**SERIES NOTES:** Dallas has won four straight, 15 of the last 16, and 30 of the last 38 meetings with Washington...The Mavericks have not lost a season series with the Wizards since 2007-08, when they were swept by Washington, 2-0 (Dallas won 2-0 in 2008-09, tied 1-1 in 2009-10, won 2-0 in 2010-11, won 1-0 in 2011-12, won 2-0 in 2012-13, won 2-0 in 2013-14, won 2-0 in 2014-15, tied 1-1 in 2015-16, won 2-0 in 2016-17, and won 2-0 in 2017-18)...The Mavericks have taken 13 of the last 16 showdowns in Dallas...The Mavericks have won nine straight and 16 of the last 19 matchups in D.C....The Mavericks' nine-game road win streak against the Wizards is their longest active road win streak against any team and tied for their longest ever road win streak against any franchise (Dallas' other 9-game road win streaks came against Golden State from 1999-2003, against Minnesota from 2007-11, against Charlotte from 2001-11 and against Orlando from 2007-15)...Dallas has swept each of the last two season series with Washington (2-0 in 2016-17 and 2-0 in 2017-18)...Harrison Barnes averaged 25.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in the Mavericks' two wins over the Wizards last season, after he averaged 24.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists in their two wins over Washington in 2016-17...Dennis Smith Jr. averaged 19.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists, 1.5 steals and 35.5 minutes in two games (two starts) as a rookie against Washington in 2017-18...The 6-3 point guard had 22 points, eight rebounds and a team-high eight assists in 32 minutes in Dallas' 113-99 win at Washington on 11/7/17...At the time, Smith (19 years, 347 days) was the youngest player in Mavericks history to record a 20-point game (Luka Dončić posted a 26-point effort vs. Minnesota on 10/28/18, at 19 years, 234 days, and has since become the youngest)...Smith also became the second rookie in Mavericks history to post at least 20 points, eight rebounds and eight assists in a game, joining Jason Kidd (Kidd had 38 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists in a 2OT game at Houston on 4/11/95)...Dirk Nowitzki passed Derek Fisher (853) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time victories list with Dallas' 113-105 victory over Washington on 1/3/17 (career win No. 854)...Wesley Matthews hit a career-high 10 3-pointers en route to scoring a career-high-tying 36 points at Washington on 12/6/15...Matthews' 10 treys at Washington (12/6/15) tied the franchise record for most triples in a game (set by George McCloud in an overtime game vs. Phoenix on 12/16/95)...The Wizards snapped an 11-game losing streak against the Mavericks with a 114-111 victory at Dallas on 12/12/15...It was the Wizards' first win over the Mavericks since 10/27/09 (when Washington beat Dallas 102-91 at American Airlines Center to begin the 2009-10 season).

**CONNECTIONS:** Wizards head coach Scott Brooks played in 100 games for the Mavericks from 1995-96, averaging 6.0 points and 1.9 assists in 13.4 minutes per game...Scott Brooks and Mavericks head coach Rick Carlisle were teammates (and roommates) on the CBA's Albany Patroons in 1987...Mavericks assistant coach Jenny Boucek began her coaching career as an assistant with the WNBA's Washington Mystics in 1999...Rick Carlisle (1982-84) and Jenny Boucek (1992-96) both played college basketball at the University of Virginia, which is about 116 miles from Washington, D.C....Wizards assistant coach Kristi Toliver and Mavericks assistant coach Jenny Boucek are the first female coaches in the history of their respective franchises...Wizards assistant coach Tony Brown spent three seasons as an assistant with the Mavericks from 2011-14, and also spent two years as assistant under Rick Carlisle in Detroit from 2001-03...Wizards assistant coach Robert Pack appeared in 86 games (started 43) for Dallas over three-and-a-half seasons from 1997-00, and averaged 9.3 points, 4.9 assists and 1.2 steals in 23.5 minutes...Mavericks forward Dorian Finney-Smith (Portsmouth) and Wizards forward Devin Robinson (Chesterfield) are both from Virginia and went on to play two years of college ball together at the University of Florida from 2014-16...Wizards center Ian Mahinmi played two seasons with Dallas from 2010-12 and averaged 4.5 points and 3.5 rebounds in 117 games (12 starts)...Mahinmi was a member of the Mavericks' 2011 NBA championship team...Mavericks guard Devin Harris was originally drafted by Washington with the fifth overall pick in the 2004 NBA Draft, before having his draft rights traded to Dallas along with Jerry Stackhouse and Christian Laettner in exchange for Antawn Jamison...Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan and Wizards guard Austin Rivers spent the previous three-and-a-half seasons as teammates on the L.A. Clippers, where they were coached by Austin's father, Doc Rivers...Mavericks guard Dennis Smith Jr. (Fayetteville), Wizards guard John Wall (Raleigh) and Mavericks assistant coach Darrell Armstrong (Gastonia) were all born in North Carolina.

**PLAYER NOTES:** Mavericks forward Harrison Barnes posted his eighth double-double of the season with a game-high 20 points (9-16 FGs, 1-4 3FGs, 1-1 FTs), including 10 in the second quarter, to go along with a game-high-tying 10 rebounds, one steal and one block in 31 minutes. Dennis Smith Jr. recorded 17 points, three rebounds, a game-high six assists and two steals in 31 minutes. Wesley Matthews chipped in 14 points, three boards and two steals in 30 minutes. Yogi Ferrell also pitched in 14 points to go along with five rebounds, two assists and two steals in 31 minutes off the Mavericks' bench. Bradley Beal (18 points on 4-of-14 shooting) and John Wall (11 points on 4-of-15 shooting) were the only two players in double figures for Washington.

