career-high 15 dimes) that Barea recorded 13-plus assists in a game.

- **Nicolas Brussino** finished one rebound shy of a double-double with career highs of 11 points (4-5 FGs, 3-4 3FGs) and nine rebounds to go along with a career-high-tying two steals in 23 minutes at Washington on 3/15. His previous high scoring game was 10 points vs. Orlando on 2/11 and his previous high rebounding effort was six at Oklahoma City on 1/26. Brussino recorded eight points (3-3 FGs, 2-2 3FGs), six boards and two steals in the second half against the Wizards on 3/15.
- **Nerlens Noel** returned to action (after missing the previous three games due to left soreness) and had 12 points, three rebounds, one assist and one block in 23 minutes at Washington on 3/15. Noel, who was appearing in his seventh game with Dallas, scored in double figures for the fourth straight game (after he failed to reach double digits in each of his previous three games with the Mavericks).
- **Devin Harris** recorded 10 points in 18 minutes at Washington on 3/15. He scored in double figures for the second time in his last three games (13th time this season).
- Toronto native **Dwight Powell** posted his second double-double of the season (fifth career) with 10 points and a team-high 10 rebounds in 21 minutes at Toronto on 3/13. He scored in double figures for the 18th time this season, but the first since 2/6 at Denver (14 points).
- **Dirk Nowitzki** posted his seventh double-double of the season (404th career) with a team-high-tying 23 points (10-14 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 2-3 FTs), including 19 in the first half (13 in the first quarter), to go along with a game-high 11 rebounds and two assists in 31 minutes vs. Phoenix on 3/11. It was his fifth double-double in his last 10 outings.
- **Nerlens Noel** appeared in his sixth game with Dallas and recorded his third double-double of the season (second with the Mavericks) with 11 points, a team-high 12 rebounds and a game-high three blocks in 23 minutes vs. the L.A. Lakers on 3/7.
- **Seth Curry** netted a team-high 22 points (10-16 FGs, 2-5 3FGs) in 30 minutes vs. Oklahoma City on 3/5. Curry scored 20-plus points for the fifth time in six games since the All-Star break. The Mavericks improved to 7-3 this season when Curry drops 20-plus points.
- **Nerlens Noel** made his first start with Dallas (eighth of the season, 141st career) and recorded his first double-double with the Mavericks (second of the season, 36th career) with 15 points, a career-high-tying (game-high) 17 rebounds, two assists, one steal and two blocks in 35 minutes against Memphis on 3/3 (his other 17-rebound effort came with the Sixers vs. Atlanta on 3/7/15). Noel had 13 points, nine boards, one assist, one steal and two blocks in the first half alone.
- **Dorian Finney-Smith** contributed 12 points (5-6 FGs, 2-3 3FGs), two rebounds and two blocks in 24 minutes vs. New Orleans on 2/25. The Mavericks improved to 6-2 this season when Finney-Smith scores in double figures and 5-0 when he scores 12-plus points.
- **Seth Curry** appeared in his 101st career game at Minnesota (2/24/17) and poured in a career-high (game-high) 31 points (13-17 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), including 13 in the third quarter, in 37 minutes. His previous high scoring game was 24 at San Antonio on 1/29/17.
- **Yogi Ferrell** posted a team-high 20 points (8-11 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), including 11 consecutive points for Dallas spanning from the end of the first quarter to the beginning of the second, to go along with two rebounds and a team-high-tying five assists in 32 minutes vs. Boston on 2/13. It was the second-highest scoring game of Ferrell's career (32 points at Portland 2/3).
- **Wesley Matthews** posted a game-high 20 points (7-10 FGs, 6-8 3FGs), including 12 on a perfect 4-of-4 3-point shooting in the first quarter, to go along with four rebounds, six assists and one steal in 25 minutes vs. Orlando on 2/11. Matthews scored 20-plus points for the fourth time in his last seven games (13th time this season).
- **Salah Mejri** pulled down a game-high 15 rebounds to go along with four points, one steal and two blocks in 19 minutes vs. Orlando on 2/11. He grabbed 15-plus boards for the second time in his career, with both of those performances coming within a span of six games (he had a career-high 17 boards vs. Philadelphia 2/1).
- **Harrison Barnes** registered a team-high 31 points (12-20 FGs, 2-3 3FGs, 5-7 FTs), including 23 after halftime (eight in overtime), to go along with four rebounds in 43 minutes in Dallas' 112-105 win over Utah on 2/9. He posted 30-plus points for the sixth time this season, after he scored 30 just once in his previous four seasons with Golden State.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** recorded his 1,200th career block at the 9:55 mark of the second quarter vs. Portland on 2/7. Nowitzki, who tallied a team-high 52 blocks in 2015-16, became the 55th player in NBA history to record 1,200-plus rejections. He also became the second player in franchise history to reach 1,200 swats. Nowitzki, who now sits at 1,208 blocks, needs 43 rejections to pass Shawn Bradley (1,250) for first place on the Mavericks' all-time blocks list.
- **Yogi Ferrell** appeared in his fourth game with Dallas (14th career) at Portland on 2/3 and poured in a career-high (game-high) 32 points (11-17 FGs, 9-11 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), including 22 in the first half, to go along with two rebounds and a team-high five assists in 39 minutes. Ferrell's 32 points were the second-most by a Mavericks rookie undrafted free agent (Marquis Daniels had 33 vs. Seattle on 4/10/04).
- **Wesley Matthews** tallied a season-high 27 points, including 18 in the first half (12 in the first quarter), to go along with six rebounds and three assists in a game-high 40 minutes at Portland on 2/3 (previous high: 26 points on four occasions). It was his seventh game with 25-plus points this year.
- **Salah Mejri** posted his first double-double of the season (fourth career) with a season-high 16 points (7-9 FGs, 2-4 FTs) to go along with a career-high 17 rebounds (career-high 8 OR), one steal and one block in 21 minutes off the bench vs. Philadelphia on 2/1/17. Mejri's previous high rebounding effort was 14 vs. Portland on 3/20/16. The 16-point outing was the second-highest scoring game of his career (17 at Oklahoma City 1/13/16). Mejri grabbed 12 of his game-high 17 rebounds in the first half, and scored 10 of his 16 points in the fourth quarter. His 12 first-half boards marked the most by any NBA reserve this season.
- **Seth Curry** posted his first double-double of the season (second career) with a game-high-tying 24 points (10-20 FGs, 4-9 3FGs), including 10 in the first quarter, to go along with a career-high (game-high-tying) 10 rebounds, five assists and one steal in 37 minutes at San Antonio on 1/29/17. Curry recorded his first career point-rebound double-double.
- **J.J. Barea** appeared in his 484th game with the Mavericks against Utah on 1/20, tying James Donaldson (484) for 10th place on the Mavericks' all-time games played list. Barea collected 10 points (5-10 FGs), five rebounds and six assists in 23 minutes against the Jazz, before the leaving the game in the fourth quarter with a left calf strain. He scored in double figures for the 12th time in his first 18 games of the season.
- **Devin Harris** appeared in his 800th career game vs. Washington (1/3) and recorded a season-high 17 points (6-11 FGs, 4-7 3FGs, 1-1 FTs) to go along with four rebounds, one assist and one steal in 17 minutes (previous high: 14 points on two occasions). Dallas was plus-19 in the 17 minutes he was on the floor.
- **Dorian Finney-Smith** registered a career-high (team-high) 17 points to go along with two rebounds, three assists and one steal in 29 minutes vs. Sacramento on 12/18 (previous high: 13 points vs. Denver 12/12). He posted a game-high plus-minus of plus-20, and led the team in scoring for the first time in his career.
- **Wesley Matthews** tallied a team-high 25 points to go along with four rebounds and two steals vs. Denver on 12/12. He scored 25-plus points for the third straight game (26 vs. Indiana 12/9, 26 at Houston 12/10, 25 vs. Denver 12/12), marking the first time in his career that he recorded three consecutive 25-point outings.
- **J.J. Barea** generated 21 points, six rebounds, five assists and one steal in a season-high 46 minutes vs. Milwaukee on 11/6. Barea, who recorded a career-high nine 20-point games in 2015-16, scored 20-plus points for the third time in Dallas' first six games of the 2016-17 season. Barea logged 46-plus minutes for just the third time in his career and the first since 4/22/12 vs. Golden State (when he played a career-high 48 minutes as a member of the Minnesota Timberwolves).
- **J.J. Barea** has played in 682 games and needs 18 for 700 in his career. Barea has also played in 488 games with the Mavericks and needs 12 for 500 with Dallas (he will tie Jason Kidd for 9th place on the Mavericks' all-time games played list when he reaches 500 games with the team).