**SERIES NOTES:** Utah has won four straight and seven of the last eight regular-season meetings with Dallas...However, nine of the last 11 regular-season meetings between the two clubs have been decided by single digits...Utah has taken the last four regular-season meetings in Salt Lake City...The Mavericks are just 22-63 all-time on the road against the Jazz in the regular season...The Jazz has taken four of the last five regular-season showdowns at American Airlines Center (after the Mavericks won the previous 10 and 22 of the previous 24 in Dallas)...Utah leads the 2018-19 season series, 1-0, after it defeated Dallas 113-104 on the road on 10/28/18...Dennis Smith Jr. (career-high-tying 27 points) and former Jazzman Wesley Matthews (22) both topped 20 points for the Mavericks in the loss to the Jazz on 10/28/18, while DeAndre Jordan finished one assist shy of his first career triple-double with 12 points, a game-high 19 rebounds and a career-high nine assists...The Jazz swept the 2017-18 season series, 3-0, marking its first season sweep of the Mavericks since 1998-99 (3-0)...J.J. Barea averaged team highs of 19.0 points and 7.0 assists per game against the Jazz last season...In addition to going 3-0 against Dallas in 2017-18, the Jazz also went 3-1 against the Mavericks in 2016-17...Before that, the Mavericks had won three consecutive season series with the Jazz (4-0 in 2013-14, 3-1 in 2014-15 and 2-1 in 2015-16).

**CONNECTIONS:** Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews signed with Utah as a rookie free agent on 9/25/09 (after going undrafted in the 2009 NBA Draft) and appeared in all 82 games (started 48) for the Jazz in 2009-10, averaging 9.4 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 24.7 minutes...Mavericks guard Devin Harris played a season-and-a-half in Utah from 2011-12, and averaged 12.3 points, 5.1 assists, 1.0 steal and 28.4 minutes in 80 games (79 starts) with the franchise...Harris spent the first half of the 2010-11 season with Jazz forward Derrick Favors on the Nets...Harris and Favors were traded to Utah together (along with two first-round picks and cash considerations) in exchange for Deron Williams on 2/23/11...Jazz forward Jae Crowder played his first two-and-a-half NBA seasons with Dallas (2012-14) and averaged 4.6 points, 2.3 rebounds and 15.9 minutes in 181 games (24 starts) with the team...Jazz point guard Ricky Rubio played his first three NBA seasons alongside Mavericks point guard J.J. Barea on the Timberwolves from 2011-14...Jazz guard Donovan Mitchell and Mavericks forward Ray Spalding were college teammates at Louisville for two seasons from 2015-17...Mavericks guard/forward Ryan Broekhoff (Melbourne), Jazz guard Danté Exum (Melbourne) and Jazz forward Joe Ingles (Adelaide) all hail from Australia...Broekhoff, Exum and Ingles all attended the prestigious Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) in Canberra, and have been teammates on the Australian national team...Broekhoff teamed with Exum and Ingles at the FIBA Oceania Championship in 2013, where they helped Australia win gold by defeating New Zealand in the two-game series...Broekhoff and Ingles also played for the Boomers at the 2016 Olympics in Rio...Jazz forward Royce O'Neale is from Killeen, Texas...O'Neale (2013-15) and Jazz forward Epke Udoh (2009-10) both played collegiately at Baylor in Waco, Texas...O'Neale (2015-16) also played professionally in Germany, as did Mavericks forwards Dirk Nowitzki (1994-98) and Maxi Kleber (2009-14, 2015-17)...Jazz coaching associate DeSagana Diop played two stints with Dallas (2005-08 and 2008-09), averaging 2.4 points, 4.8 rebounds, 1.4 blocks and 17.5 minutes in 248 games (72 starts) with the club...Mavericks big man Dwight Powell and Jazz guard Alec Burks were both born on the same day (July 20, 1991)...Dwight Powell (Toronto) and Jazz guard Naz Mitrou-Long (Mississauga) are both from Canada.

**PLAYER NOTES:** Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews scored a team-high 21 points in 32 minutes. DeAndre Jordan posted his seventh double-double of the season with 10 points (4-4 FGs, 2-2 FTs) and a team-high 12 rebounds in 31 minutes. J.J. Barea recorded his second double-double of the year with 15 points and a game-high 10 assists in 25 minutes off the bench. Harrison Barnes (19), Luka Dončić (14) and Dwight Powell (12) also scored in double figures for Dallas in the loss. All five starters scored 12-plus points for the Lakers in the win, led by LeBron James' 29 points (11-19 FGs, 2-3 3FGs, 5-7 FTs). **DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME SCORING LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has scored **31,187** points in his illustrious career, currently ranks seventh on the NBA's all-time scoring list. LeBron James ranks sixth with 31,306 points and Wilt Chamberlain ranks fifth with 31,419. The big German became the sixth player in NBA history (first international player) to reach the 31,000-point plateau with a one-legged fadeaway jumper over Jerami Grant at the 7:57 mark of the second quarter against Oklahoma City on 2/28/18 (the basket gave him seven points for the game and exactly 31,000 for his career). Nowitzki, who was assisted by J.J. Barea on the play, joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (38,387), Karl Malone (36,928), Kobe Bryant (33,643), Michael Jordan (32,292) and Chamberlain (31,419) as the only players in league history to reach 31,000 career points. The 13-time All-Star also became just the third player in league history to score 31,000 points with one franchise (Malone – Jazz; Bryant – Lakers). Through 2/28/18, there had been 4,257 players who appeared in an NBA game and Nowitzki was one of only six with 31,000 points. James eclipsed both 30,000 and 31,000 career points in 2017-18, becoming the seventh player in NBA history to achieve the milestones. He joined Nowitzki as the only active members of the NBA's 30,000-point club. James passed Nowitzki for sixth place on the all-time scoring list this season. In 2016-17, Nowitzki became the sixth player in NBA history to reach the 30,000-point mark with a 15-foot baseline jumper over Larry Nance Jr. at the 10:58 mark of the second quarter against the L.A. Lakers on 3/7/17 (the basket gave him 20 points for the game and exactly 30,000 for his career).

**DIRK'S 21ST SEASON:** Dirk Nowitzki is set to begin his 21<sup>st</sup> season with the Mavericks – an NBA-record for a player to suit up for a single franchise. Kobe Bryant, who played 20 seasons for the Lakers from 1996-2016, held the previous record. Nowitzki's 21 seasons are also tied for the most by any player in league history (Vince Carter, Kevin Garnett, Robert Parish and Kevin Willis have also played 21). Former Maverick Vince Carter, who is also in his 21<sup>st</sup> season, is the only other active player with 20-or-more years of NBA experience. When Nowitzki and Carter squared off in Dallas on 10/20/17, they became just the second set of players with 20-or-more seasons of NBA experience to go head-to-head. Back in 2015-16, Garnett (in his 21<sup>st</sup> season) and Bryant (20<sup>th</sup>) faced each other twice during the Timberwolves-Lakers season series. Nowitzki played in 77 of Dallas' first 78 games in 2017-18 (all starts). His 77 games last year marked the most by a player in his 20<sup>th</sup> season in NBA history (previous most: 74 – by Robert Parish with Charlotte in 1995-96 and by Kareem Abdul-Jabbar with the Lakers in 1988-89).

**DJ'S DOUBLE-DIGIT REBOUNDING STREAK TO BEGIN THE SEASON:** Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan has recorded at least 10 boards in each of Dallas' first nine games this season (10/17-11/2/18) – a franchise-record streak to begin the year. The previous team record for consecutive 10-rebound games to begin a season was six, shared by Roy Tarpley (1989-90) and A.C. Green (1997-98). Jordan has led Dallas in rebounding in all nine games in 2018-19. He's averaging 14.3 boards per game this season, which ranks third in the NBA.

**NO. 77 WITH THIRD-MOST POINTS BY A TEENAGER THROUGH 7 CAREER GAMES:** After tallying a team-high 26 points in his second career game versus Minnesota on 10/20/18, Luka Dončić posted 21 points in his fourth career game at Atlanta on 10/24/18, a game-high 22 points in his fifth career contest at Toronto on 10/26/18, and a career-high (team-high) 31 points in his seventh career game at San Antonio on 10/29/18. The 19-year-old Slovenian totaled 143 points through his first seven career games (10/17-10/29/18), marking the third-most points by a teenager through his first seven career contests in NBA history. The only teenagers to score more through seven games were: Kevin Durant (152) and Dajuan Wagner (151). Dončić joined Durant, Wagner and Jahliil Okafor (4 each) as the only teenagers in league history to score 20-plus points four times in their first seven career games. He also became the first Maverick ever to top 20 points in four of his first seven career games (Jamal Mashburn had three 20-point efforts through his first seven games in 1993-94, the previous most in franchise history). Through his first seven career contests (all starts), Dončić averaged 20.4 points, 6.4 rebounds and 4.0 assists in 35.7 minutes per game.

**DONČIĆ GOES FOR 31-8-4 IN HIS SEVENTH CAREER GAME:** In his seventh career game, Mavericks guard/forward Luka Dončić poured in a career-high (team-high) 31 points (11-18 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 5-6 FTs), including 24 after halftime, to go along with eight rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 40 minutes in an overtime loss to San Antonio on 10/29/18. Dončić joined Wilt Chamberlain, Oscar Robertson, Michael Jordan and Maurice Stokes as one of only five players in NBA history to post a 30-point, eight-rebound, four-assist effort within their first seven career games. The 6-7 Slovenian (19 years, 243 days) also became just the fifth teenager in NBA history to go for 30-8-4, joining LeBron James, Kevin Durant, Kevin Garnett and Andrew Wiggins. James and Durant were the only players to achieve that stat line at a younger age than the former EuroLeague MVP. What's more, Dončić became the first teenager in league history to post a 30-8-4 line less than 17 games into his NBA career. James, who had 33 points, 16 rebounds and seven assists against Memphis on 11/29/03 (in his 17<sup>th</sup> career game), was the teenager who previously did it the fastest (in terms of games played). Dončić also became the fourth Mavericks rookie to go for 30-8-4 in a game, joining Jay Vincent, Jason Kidd and Marquis Daniels – who were all 22-or-older when they did it. In fact, he became the youngest player in franchise history with a 30-point effort. The

previous youngest was Jamal Mashburn (20 years, 348 days), who had a 36-point outing in his fourth career game at Minnesota on 11/12/93. Mashburn was also the only other Maverick to score 30 within his first seven career games.

**DJ'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE STREAK TO BEGIN THE SEASON:** Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan posted a double-double in each of Dallas' first six games in 2018-19 – a franchise-record streak to begin the season. Roy Tarpley, who recorded a double-double in each of the Mavericks' first four games in 1990-91, held the previous team record. Jordan had his double-double streak snapped at San Antonio (10/29/18) when he finished with eight points and 19 rebounds in 41 minutes. Through his first six games with the Mavericks (10/17-10/28/18), Jordan averaged 15.3 points, 14.7 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.8 blocks in 33.2 minutes per game. He shot 64.7 percent (33-of-51) from the field and 86.7 percent (26-of-30) from the free-throw line in that span. Jordan came up one assist shy of his first career triple-double against Utah (10/28/18) when he totaled 12 points, 19 rebounds and a career-high (game-high) nine assists in 37 minutes.

**DONČIĆ BECOMES YOUNGEST MAVERICK TO RECORD A 20-POINT GAME:** Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić tallied a team-high 26 points, including 15 in the second quarter, to go along with six rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in 36 minutes versus Minnesota on 10/20/18. Dončić (19 years, 234 days) became the youngest player in Mavericks history to record a 20-point game. The previous youngest was Dončić's teammate, Dennis Smith Jr., who had 22 points at Washington (11/7/17) last season at 19 years, 347 days old. Before Smith, Dončić's other teammate, Dirk Nowitzki (29 points at Phoenix 4/16/99; at 20 years, 301 days), was the youngest Maverick ever to produce a 20-point outing.

**LUKA'S ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić is averaging a team-high 19.4 points, 6.6 rebounds (2<sup>nd</sup> on team), 4.6 assists (2<sup>nd</sup> on team), 0.9 steals and a team-high 34.8 minutes per game this season. He is shooting 46.7 percent (63-of-135) from the field and 39.3 percent (24-of-61) from 3-point range. Among all rookies in 2018-19, he ranks first in scoring, fourth in rebounding, second in assists, tied for fifth in steals, first in minutes, 10<sup>th</sup> in field goal percentage and sixth in 3-point field goal percentage.