DIRK REACHES 30,000 POINTS: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has scored **30,078** points in his illustrious career, became the sixth player in NBA history and the first international player to reach the 30,000-point plateau with a 15-foot baseline jumper over Larry Nance Jr. at the 10:58 mark of the second quarter against the L.A. Lakers on 3/7/17 (the basket gave him 20 points for the game and exactly 30,000 for his career). Nowitzki, who was assisted by Devin Harris on the play, fittingly achieved the milestone on a fadeaway. He joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (38,387), Karl Malone (36,928), Kobe Bryant (33,643), Michael Jordan (32,292) and Wilt Chamberlain (31,419) in the exclusive 30,000-point club. Nowitzki also became just the third player in league history to score 30,000 points with one franchise, joining Malone (Jazz) and Bryant (Lakers). Through 3/7/17, there had been 4,142 players who had appeared in an NBA game and Nowitzki was one of only six with 30,000-plus points. A sellout crowd of 20,484 was on hand at American Airlines Center to witness Nowitzki hit the 30,000-point mark. Prior to Nowitzki, Jordan was the only player to achieve the milestone at home. The 13-time All-Star entered the Mavericks' game against the Lakers needing 20 points for 30,000. He poured in 20 points in the game's first 13 minutes and 2 seconds – the second-fastest he has ever reached the 20-point mark (Nowitzki tallied 20 points 10:49 into a game vs. Chicago on 12/27/01, back when he was only 23 years old). Coincidentally, Nowitzki also eclipsed 20,000 career points against the Lakers back in 2009-10 (also at home on 1/13/10). Nowitzki posted 18 points in the opening quarter against Los Angeles on 3/7/17, matching the highest-scoring first quarter of his career (18 vs. Memphis 2/7/07). He finished with a game-high 25 points (9-13 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 4-4 FTs), all in the first half, to go along with 11 rebounds in just 24 minutes of action. Nowitzki posted 25-plus points in the first half of a game for the first time since 11/16/08 at New York (26 points). Last season, Nowitzki passed Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with a 17-foot baseline jumper over Andrea Bargnani at the 9:51 mark of the second quarter at Brooklyn on 12/23/15 (the basket gave him 10 points for the game and 28,597 for his career). He was assisted by J.J. Barea on the play. Through 12/23/15, there had been 4,043 players who had appeared in an NBA game and Nowitzki ranked sixth in scoring among those 4,043. The big German finished with 22 points in 37 minutes at Brooklyn (12/23/15) and made the game-winning layup with 19.2 seconds left in overtime (Dallas won 119-118). Wilt Chamberlain currently ranks fifth ahead of Nowitzki with 31,419 career points. Nowitzki, now in his 19th season with Dallas, is the NBA's top foreign-born scorer of all-time, the league's active leading scorer and the longest tenured player with one team. Bryant (20 seasons, Lakers), John Stockton (19, Jazz) and Tim Duncan (19, Spurs) are the only other players in league history that have spent their entire careers with one franchise and played 19-plus seasons. At the end of his current contract (after 2017-18), Nowitzki will have played 20 seasons with the Mavericks and join Bryant as the sole members of the NBA's 20-year, only one-team club.