**RAINING THREES:** The Mavericks have hit at least five 3-pointers in a franchise-record 191 consecutive games (3/9/16-11/2/18). The previous team record was 56 straight games with five-plus triples from 4/10/15-2/3/16. They've hit at least 10 triples in eight of their first nine games in 2018-19 (and nine-plus treys in all nine). Just two games into the 2018-19 season, Dallas set a new franchise record for most 3-point field goal attempts with 50 in the home opener against Minnesota on 10/20/18 (17-of-50, .340). The previous team-record was 49 vs. New Jersey (18-of-49, .367) on 3/5/96. Dallas went 967-of-2,688 (.360) from deep in 2017-18, setting new club records for 3-pointers made and attempted in a season (the Mavericks went 878-of-2,473, .355, from long range in 2016-17, which was the previous most triples made and attempted by the franchise in a season). Dallas ranked fifth in total made threes (967), fifth in 3-pointers made per game (11.8), fourth in 3-pointers attempted per game (32.8) and 17<sup>th</sup> in 3-point field goal percentage (.360) last year. The Mavericks made 19-or-more trifectas five times in 2017-18 (19-of-40, .475, vs. Philadelphia 10/28/17; 19-of-38, .500, vs. Milwaukee 11/18/17; 22-of-39, .564, at New Orleans 12/29/17; 19-of-42, .452, vs. Golden State 1/3/18; 19-of-42, .452, at L.A. Lakers 2/23/18), after they did so just once in the team's previous 37 seasons (19-of-41, .463, at Orlando 2/19/16 (OT)). It was tied for the second-most games with 19-plus treys in the NBA last season (Brooklyn also had five games with 19-plus 3-pointers and Houston recorded a league-high 13 in 2017-18). Dallas went 22-of-39 (.564) from beyond the arc at New Orleans on 12/29/17, setting a new franchise record for 3-pointers made in a game. Prior to their 3-point barrage at New Orleans on 12/29/17, the most triples the Mavericks made in any game (regular season or postseason) was 20 in their series-clinching playoff win over the L.A. Lakers on 5/8/11 (20-of-32, .625). Before the 2017-18 season, Dallas had never made 19 treys in a regular-season game that was decided in regulation.

**DONČIĆ BECOMES SECOND-YOUNGEST PLAYER IN MAVS HISTORY:** Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić made his NBA debut for Dallas at 19 years, 231 days old, and recorded 10 points, eight rebounds and four assists in 32 minutes at Phoenix on 10/17/18. Dončić became the second-youngest player ever to appear in a game for the Mavericks, behind only Bruno Sundov (19 years, 70 days). Second-year point guard Dennis Smith Jr., who debuted for Dallas at 19 years, 327 days, is the third-youngest Maverick ever to play in a game for the franchise. When Dončić made his NBA debut, he was exactly one year younger than when teammate Dirk Nowitzki (20 years, 231 days) played in his first NBA game.

**HOW THE ROSTER WAS BUILT:** Dallas had another busy offseason in 2018. The Mavericks entered the night of the 2018 NBA Draft with the fifth overall pick, their highest selection since 1994 when they used the No. 2 overall pick to draft Jason Kidd. Once the draft was underway, Dallas made a big splash by acquiring the draft rights to the third overall pick and reigning EuroLeague MVP Luka Dončić from Atlanta in exchange for the draft rights to fifth overall pick Trae Young and a protected 2019 first-round pick. The Mavericks used the 33<sup>rd</sup> overall selection in the draft to take the 2018 Consensus National College Player of the Year, Jalen Brunson, who was fresh off of leading Villanova to its second national championship in a span of three years. Dallas wasn't done making moves on draft night though, and acquired the draft rights to the 56<sup>th</sup> overall pick Ray Spalding and the 60<sup>th</sup> overall pick Kostas Antetokounmpo from Philadelphia in exchange for the draft rights to 54<sup>th</sup> overall selection Shake Milton. Once free agency began, the Mavericks signed center DeAndre Jordan, the NBA's career leader in field goal percentage, on 7/6/18. During the month of July, Dallas also signed all four of the players it acquired in the 2018 NBA Draft (Dončić, Brunson, Spalding and Antetokounmpo). The Mavericks made Antetokounmpo one of their two two-way players. On 7/23/18, Dallas re-signed 13-time All-Star Dirk Nowitzki, bringing back the franchise's greatest player for his 21<sup>st</sup> season – an NBA-record for a player to suit up with a single franchise. On 7/30/18, the Mavericks signed former Arkansas guard Daryl Macon, who went undrafted in 2018, to a two-way deal. On 8/3/18, the Mavericks re-signed center Salah Mejri, who led the team in both field goal percentage and blocked shots in each of the last two seasons. On 8/6/18, Dallas signed Australian guard/forward Ryan Broekhoff. On 8/8/18, Dallas signed Devin Harris, bringing the guard back for his third stint with the team. The Mavericks' roster currently stands at 17 players. Seven of the 17 are in their first season with Dallas (Antetokounmpo, Broekhoff, Brunson, Dončić, Jordan, Macon and Spalding). Two were members of the Mavericks' 2011 NBA championship team (Nowitzki and Barea). Overall, Dallas has three players with NBA championship experience (Nowitzki, Barea and Barnes). Harris was also with the Mavericks when they reached the NBA Finals in 2006.

**INTERNATIONAL MAVS:** The Mavericks' roster features eight international players born in seven different countries or territories: Kostas Antetokounmpo (Greece), J.J. Barea (Puerto Rico), Ryan Broekhoff (Australia), Luka Dončić (Slovenia), Dirk Nowitzki and Maxi Kleber (Germany), Salah Mejri (Tunisia) and Dwight Powell (Canada). Dallas had a league-high seven international players on its opening-night roster (eight if you count Antetokounmpo, who was excluded because he has a two-way contract and began the season on the Mavericks-affiliate Texas Legends roster).