BARNES' BREAKOUT: First-year Maverick Harrison Barnes is having a breakout season in 2016-17. The former seventh overall pick from the 2012 NBA Draft is averaging a career-high (team-high) 20.1 points per game in a career-high 35.9 minutes per game this season. He is shooting 47.2 percent (534-of-1,132) from the field and a career-high 85.3 percent (209-of-245) from the foul line this year. Barnes shot 76.1 percent (102-of-134) from the charity stripe in 2015-16, which was the highest free throw percentage he recorded since coming into the league in 2012-13. The highest field goal percentage Barnes has posted for a season was 48.2 percent (316-of-656) in 2014-15. Barnes has led the Mavericks (or tied for the lead) in scoring 34 times this season, after he led Golden State in scoring only six times in his 307 games with the Warriors (3 times in 2012-13 and 3 times in 2014-15). The 6-8 forward has increased his scoring average by 8.4 points from last season (he averaged 11.7 ppg with Golden State in 2015-16). In fact, he's increased his scoring average in each of his first five NBA seasons (9.2 ppg in 2012-13, 9.5 ppg in 2013-14, 10.1 ppg in 2014-15, 11.7 ppg in 2015-16, 20.1 ppg in 2016-17). Barnes has dropped 30-plus points six times in 2016-17, after he reached 30 just once in his first four seasons with Golden State. He has also posted 34 20-point games this year, after he had 19 20-point efforts in his four seasons with the Warriors (his previous most 20-point games in any one season was 6 in 2015-16). He has scored 17-plus points in 50 of his first 67 games with the Mavericks. Barnes scored in double figures in each of his first 43 games with Dallas (10/26/16-12/01/17), marking the longest double-figure scoring streak by any player to begin his tenure with the Mavericks (Geoff Huston, who scored 10-plus points in each of first 26 games with Dallas from 10/11-12/2/80, owned the previous franchise record). Prior to his run to begin the 2016-17 season, Barnes' longest streak of consecutive double-figure scoring games was 10 in 2015-16 (3/23-4/9/16). Barnes, who has played in every game for the Mavericks this season, put up big numbers for Dallas from the get-go. After scoring 30 points just once in 307 games with Golden State, Barnes tallied 30-plus points in three of his first seven games with Dallas. In just his second game with the Mavericks (first home game with Dallas), Barnes dropped a then career-high 31 points (13-23 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) in 39 minutes versus Houston on 10/28/16. It topped his previous high scoring game of 30, which he recorded at Denver on 4/16/14 (as a member of the Warriors). Just four games later, the fifth-year forward poured in a career-high 34 points (13-26 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 6-7 FTs) in the Mavericks' 86-75 overtime win over the Bucks on 11/6/16. The very next game, Barnes netted 31 points (11-18 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 8-9 FTs) in the Mavericks' 109-97 victory over the Lakers on 11/8/16. He recorded back-to-back 30-point games against the Bucks and the Lakers (34 vs. Milwaukee 11/6/16, 31 at the L.A. Lakers 11/8/16), becoming just the third Maverick to post consecutive 30-point games since the start of the 2008-09 season (Dirk Nowitzki, O.J. Mayo). The former Warrior tallied 25-plus points in three straight games from 11/6-11/9/16 (34 vs. Milwaukee 11/6/16, 31 at the L.A. Lakers 11/8/16, 25 at Golden State 11/9/16). Prior to this year, Barnes had never recorded back-to-back 25-point efforts. In fact, he scored 25-plus points just three times in his career prior to 2016-17. Barnes posted 20-plus points in five straight games from 11/6-11/16/16. Prior to 2016-17, Barnes had never had a streak of more than two consecutive 20-point efforts (he posted back-to-back 20-point games on three previous occasions). In addition to leading the team in scoring this year, Barnes has also knocked down several clutch shots for Dallas. In each of the Mavericks' first two overtime games this year, Barnes made a game-tying basket at the end of regulation to extend the game (including a game-tying 3-pointer with 2.3 seconds left in regulation in his Mavericks debut at Indiana on 10/26/16). In the Mavericks' 90-88 win over the L.A. Clippers on 12/23/16, Barnes hit the game-winning shot with 3.7 seconds left. It was his third career game-winning field goal in the final 5 seconds of the fourth quarter or overtime (previously: 4/2/15 vs. Phoenix and 1/30/16 at Philadelphia). On 2/9/17, Barnes scored eight of his team-high 31 points (12-20 FGs, 2-3 3FGs, 5-7 FTs) in overtime in Dallas' 112-105 win over the Jazz (he single-handedly outscored Utah 8-5 in OT). 20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out **631** consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch (it's **698** straight sellouts including playoffs). The Portland Trail Blazers (814 straight sellouts, 4/9/77-11/16/95) are the only team in NBA history with a longer consecutive home sellout streak (regular season and playoffs) than the Mavericks. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of **465-177 (.724)** during the regular season. Dallas has sold out all 41 home games in each of the past 14 seasons (2002-16).