**ROSTER BROKEN DOWN BY DRAFT POSITION:** The Mavericks' 17-man roster features five former first-round picks, five former second-round draft choices and seven undrafted players. Fourteen undrafted players appeared in at least one regular-season game for Dallas in 2017-18 (J.J. Barea, Gian Clavell, Antonius Cleveland, Kyle Collinsworth, Yogi Ferrell, Dorian Finney-Smith, Aaron Harrison, Scotty Hopson, Jalen Jones, Maxi Kleber, Wesley Matthews, Salah Mejri, Johnathan Motley and Jameel Warney) – the most in any one season in franchise history. The previous team record was 11, set the season prior (before 2016-17, the franchise record was eight in 1992-93). The 2018-19 Mavericks roster broken down by draft position is shown below:

**MAVERICKS ACQUIRE DRAFT RIGHTS TO THIRD OVERALL PICK LUKA DONČIĆ:** The Mavericks entered the night of the 2018 NBA Draft with the fifth overall pick, their highest selection since 1994 when they used the No. 2 overall pick to draft Jason Kidd. Once the draft got underway, Dallas made a big splash by acquiring the draft rights to the third overall pick Luka Dončić from Atlanta in exchange for the draft rights to fifth overall pick Trae Young and a protected 2019 first-round pick. The 19-year-old guard/forward was fresh off of leading Real Madrid to the 2018 EuroLeague title while becoming the youngest player ever to earn EuroLeague and EuroLeague Final Four MVP honors. He also became the youngest player ever to be named ACB Most Valuable Player after leading Real to its third ACB championship in four years. What's more, Dončić earned EuroLeague Rising Star and ACB Best Young Player accolades for his second straight season. He joined Nikola Mirotić and Bogdan Bogdanović as the only repeat winners of the EuroLeague Rising Star Award. In 33 EuroLeague games for Real in 2017-18, the versatile Slovenian averaged 16.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 3.9 assists in 25.9 minutes. In 28 Spanish ACB games last year, he averaged 12.8 points, 5.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists in 24.0 minutes.

**DEANDRE ATOP THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FG% LIST:** Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan is the NBA's all-time leader in career field goal percentage (.672). Jordan is the only player in league history with multiple seasons shooting 70-plus percent from the floor. His 71.4 percent (412-577 FGs) mark in 2016-17, 71.0 percent (379-534 FGs) clip in 2014-15 and 70.3 percent (357-508 FGs) split in 2015-16 are the second, third and fourth-highest single-season field goal percentages in NBA history. Wilt Chamberlain, who shot 72.7 percent (426-586 FGs) from the floor for the Lakers in 1972-73, is the only player in league history to post a higher single-season mark. The Texas A&M product led the NBA in field goal percentage in five consecutive seasons from 2012-17, joining Chamberlain (1964-69) and Shaquille O'Neal (1997-02) as the only players in league history to lead the NBA in the category at least five years in a row (Jordan saw his run of five straight seasons atop the league in field goal percentage come to an end in 2017-18 when he shot .645 from the floor, narrowly finishing second behind Clint Capela's .652 mark).

**MATTHEWS' 3-BALL:** Despite missing the final 16 games of the season due to a right proximal fibula fracture, Mavericks swingman Wesley Matthews still knocked down a team-high 153 3-pointers (153-of-402, .381) in 2017-18. He led Dallas in trifectas for the third straight year (it was his third season with the team). What's more, Matthews became the only NBA player with at least 125 triples in each of the last eight seasons (2010-18). It's the second-longest streak of consecutive seasons with 125-plus treys in NBA history (Ray Allen hit 125-plus 3-pointers in 12 straight seasons from 1999-00 to 2010-11). The undrafted guard out of Marquette knocked down his 1,400<sup>th</sup> career 3-pointer in the final minute of the game versus Indiana on 2/26/18. He reached the milestone in his 652<sup>nd</sup> career contest, becoming the sixth-fastest player to 1,400 3-pointers in NBA history (in terms of games played). Stephen Curry (459) achieved the milestone in the fewest number of games, followed by Klay Thompson (485), James Harden (620), Ray Allen (629), Peja Stojakovic (640) and Matthews (652). Matthews also became the first undrafted player in league history (31<sup>st</sup> player overall) to reach 1,400 career triples.

**DJ'S RECENT DUNK AND REBOUNDING FINISHES:** DeAndre Jordan has finished in the top 3 in the league in dunks in each of the last eight seasons (2010-18) and in the top 3 in rebounds per game in each of the last five (2013-18). Jordan led the NBA in dunks in four consecutive seasons from 2013-17, before finishing one shy of the league lead in 2017-18 (C. Capela, 2017-18 – 213; D. Jordan, 2017-18 – 212). He averaged a career-high 15.2 boards per contest last season, finishing second in the league behind Andre Drummond's 16.0 rpg.

**CARLISLE ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME WINS LIST:** Rick Carlisle, who holds an all-time record of **720-585 (.552)** as a head coach, moved into 17<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time wins list in 2017-18. Carlisle recorded his 700<sup>th</sup> career win with Dallas' 108-82 victory over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/17, becoming the 18<sup>th</sup> coach in NBA history to reach the plateau. He joined San Antonio's Gregg Popovich and the Clippers' Doc Rivers as the only active coaches with 700 victories. By defeating Rivers' Clippers for career win No. 700, Carlisle became the first coach to reach the milestone against a fellow 700-win coach. Carlisle reached the mark in his 1,237<sup>th</sup> game as a head coach and his 745<sup>th</sup> game with the Mavericks (he went 700-537, .566, in his first 1,237 games overall, and 419-326, .562, in his first 745 games with Dallas). He passed Red Holzman (696) for 18<sup>th</sup> place on the league's all-time wins list with Dallas' 111-79 victory over Milwaukee on 11/18/17. Most recently, Carlisle passed John MacLeod (707) for 17<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time victories list with the Mavericks' 114-99 win over the Magic on 1/9/18. Gene Shue ranks 16<sup>th</sup> ahead of Carlisle with 784 wins.

**NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FIELD GOALS MADE LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks eighth all-time in field goals made with **11,034**. Shaquille O'Neal ranks seventh ahead of Nowitzki with 11,330. Nowitzki passed Hakeem Olajuwon (10,749) and Elvin Hayes (10,976) on the league's all-time field goals made list in 2017-18. The big German moved ahead of Olajuwon with a 20-foot jumper at the 11:45 mark of the second quarter against Minnesota on 11/17/17 (career field goal No. 10,750), becoming the league's all-time leader in field goals made by an international player. He passed Hayes for eighth place with a hook shot at the 8:56 mark of the second quarter against New Orleans on 3/4/18 (career field goal No. 10,977). Nowitzki recorded his 11,000<sup>th</sup> career field goal with a 19-foot jumper at the 9:11 mark of the second quarter at Toronto on 3/16/18, becoming the eighth player in NBA history to reach the milestone.

**DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FREE THROWS MADE LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has shot **7,201-of-8,189 (.879)** from the foul line for his career, ranks first among active players and sixth all-time in free throws made. Michael Jordan ranks fifth with 7,327 career made free throws. Nowitzki has gone 7-of-7 or better from the line in 178 regular-season games, by far, the most such games in NBA history (he had one such game in 2017-18 – a 7-of-7 night vs. Orlando on 1/9/18). Reggie Miller ranks second with 149 such games. During the 2015-16 season, the big German became the seventh player in NBA history (and the first 7-footer) to reach 7,000 career made free throws against San Antonio on 4/13/16. In 2017-18, he passed former Laker great Jerry West (7,160<sup>th</sup>) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time free throws made list with his first free throw of the game (7,161<sup>st</sup> career) at the 7:51 mark of the second quarter against the Lakers on 1/13/18.

**DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME TRIPLES LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks 12<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time 3-point field goals made list with **1,918** career triples. J.R. Smith ranks 11<sup>th</sup> with 1,923 career treys and Joe Johnson ranks 10<sup>th</sup> with 1,978. At age 39, Nowitzki went 138-of-337 (.409) from beyond the arc in 2017-18. It was the fourth-most trifectas Nowitzki made in any one season in his career and the fourth-highest 3-point field goal percentage he recorded in any one year. What's more, it marked the most 3-pointers by a player age 39-or-older in NBA history. Jason Kidd, who went 114-of-325 (.351) from deep with New York in 2012-13 (at age 39), held the previous such record. In fact, Kidd (114 in 2012-13) and Vince Carter (112-of-296, .378, with Memphis at age 40 in 2016-17) are the only players in league history to record at least 100 trifectas in a season at age 39-or-older. The 2017-18 campaign was Nowitzki's ninth season with 100-or-more treys (including his fourth in the last five years). He advanced from 14<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> place on the league's all-time triples list in 2017-18. Nowitzki passed Rashard Lewis (1,787) against Philadelphia on 10/28/17, Kobe Bryant (1,827) against Phoenix on 12/18/17 and Chauncey Billups (1,830) at Miami on 12/22/17. He also leapfrogged Cleveland's J.R. Smith at Chicago on 3/2/18. Nowitzki knocked down his 1,900<sup>th</sup> career 3-pointer at the 10:34 mark of the third quarter versus Houston on 3/11/18 (he was assisted by Dennis Smith Jr. on the play). He became the 11<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to achieve the milestone. He also became the first international player and the first 7-footer to reach the mark.

**NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME GAMES PLAYED LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and fifth all-time in NBA regular-season games played with **1,471**. He needs five more games to tie Karl Malone (1,476) for fourth place on the league's all-time games played list. John Stockton ranks third with 1,504. Stockton, who spent his entire 19-year career with the Jazz, is the only player to appear in more games with a single team than Nowitzki. Nowitzki advanced from seventh to fifth place on the all-time games played list in 2017-18. He became the seventh player in league history to reach 1,400 career games at Memphis on 10/26/17. The big German passed Kevin Willis (1,424) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time games played list against Phoenix on 12/18/17. On 3/17/18 at Brooklyn, he passed Kevin Garnett (1,462) for fifth place on the league's all-time games played list. Nowitzki played in 77 of Dallas' first 78 games in 2017-18. **50,000-PLUS MINUTES FOR DIRK:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and third all-time in regular-season minutes played with **50,573**. Karl Malone ranks second with 54,852 minutes. Nowitzki logged 1,900 minutes in 2017-18 – the most by a player in his 20<sup>th</sup> season in NBA history (previous most: 1,863 by former Laker Kobe Bryant in 2015-16). He became the sixth player in league history to reach 50,000 career minutes at the L.A. Clippers on 2/5/18. He also passed Elvin Hayes (50,000) for fifth place on the league's all-time minutes played list at the L.A. Clippers on 2/5/18. On 2/23/18 at the L.A. Lakers, Nowitzki passed former Maverick Jason Kidd (50,111) for the fourth place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list. On 3/22/18 versus Utah, he passed Kevin Garnett (50,418) for third place. In addition to the 50,000-plus minutes he has played in the regular season, Nowitzki has also logged 5,895 minutes in his 145 career postseason games.

**DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME REBOUNDING LIST:** Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has grabbed **11,331** rebounds in his career, currently ranks 27<sup>th</sup> on the NBA's all-time rebounding list. Elgin Baylor ranks 26<sup>th</sup> ahead of Nowitzki with 11,463 career boards. Nowitzki passed Jack Sikma (10,816) for 29<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time rebounding list with his first board of the game (10,817<sup>th</sup> career) at the 10:48 mark of the first quarter at Brooklyn on 3/19/17. He collected his 11,000<sup>th</sup> career rebound at the 8:52 mark of the first quarter at Memphis on 11/22/17, becoming the 29<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to reach the milestone. The big German passed Bill Bridges (11,054) on the league's all-time rebounding list with his sixth board of the game (11,055<sup>th</sup> career) at the 8:42 mark of the second quarter at Golden State on 12/14/17. Most recently, he passed Dolph Schayes (11,256) for 27<sup>th</sup> place with his second board of the game (11,257<sup>th</sup> career) at the 8:57 mark of the first quarter versus Denver on 3/6/18. Nowitzki, who advanced from 30<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's total boards list in 2017-18, also moved from seventh to fifth place on the league's all-time defensive rebounds list last year. He passed Moses Malone (9,481) for sixth place on the league's all-time defensive boards list at Memphis on 10/26/17 and Hakeem Olajuwon (9,714) for fifth place at Phoenix on 1/31/18. Nowitzki currently sits at **9,868** career defensive rebounds. Robert Parish ranks fourth ahead of Nowitzki with 10,117 career defensive boards.

**FRANCHISE PLAYER:** Dirk Nowitzki's name is all over the Mavericks' record books. In addition to being the franchise's all-time leading scorer, Nowitzki is also Dallas' all-time leader in games played, games started, minutes played, field goals made, 3-pointers made, free throws made, offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds, total rebounds and blocked shots. Nowitzki, who is now in his 21<sup>st</sup> NBA season, is the longest tenured player with one team. His career stats (and their rank in Mavericks history) are listed below:

Barea (579) and Devin Harris (541) rank first, eighth and 10<sup>th</sup>, respectively, on the Mavericks' all-time games played list. Barea needs three games to tie Shawn Bradley (582) for seventh place on Dallas' all-time games played list. Jason Terry ranks sixth in team history with 619 games. Harris is 25 games shy of tying Mark Aguirre (566) for ninth place on the Mavericks' all-time games played list. Nowitzki has been the franchise's leader in games played since 2009-10 – he passed Brad Davis (883) for sole possession of first place at Phoenix on 1/28/10 (in career game No. 884). Barea moved into the top 10 on the team's all-time games played list in 2016-17, while Harris entered the top 10 last season. All three players began their NBA careers with Dallas (Nowitzki is the longest tenured player with one team). Harris is in his third stint with the Mavericks, while Barea is in his second go-around with the team.