CURRY HAVING CAREER YEAR WITH MAVERICKS: First-year Maverick Seth Curry, who went undrafted in the 2013 NBA Draft and played for four different teams (Memphis, Cleveland, Phoenix and Sacramento) in his first three NBA seasons from 2013-16, has found a home with Dallas. Curry is averaging 12.8 points per game in 63 games (35 starts) with the Mavericks this season, after he averaged 6.3 points per game in his first 48 career games (nine starts) with the Grizzlies, Cavaliers, Suns and Kings. The 6-2 combo guard has posted 10 20-point efforts in 2016-17 (Dallas has gone 7-3 in such games), after he had four 20-point outings prior to this year. Curry ranks fifth in the NBA in 3-point field goal percentage (.431). He poured in a career-high 31 points (13-17 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) at Minnesota on 2/24/17. Curry has made 29 straight starts since 1/12/17 (Dallas has gone 18-11 in those games). The charts below illustrate Curry's growth in 2016-17:

YOGI FERRELL NAMED WESTERN CONFERENCE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Mavericks point guard Yogi Ferrell was named Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in February. It marked the just the seventh time a Maverick achieved the honor and the first since Devin Harris in November 2004. Ferrell led all Western Conference rookies in scoring (12.0 ppg), assists (4.7 apg) and minutes (31.5 mpg) in February. He also led all first-year players in 3-pointers made (21) during the month. The undrafted guard out of Indiana originally signed a 10-day contract with the Mavericks on 1/28/17, and then a multi-year deal with the team on 2/7/17. Ferrell tied an NBA rookie record with nine made 3-pointers en route to a career-high 32 points in Dallas' 108-104 victory over Portland on 2/3/17. He scored 20-plus points twice in February and handed out five-plus assists in eight of the Mavericks' 11 games during the month.

MAVERICKS COME BACK FROM 21 DOWN IN SECOND HALF TO BEAT JAZZ: The Mavericks overcame a 21-point third-quarter deficit to beat the Jazz 112-105 in overtime on 2/9/17. It was Dallas' biggest comeback of the season (the Mavericks previously overcame a 15-point second-quarter deficit to win 105-101 at San Antonio on 1/29/17). It marked the first time the Mavericks came back to win after trailing by more than 20 points in the second half since 12/30/08 versus Minnesota. In that game, the Mavericks overcame a 29-point third-quarter deficit to beat the Timberwolves 107-100 (which is Dallas' biggest comeback in franchise history – first-half or second-half). It was also tied for the fourth-largest second-half comeback in Mavericks history (Dallas previously overcame second-half deficits of 29 in 2008, 24 in 2006, 22 in 2001 and 21 in 1995). Dallas' come-from-behind win over Utah was the second-largest second-half comeback in the NBA this season (as of 2/9/17). Memphis came back from 24 down in the third quarter to beat Golden State 128-119 in OT on 1/6/17.

YOGI FEASTS ON 3-POINT BASKETS IN WIN AT PORTLAND: Yogi Ferrell, an undrafted rookie who signed a 10-day contract with the Mavericks on 1/28/17, appeared in his fourth game with Dallas (14th career) at Portland on 2/3/17 and poured in a career-high (game-high) 32 points (11-17 FGs, 9-11 3FGs, 1-2 FTs) to go along with two rebounds and a team-high five assists in 39 minutes in the Mavericks' 108-104 win over the Trail Blazers. The 6-foot point guard out of Indiana became the first undrafted rookie in NBA history to score 30-plus points in a game in which he also led his team in assists. He also became just the third undrafted player in league history to score 30-plus points within his first 15 career NBA games, joining Connie Hawkins and Anthony Morrow (Hawkins posted 39 and 35-point efforts in his 8th and 10th career NBA games with the Phoenix Suns in 1969, while Morrow scored 37 points in his 4th career game with the Golden State Warriors in 2008). If you limit it to "undrafted rookies," then the list would only include Morrow and Ferrell (Hawkins played in the ABA before joining the NBA in 1969). Ferrell went 9-of-11 (.818) from beyond the arc against the Trail Blazers, tying the NBA rookie record for 3-pointers made in a game. Prior to Ferrell, the only rookie in NBA history (drafted or not) to hit nine treys in a game was Roddy "Boo Boo" Beaubois, who also went 9-of-11 from deep in a game with the Mavericks (at Golden State on 3/27/10). Ferrell joined 2017 All-Stars Stephen Curry, James Harden and Isaiah Thomas as one of only four players to hit nine trifectas in an NBA game this season. Ferrell's 32 points were the most by an NBA player within his first 15 games since Blake Griffin scored 44 (in his 14th career game) in 2010. The 23-year-old Ferrell became the youngest Maverick with a 20-point game since Beaubois in 2010 (40 at Golden State 3/27/10). His 32 points were also the second-most by a Mavericks rookie undrafted free agent (Marquis Daniels had 33 vs. Seattle on 4/10/04). Since 1994-95, the only Maverick rookies to score at least 30 points in a game are Ferrell, Beaubois, Daniels and Jason Kidd. Ferrell scored 22 points in the first half alone against the Trail Blazers, marking the most by any Maverick in a half this season. He also hit a huge 3-pointer with 19.3 seconds left to help the Mavericks bring home the win.



MATTHEWS COMPETES IN 2017 JBL THREE-POINT CONTEST: Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews competed in the 2017 JBL Three-Point Contest during All-Star Weekend, which took place at the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans on Saturday, Feb. 18. The event was part of State Farm® All-Star Saturday Night and was shown live on TNT. It was Matthews' second time taking part in the competition (he finished fourth in the 2015 Three-Point Contest held in Brooklyn as a member of the Portland Trail Blazers). Houston's Eric Gordon won this year's event, while Matthews failed to advance to the second round. The rest of the eight-player field included Golden State's Klay Thompson, Cleveland's Kyrie Irving, Toronto's Kyle Lowry, Portland's C.J. McCollum, Charlotte's Kemba Walker and the L.A. Lakers' Nick Young. Matthews became the ninth player in Mavericks history to take part in the competition, joining Dale Ellis (1986), Detlef Schrempf (1987, 1988), Derek Harper (1989), George McCloud (1996), Hubert Davis (1998, 2000), teammate Dirk Nowitzki (2000, 2001, 2006, 2007, 2008), Steve Nash (2001, 2002) and Jason Terry (2006, 2007). He was also the first Maverick to take part in the contest since Nowitzki in 2008. Nowitzki is the only Maverick ever to win the competition, bringing home the title in 2006 in Houston.

MAVERICKS COLLECT BIG COME-FROM-BEHIND WIN AT SAN ANTONIO: The Mavericks erased a 15-point second-quarter deficit (56-41) to win 105-101 at San Antonio on 1/29/17. The Mavericks trailed by 10 (54-49) at the half in that game, but came back to defeat the Spurs by four. It snapped the Spurs' streak of 117 straight wins in home games that they led by at least 10 points at the half. That streak, which started on 3/28/08, was the longest of its kind in recorded NBA history (halftime scores of some games from the NBA's early years are not known). It also snapped a 12-game losing streak for the Mavericks in San Antonio (it was Dallas' first regular-season win in San Antonio since 11/26/10, 103-94).

MAVERICKS CONTINUE STREAK OF DOMINANCE OVER LAKERS, SWEEP SEASON SERIES WITH L.A.: Dallas swept the 2016-17 season series with the Lakers, 4-0, winning all four games by double digits and an average margin of 21 points. The Mavericks extended their winning streak against the Lakers to 14 games (11/15/13-3/7/17). It's their longest active win streak against any team and their longest ever win streak against the Lakers. The Lakers have not defeated the Mavericks since 4/2/13 (101-81 at the STAPLES Center). The Mavericks handed the Lakers their most lopsided loss in franchise history on 1/22/17, defeating Los Angeles by 49 points (122-73) at home. The Lakers' previous two worst losses both came by 48 points, most recently, 123-75, at Utah on 3/28/16 (the Lakers also lost to the Clippers by 48, 142-94, on 3/6/14). The 49-point defeat occurred on the 11-year anniversary of Kobe Bryant's 81-point game (81 vs. Toronto 1/22/06). The Mavericks' 49-point margin of victory was their third-largest in team history (the Mavericks defeated the 76ers by 53, 123-70, at American Airlines Center on 11/13/14, and the Knicks by 50, 128-78, at Madison Square Garden on 1/24/10). It was the biggest blowout in the NBA this season (as of 1/22/17). Dallas scored its most points of the season (122) while allowing its fewest points of the year (73). The Mavericks' previous most points in a game this year was 121 in their (130-121) season-opening overtime loss at Indiana on 10/26/16, while their previous fewest points allowed in a game this season was 75 in their (86-75) overtime win over Milwaukee on 11/6/16. Dallas outscored Los Angeles 38-11 in the second quarter en route to a 34-point half-time advantage (67-33). The Mavericks were up by as many as 53 in the second half and cruised to a 49-point victory. Prior to their game against the Lakers on 1/22/17, the largest lead the Mavericks enjoyed in a game this season was 28 versus Denver on 12/12/16. In their fourth and final meeting with the Lakers in 2016-17 (at Dallas on 3/7/17), the Mavericks matched their season-high point total with a 122-111 victory over Los Angeles. Dirk Nowitzki also became the sixth member of the 30,000-point club against L.A. on 3/7/17, reaching the milestone with a 15-foot baseline jumper over Lance Nance Jr. at the 10:58 mark of the second quarter.

MATTHEWS' 3-BALL: Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews has made a team-high **156** 3-pointers this season (156-of-415, .376), the 16th-most in the NBA. Matthews ranked 10th in the league in triples made last year with 189 (189-of-525, .360). His 189 treys in 2015-16 marked the third-highest single-season total in Mavericks history (George McCloud made a franchise-record 257 3s in 1995-96 and Jose Calderon hit 191 in 2013-14). Matthews is the only NBA player with at least 125 trifectas in each of the past seven seasons (2010-17). The most triples Matthews has made in any one season was 201 in 2013-14 with Portland (201-of-511, .393). Matthews knocked down his 1,200th career 3-pointer at the 5:26 mark of the first quarter against the L.A. Lakers on 1/22/17, becoming the 53rd player in NBA history to reach the mark. Matthews achieved the milestone in his 562nd career game, becoming the fourth-fastest player to 1,200 3-pointers in NBA history (in terms of games played at the time). At the time, Stephen Curry (418), Ray Allen (548) and James Harden (561) were the only players in league history to reach 1,200 3-pointers in fewer games than Matthews. Klay Thompson reached the milestone in his 432nd career game on 1/28/17 (six days after Matthews achieved it), making Matthews now the fifth-fastest player to 1,200 treys in NBA history (and Thompson the second-fastest).

CARLISLE ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME WINS LIST: Rick Carlisle holds an all-time record of **690-509 (.575)** as a head coach and currently ranks 19th on the NBA's all-time wins list. He needs seven more wins to pass Red Holzman (696) for 18th place. Carlisle also needs 10 more wins to become the 18th coach in NBA history with 700-plus victories. He passed Mike Fratello (667) for 19th place on the NBA's all-time wins list with a 99-79 victory over Sacramento on 12/18/16 (career win No. 668). Carlisle advanced from 23rd to 20th place on the NBA's all-time wins list in 2015-16. He passed the late Flip Saunders (654) for 20th place on the all-time wins list with a 97-88 victory at Denver on 3/28/16 (career win No. 655).