CURRENT MAVERICKS ARE IN BOLD CAPS

**2017-18 SEASON RECAP:** The Dallas Mavericks finished 24-58 (.293) in 2017-18, missing the playoffs for the second straight year (after they reached the postseason 15 times in a 16-year span from 2001 to 2016). Dirk Nowitzki played in his 20<sup>th</sup> season with the Mavericks, joining Kobe Bryant (Lakers) as the sole members of the NBA's 20-year, only one team club. The 39-year-old German logged 1,900 minutes in 77 games (all starts) in 2017-18. He moved into third place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list (50,573) and fifth on the league's all-time games played list (1,471). Nowitzki also became the sixth player in league history (first international player) to reach the 31,000-point plateau against Oklahoma City on 2/28/18. Rick Carlisle became the 18<sup>th</sup> coach in NBA history to reach 700 career victories with Dallas' 108-82 win over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/17. Harrison Barnes averaged a team-high 18.9 points per game in 2017-18, leading Dallas in scoring for the second straight year (19.2 ppg in 2016-17). Dennis Smith Jr. had a fine rookie season, finishing second on the team in both scoring (15.2 ppg) and assists (5.2 apg) while earning NBA All-Rookie Second Team honors.

**HISTORY OF THE FRANCHISE:** The 2018-19 campaign marks the 39<sup>th</sup> season in the history of the Dallas Mavericks. Dallas has won three division titles (1987, 2007, 2010) and appeared in the postseason 21 times (including 15 times in a 16-year span from 2001 to 2016). The Mavericks have made four Western Conference Finals appearances (1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). In 2011, Dallas defeated Miami in six games to capture its first NBA championship in franchise history.

**20,000 MANIAACS:** The Mavericks have sold out **682** consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch (it's **749** straight sellouts including playoffs). The Portland Trail Blazers (814 straight sellouts, 4/9/77-11/16/95) are the only team in NBA history with a longer consecutive home sellout streak (regular season and playoffs) than the Mavericks. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of **482-211 (.697)** during the regular season. Dallas has sold out all 41 home games in each of the last 16 seasons (2002-18).

**BACK-TO-BACKS:** The Mavericks have 14 back-to-backs this season. They were swept in their first back-to-back of the year (vs. Utah on 10/28/18 and at San Antonio on 10/29/18). Dallas will play eight back-to-backs that begin at home and conclude on the road, four that start and end on the road, and four that begin on the road and finish at home. Dallas will not play any home-to-home back-to-backs in 2018-19. The Mavericks went 7-8 in the first half of back-to-backs and 3-12 in the second half of back-to-backs last season (the same exact records they posted in back-to-backs in 2016-17). They swept one, split eight, and were swept in six last year.

**TEAM STATS**

- The Mavericks have scored at least 100 points in each of their first nine games in 2018-19. The only other season Dallas hit the century mark in each of its first nine games was in 1986-87. That year, the Mavericks scored 100-plus points in a franchise-record 19 straight games to begin the year.
- Six of the Mavericks' first nine games this season have been clutch games (where the score is within five points in the final 5 minutes of the fourth quarter or overtime). Dallas played in 50 clutch games in 2017-18 – tied for the second-most in the NBA (Miami led the league with 53 clutch games in 2017-18, while New Orleans, Brooklyn and Dallas ranked tied for second with 50).
- Dallas defeated Minnesota 140-136 in its home opener on 10/20. The 140 points by Dallas tied an American Airlines Center record (Dallas' first season at the AAC was in 2001-02). The Mavericks also scored 140 vs. the L.A. Lakers (106) at the AAC on 11/21/14 and 140 vs. Phoenix (116) on 4/5/09. The 140 points were also tied for the sixth-most points Dallas has ever produced in a regulation-length game (the franchise-record is 149 vs. Denver on 1/14/83).
- The Mavericks fought back from a 15-point first-quarter deficit to beat the Timberwolves 140-136 at home on 10/20. The largest deficit the Mavericks overcame in 2017-18 was 18 at Memphis on 11/22/17 (Harrison Barnes banked in a 30-foot 3-pointer at the buzzer to give Dallas a 95-94 win on 11/22/17).