CARLISLE REACHES 400 WINS WITH DALLAS: Rick Carlisle, who holds an all-time record of **409-298 (.579)** with Dallas, captured his 400th win with the Mavericks with the team's 108-104 victory at Portland on 2/3/17. He became the first coach in franchise history to reach the milestone, doing so in his 690th game with the club (Carlisle went 400-290, .580, in his first 690 games with Dallas). He coached in his 700th game with the Mavericks at Atlanta on 3/1/17. Carlisle became the winningest coach in Mavericks history with a 103-93 victory at the L.A. Lakers last year on 11/1/15, passing Don Nelson (339) with his 340th win with the franchise. It took him 561 games to become Dallas' all-time leader in wins (Carlisle went 340-221, .606, in his first 561 games with the team). Carlisle, who was hired by Dallas in May of 2008, is the third-longest tenured head coach in the league behind San Antonio's Gregg Popovich (hired in December 1996) and Miami's Erick Spoelstra (April 2008). He signed a contract extension with the Mavericks on 11/5/15.

MAVS LOCK DOWN ON DEFENSE TO BEAT BUCKS IN OVERTIME: The Mavericks clamped down on defense to grind out an 86-75 overtime win over the Bucks on 11/6/16. The 75 points allowed by the Mavericks were the fewest they have surrendered in an overtime game in franchise history (previous: 77 vs. Cleveland 1/27/98). What's more, it marked the fourth-lowest point total allowed by any team in an overtime game in NBA history (71, Charlotte vs. Indiana 1/17/15; 74, Toronto vs. San Antonio 2/7/02; 74, Toronto at New Orleans 1/15/04). Dallas locked down on defense in overtime, outscoring Milwaukee 12-1 in the extra 5-minute period. The one point allowed by the Mavericks in overtime also marked a new franchise record for the fewest points allowed in an overtime period (previous: 2 on two occasions – vs. Cleveland 1/27/98 (1st OT) and at New York 11/16/08 (1st OT)). The Bucks, who entered the meeting with Dallas riding a three-game win streak, had scored at least 117 points in three straight games (their longest such streak since 2009) prior to being held to 75 in 53 minutes against the Mavericks.

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki's name is all over the Mavericks' record books. In addition to being the franchise's all-time leading scorer, Nowitzki is also Dallas' all-time leader in games played, games started, minutes played, field goals made, 3-pointers made, free throws made, offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds and total rebounds. Nowitzki, who is now in his 19th NBA season, is the longest tenured player with one team. Nowitzki's career stats (and their rank in Mavericks history) are listed below:

NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FIELD GOALS MADE LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and 10th all-time in field goals made with **10,616**. He needs **44** baskets to pass Alex English (10,659) for ninth place on the NBA's all-time field goals made list. Nowitzki has moved up two spots (from 12th to 10th place) on the NBA's all-time field goals made list in 2016-17, with both of those advancements coming against the Portland Trail Blazers. Nowitzki passed recent retiree Kevin Garnett (10,505) for 11th place on the league's all-time field goals made list with a huge go-ahead 3-pointer at the 4:02 mark of the fourth quarter at Portland on 2/3/17 (the 3-pointer was Nowitzki's third field goal of the game and the 10,506th of his career). The 3-ball put Dallas back up 95-92 after Portland had rallied to tie the game at 92 (Dallas never relinquished the lead after that). Just four days later (on 2/7/17), Nowitzki passed John Havlicek (10,513) for 10th place on the NBA's all-time field goals made list with an 11-foot fadeaway jumper over C.J. McCollum at the 5:59 mark of the third quarter against Portland (the basket was his fourth of the game and the 10,514th of his career). The big German recorded his 10,000th career made field goal with a one-legged fadeaway over Rudy Gay at the 2:25 mark of the second quarter at Sacramento last year on 11/30/15, becoming the 13th player in NBA history to reach the milestone.

48,000-PLUS MINUTES FOR DIRK: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and seventh all-time in regular-season minutes played with **48,338**. Recent retiree Kobe Bryant ranks sixth with 48,637 career minutes. Nowitzki has advanced from 11th to seventh place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list in 2016-17. On 11/25/16, he passed recent retiree Tim Duncan (47,368) for 10th place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list in Dallas' game at Cleveland. On 1/15/17, Nowitzki passed Reggie Miller (47,619) for ninth place on the league's all-time minutes played list in the Mavericks' game versus Minnesota. On 1/29/17, the big German passed John Stockton (47,764) for eighth place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list in Dallas' game at San Antonio. Most recently, Nowitzki passed Wilt Chamberlain (47,859) for seventh place on the league's all-time minutes played list at Portland on 2/3/17. Nowitzki became the seventh player in league history to surpass 48,000 career regular-season minutes at Detroit on 2/15/17. DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FREE THROWS MADE LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki has shot **7,081-of-8,056 (.879)** from the foul line for his career and ranks seventh all-time in free throws made. "The Logo", Jerry West, ranks sixth with 7,160. Nowitzki advanced from ninth to seventh place on the all-time free throws made list in 2015-16. He passed Adrian Dantley (6,832) for eighth place on the NBA's all-time free throws made list against Memphis on 12/18/15. A month later, Nowitzki made a season-high 12 foul shots against Boston (1/18/16) en route to passing the Clippers' Paul Pierce for seventh place. The big German became the seventh player in NBA history (and the first 7-footer) with 7,000 career made free throws against San Antonio on 4/13/16. A foul shot (the first of two) at the 1:10 mark of the third quarter against the Spurs gave him two made free throws for the game and 7,000 for his career. Nowitzki is the NBA's active leader in free throws made.

Rashard Lewis ranks 13th with 1,787. Nowitzki passed former Maverick Dale Ellis (1,719) for 16th place on the all-time triples list with his fifth 3-pointer of the game (1,720th career) at Minnesota on 1/9/17. He passed Cleveland's J.R. Smith for 15th place with a 3-pointer (his 1,730th career) at the 1:43 mark of the second quarter at San Antonio on 1/29/17. NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME GAMES PLAYED LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and 10th all-time in games played with **1,381**. He needs **nine** games to pass Reggie Miller (1,389) for ninth place on the NBA's all-time games played list. Nowitzki passed recent retiree Kobe Bryant (1,346) for 11th place on the NBA's all-time games played list at New Orleans on 12/26/16. He then passed Clifford Robinson (1,380) for 10th place on the league's all-time games played list at Washington on 3/15/17. Nowitzki played in his 1,300th career game at Milwaukee on 1/8/16, becoming the 17th player in NBA history to reach the milestone. Tim Duncan (1,392), who was born in the U.S. Virgin Islands and also retired this past offseason, is the only player born outside of one of the 50 U.S. states or Washington, D.C. with more career games played than the big German.

UNDRAFTED: The 2016-17 Mavericks have gotten solid production from players who didn't hear their names called on draft night. Eleven undrafted players have appeared in at least one game for Dallas this year (**J.J. Barea, Salah Mejri, Wesley Matthews, Jonathan Gibson, Seth Curry, Nicolas Brussino, Dorian Finney-Smith, Yogi Ferrell, Quinn Cook, Manny Harris and Jarrod Uthoff**) – the most in any one season in franchise history. The previous team record was eight in 1992-93. The Mavericks started four undrafted players (**Finney-Smith, Matthews, Curry and Mejri**) alongside Harrison Barnes in their game at San Antonio on 11/21/16. It marked the first time in franchise history that Dallas started four undrafted players in a game. It was also just the third time since 1999-00 that an NBA team started four undrafted players in a game. In 2014-15, the Knicks started Langston Galloway, Alexey Shved, Lance Thomas and Lou Amundson at Toronto on 3/22/15. Before that, the last time it happened was in 1999-00 when the Magic started Darrell Armstrong, John Amaechi, Bo Outlaw and Ben Wallace vs. Milwaukee on 4/17/00. The quartet of Curry (23), Matthews (20), Mejri (8) and Finney-Smith (6) combined for 57 points against the Spurs. Of all the undrafted players that have appeared in at least one NBA game in 2016-17, the Mavericks have four (Matthews, Curry, Barea and Ferrell) that rank inside the top-10 for scoring average. Matthews (14.4 ppg) has the highest scoring average by any undrafted player this season. Matthews (Marquette) and Ferrell (Indiana) share a common connection, having both played for Tom Crean in college. Mavericks undrafted forward Jarrod Uthoff and Ferrell were also both named First Team All-Big Ten in 2016, as was Mavericks second-round draft choice A.J. Hammons.

GIBSON SCORES 26 POINTS IN SECOND CAREER NBA GAME: Jonathan Gibson, who went undrafted in 2010 out of New Mexico State, appeared in his second career NBA game at Orlando on 11/19/16 and tallied a game-high 26 points (8-16 FGs, 5-9 3FGs, 5-6 FTs) to go along with six rebounds, three assists and two steals in 32 minutes off the bench. Gibson became the first undrafted player to score at least 26 points in either his first or second career NBA game since Lloyd Daniels scored 26 for the Spurs in his second career game at Denver on 11/7/92. What's more, Gibson became just the fifth player (drafted or not) since 1995-96 to score 26-or-more points in his second career NBA game, joining former lottery picks Karl-Anthony Towns (28 in 2015), John Wall (28 in 2010), Kevin Durant (27 in 2007) and Damon Stoudamire (26 in 1995). Since 1963-64, the record for the most points scored by a player in his second career NBA game is 41 by Larry Kenon of the Spurs, who had 41 against Phoenix on 10/27/76.

HOW THE ROSTER WAS BUILT: The Mavericks had another busy offseason in 2016. The team also got younger. The Mavericks selected Purdue center A.J. Hammons with the 46th overall pick in the 2016 NBA Draft, adding the reigning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year to their squad. On 7/8/16, Dallas signed free agent forward Dorian Finney-Smith, a versatile wing who went undrafted in 2016 but started on the Mavericks' Las Vegas summer league team. On 7/8/16, the Mavericks inked big man Dwight Powell, after the former Stanford standout showed a lot of promise for Dallas in his second NBA season. On 7/9/16, Dallas signed forward Harrison Barnes, the former seventh overall pick from the 2012 NBA Draft who was a restricted free agent with Golden State. On 7/15/16, the Mavericks signed Argentine swingman Nicolas Brussino, who recently competed in the 2016 Rio Olympics. That same day (7/15/16), Dallas signed former Duke guard Seth Curry, who spent last season with Sacramento. On 7/27/16, the Mavericks re-signed 13-time All-Star Dirk Nowitzki, bringing back the franchise's all-time leading scorer. The Mavericks signed free agent point guard Yogi Ferrell to a multi-year deal on 2/7/17, after the undrafted rookie originally signed a 10-day contract with Dallas on 1/28/17. On 2/23/17, Dallas made a splash before the trade deadline by acquiring big man Nerlens Noel from Philadelphia in exchange for guard Justin Anderson, center Andrew Bogut and a protected 2017 first-round pick. Most recently, Dallas signed former Michigan guard Manny Harris and former Iowa forward Jarrod Uthoff to 10-day contracts on 3/9/17. The roster currently stands at 15 players. Nine of the 15 are in their first season with Dallas (Barnes, Brussino, Curry, Ferrell, Finney-Smith, Hammons, M. Harris, Noel and Uthoff). Two of the 15 were members of the Mavericks' 2011 NBA championship team (Nowitzki and Barea). Overall, Dallas has three players with NBA championship experience (Nowitzki, Barea and Barnes). Devin Harris was also with the Mavericks when they reached the NBA Finals in 2006. The Mavericks' roster also features five international players: Barea (Puerto Rico), Brussino (Argentina), Salah Mejri (Tunisia), Nowitzki (Germany) and Powell (Canada).