**INDIVIDUAL STATS**

- **Dennis Smith Jr.** tallied a game-high-tying 23 points (8-14 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 5-10 FTs) in 32 minutes vs. New York on 11/2. He scored 20-plus points for the third time in his last four games (27 vs. Utah 10/28, 22 at San Antonio 10/29), after he failed to score 20 in each of his first four games of the season. His 23-point outing against the Knicks marked his 18<sup>th</sup> career 20-point effort.
- **Dorian Finney-Smith** registered a career-high 19 points (8-10 FGs, 2-2 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), including 10 in the first quarter, to go along with a season-high-tying seven rebounds, two assists and two steals in 27 minutes off the bench vs. New York on 11/2/18. His previous high-scoring game was 17 vs. Sacramento on 12/18/16. Finney-Smith's 10-point first quarter was also the highest-scoring quarter of his career (his previous high-scoring period was eight, which he achieved five times – once in each of the first three periods and twice in the fourth).
- **Luka Dončić** is averaging a team-high 19.4 points, 6.6 rebounds and 4.6 assists per game as a rookie in 2018-19. The only rookies in NBA history to average at least 19 points, 6 rebounds and 4 assists per game are: Oscar Robertson, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Michael Jordan, Elgin Baylor, Sidney Wicks, Larry Bird and Grant Hill.
- **DeAndre Jordan** has hauled in at least 10 boards in each of the Mavericks' first nine games this season (10/17-11/2). He's led the team in rebounding in all nine games. Jordan ranks third in the NBA with 14.3 rebounds per game this season.
- **DeAndre Jordan** is shooting 65.2 percent (43-of-66) from the field (3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA) and a career-high 82.4 percent (28-of-34) from the free-throw line this season. In 2017-18, Jordan shot 58 percent (181-of-312) from the stripe with the L.A. Clippers.
- **DeAndre Jordan** had 10 points (4-4 FGs, 2-2 FTs) and a team-high 12 rebounds at the L.A. Lakers on 10/31. He recorded a double-double for the seventh time in Dallas' first eight games of the season. The former Clipper produced at least 41 double-doubles in each of the previous five seasons with Los Angeles (2013-18), including a career-high 49 in 2015-16 and 46 in 2017-18. Andre Drummond (282) and DeMarcus Cousins (231) were the only players to register more double-doubles in that five-year span than Jordan (225), who averaged 45 double-doubles per season in that stretch.
- **Wesley Matthews** netted a team-high 21 points in 32 minutes at the L.A. Lakers on 10/31/18. He scored 20-plus points for the fifth time in his last six games. Matthews led the team in scoring in three of those six games (20 vs. Chicago 10/22/18, 23 at Atlanta 10/24/18, 21 at L.A. Lakers 10/31/18). He posted four straight 20-point scoring efforts from 10/22-10/26/18 (20 vs. Chicago 10/22/18, 23 at Atlanta 10/24/18, 21 at Toronto 10/26/18, 22 vs. Utah 10/28/18), tying a career-high streak for consecutive 20-point games. His other four-game streak of consecutive 20-point outings came with the Blazers in 2010-11 (2/13-2/23/11).
- **J.J. Barea** recorded his second double-double of the season (23<sup>rd</sup> career) with a season-high 15 points and a game-high 10 assists in 25 minutes at the L.A. Lakers (10/31). He handed out 10-plus assists for the third time in his first eight games of the season. Barea had a career-high 10 double-digit assist games in 2017-18.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** tallied a career-high-tying (game-high) 27 points (12-19 FGs, 3-4 3FGs), including 16 on a perfect 7-of-7 shooting (2-2 3FGs) in the third quarter, to go along with three assists and a team-high two blocks in 34 minutes vs. Utah on 10/28/18. Smith's other 27-point effort occurred against San Antonio last season on 11/14/17. His 16-point third quarter against the Jazz was the second-highest scoring game of his career (he had an 18-point fourth quarter in his 27-point outing against the Spurs on 11/14/17).

- **J.J. Barea** handed out his 3,000<sup>th</sup> career assist at the 4:43 mark of the first quarter against New York on 11/2 (he set up Harrison Barnes for a 3-pointer).
- **J.J. Barea** has scored 4,887 points with Dallas and needs 113 for 5,000 with the franchise.
- **J.J. Barea** has 6,844 points and needs 156 for 7,000 in his career.
- **J.J. Barea** has played in 773 games and needs 27 for 800 in his career.
- **Harrison Barnes** reached 3,000 points with the Mavericks with a floater at the 6:56 mark of the third quarter at San Antonio on 10/29.
- **Harrison Barnes** has made 997 free throws and needs three for 1,000 in his career.

- **DeAndre Jordan** has 2,466 offensive rebounds and needs 34 for 2,500 in his career. He will become the 45<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history with 2,500 offensive boards.
- **Wesley Matthews** made his 600<sup>th</sup> career start (in his 660<sup>th</sup> career game) at Toronto on 10/26.
- **Wesley Matthews** reached 1,000 field goals with the Mavericks with a 3-pointer at the 3:21 mark of the fourth quarter vs. New York on 11/2. Of those 1,000 field goals, 541 of them were 3-point baskets.
- **Wesley Matthews** has scored 2,923 points with the Mavericks and needs 77 for 3,000 with the team.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** has 9,868 defensive rebounds and needs 132 to become the fifth player in NBA history with 10,000 career defensive boards.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** has made 1,918 career 3-pointers and needs 82 for 2,000 in his career.
- **Dwight Powell** has 1,759 points and needs 241 for 2,000 in his career.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** has 388 assists and needs 112 for 500 in his career.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** has played in 77 games (all starts) and needs 23 for 100 in his career.

# HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Rick Carlisle is in his 11<sup>th</sup> season as the head coach of the Dallas Mavericks. He is the third-longest tenured head coach in the league behind San Antonio's Gregg Popovich (hired in December 1996) and Miami's Erick Spoelstra (April 2008).

Carlisle recorded his 700<sup>th</sup> career win with Dallas' 108-82 victory over the L.A. Clippers on Dec. 2, 2017, becoming the 18<sup>th</sup> coach in NBA history to reach the milestone. He joined the Spurs' Gregg Popovich and the Clippers' Doc Rivers as the only active coaches with 700 victories.

Carlisle, who was named the ninth head coach in Mavericks history on May 9, 2008, became the winningest head coach in team history with Dallas' 103-93 victory at the L.A. Lakers on Nov. 1, 2015, passing Don Nelson (339) with his 340<sup>th</sup> win with the franchise. Carlisle became the first coach in Mavericks history to reach 400 wins with the franchise with Dallas' 108-104 victory at Portland on Feb. 3, 2017.

Carlisle led his team to the playoffs 12 times in his first 14 seasons as a head coach. He guided the Mavericks to their first-ever world championship in 2011, while posting an impressive 16-5 mark during the 2011 postseason. Carlisle, who won a title as a player with Boston in 1986, is one of only 14 individuals to win an NBA championship as both a player and a head coach.

Dallas reached the postseason in seven of Carlisle's first eight seasons at the helm. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach in 2002, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award.

On Sept. 2, 2003, Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.

In 1984, Carlisle began his NBA career as the only rookie to make the Boston Celtics roster. He spent three seasons in Boston and enjoyed his best year as a pro when he averaged 9.9 minutes in 77 games for the 1986 world champions. He then played one year with the New York Knicks under head coach Rick Pitino before moving on to New Jersey, where he played briefly for Fitch before being offered an assistant coaching position with the franchise.

Collegiately, Carlisle played two years at the University of Maine before transferring to the University of Virginia, where he was co-captain of the Cavaliers' 1984 Final Four team. A native of Ogdensburg, N.Y., he graduated in 1984 with a B.A. in psychology from Virginia.