MAVERICKS 2016-17 SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN:

MAVS DEFEAT SUNS 113-108 IN MEXICO CITY: The Mavericks defeated the Suns 113-108 in Mexico City on 1/12/17. The game marked the second time Dallas played a regular-season contest outside of the U.S. or Canada in franchise history. The Mavericks faced the Rockets in Mexico City on 12/6/97, in what was the first NBA regular-season game held in Latin America (Houston won 108-106). The Mavericks and the Suns drew a crowd of 19,874 for their matchup in Mexico City Arena on 1/12/17. The game was part of NBA Global Games Mexico City 2017.

BACK-TO-BACKS: The Mavericks are 7-6 in the first half of back-to-backs and 2-11 in the second half of back-to-backs this season. Dallas has swept one back-to-back this year, split seven, and been swept in five. Dallas swept its first back-to-back of the year by winning 105-101 at San Antonio on 1/29/17 and defeating Cleveland 104-97 at home on 1/30/17 (San Antonio entered the game on 1/29/17 with a 36-10 record, while Cleveland entered the game on 1/30/17 with a mark of 32-14). The Mavericks have 15 back-to-backs this season, 11 of which came prior to the All-Star Break. Of the 15 back-to-backs, six begin at home and conclude on the road, five are road-to-home and three are road-to-road. Dallas played a home-and-home back-to-back against Brooklyn and Phoenix on 3/10/17 and 3/11/17. It was the Mavericks' first home-and-home back-to-back since January 2012 (1/13/12 vs. Milwaukee and 1/14/12 vs. Sacramento). The Mavericks played 17 back-to-backs in 2015-16, going 6-11 in the first half and 10-7 in the second half of those back-to-backs sets.

2015-16 SEASON RECAP: The Dallas Mavericks went 42-40 (.512) in 2015-16, marking their 16th straight season with at least a .500 record. Dirk Nowitzki passed Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list at Brooklyn (12/23/15). The 18-year forward also became the sixth player in NBA history to eclipse the 29,000-point plateau against Philadelphia (2/21/16). At age 37, Nowitzki averaged a team-high 18.3 points per game, leading Dallas in scoring average for the 15th time in the last 16 years. What's more, Nowitzki became the fifth player in NBA history to average at least 18 points per game at age 37 or older. Rick Carlisle became the winningest coach in Mavericks history with a 103-93 victory at the L.A. Lakers on 11/1/15, passing Don Nelson (339) with his 340th win with the franchise. Carlisle also passed the late Flip Saunders (654) for 20th place on the NBA's all-time wins list with a 97-88 victory at Denver on 3/28/16 (career win No. 655). Dallas won seven of its final nine games to clinch a playoff spot for the 15th time in the last 16 years. The Mavericks' 42 wins earned them the sixth seed in the Western Conference and a matchup with the No. 3 seed Oklahoma City Thunder in the first round. Dallas fought hard in the series despite enduring injuries to several key players. The Thunder went on to defeat the Mavericks in five games however.

HISTORY OF THE FRANCHISE: The Dallas Mavericks, now in their 37th season, have won three division titles (1987, 2007, 2010) and appeared in the postseason 21 times (including 15 times in the last 16 years). The Mavericks have made four Western Conference Finals appearances (1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). Dallas captured its first NBA championship in 2011 after defeating Miami in six games.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Rick Carlisle is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Dallas Mavericks. He was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008, and is the third-longest tenured head coach in the league behind San Antonio's Gregg Popovich (hired in December 1996) and Miami's Erick Spoelstra (April 2008). Carlisle became the winningest head coach in Mavericks history with a 103-93 victory at the L.A. Lakers on Nov. 1, 2015, passing Don Nelson (339) with his 340th win with the franchise.

Carlisle has led his team to the playoffs 12 times in his 14 seasons as a head coach. He guided the Mavericks to their first-ever world championship in 2011, while posting an impressive 16-5 mark during the 2011 postseason. Carlisle, who won a title as a player with Boston in 1986, is one of only 14 individuals to win an NBA championship as both a player and a head coach. He moved into the top 20 on the NBA's all-time wins list in 2015-16, passing Flip Saunders (654) for 20th place with career win No. 655 at Denver on March 28, 2016 (Dallas defeated Denver, 97-88).

Carlisle has led the Mavericks to the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons at the helm. Carlisle joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. He served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach in 2002, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award.

Carlisle joined Indiana as the head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.

In 1984, Carlisle began his NBA career as the only rookie to make the Boston Celtics roster. He spent three seasons in Boston and enjoyed his best year as a pro when he averaged 9.9 minutes in 77 games for the 1986 world champions. He then played one year with the New York Knicks under head coach Rick Pitino before moving on to New Jersey, where he played briefly for Fitch before being offered an assistant coaching position with the franchise.

Collegiately, Carlisle played two years at the University of Maine before transferring to the University of Virginia, where he was co-captain of the Cavaliers' 1984 Final Four team. A native of Ogdensburg, N.Y., he graduated in 1984 with a B.A. in psychology from Virginia.
