Dallas Mavericks (3-7) vs. Washington Wizards (2-8)

- **TONIGHT'S KEY RUN:** The Mavericks used a 12-2 run (from the 5:24 mark of the first quarter through the 3:14 mark of the period) to turn a one-point deficit (13-12) into a nine-point lead (24-15). Dallas then led for the remainder of the game.

NOTES

- Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić totaled a team-high 23 points (9-16 FGs, 2-7 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) to go along with six rebounds, three assists and one steal in 33 minutes. He scored 20-plus points for the fifth time in his first 10 career games. Dončić has totaled 198 points, 65 rebounds and 44 assists through his first 10 career contests. He joins Oscar Robertson (255 points, 102 rebounds, 92 assists) as the only players in NBA history to post those numbers through 10 career games.
- Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews tallied 22 points (7-14 FGs, 5-8 3FGs, 3-3 FTs), including 14 in the second quarter, in 31 minutes. He scored 20-plus points for the sixth time in his last eight games.
- Mavericks forward Harrison Barnes recorded his first double-double of the season (22nd career) with a season-high-tying 19 points (6-13 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 5-5 FTs), a career-high-tying 13 rebounds, a season-high-tying three assists and a season-best two steals in 31 minutes. It marked the fourth time in his career he grabbed 13 boards. Barnes scored 19 points for the second time in his last three games (19 at the L.A. Lakers 10/31).
- Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan pulled down 12 rebounds to go along with eight points, three assists and one block in 32 minutes. He has now grabbed 10-plus boards in each of Dallas' first 10 games this season – a franchise-record streak to begin the year. The previous team record for consecutive 10-rebound games to begin a season was six, shared by Roy Tarpley (1989-90) and A.C. Green (1997-98).
- Mavericks point guard Dennis Smith Jr. had 19 points, four rebounds, a season-high (team-high) seven assists and one steal in 31 minutes. Smith scored 19-plus points for the fourth time in his last five games.
- Wizards point guard John Wall notched his first double-double of the season with game highs of 24 points, 10 assists and three steals in 41 minutes.
- With the victory, Dallas has now won five straight, 16 of the last 17, and 31 of the last 39 meetings with Washington.
- The Mavericks were down one (13-12) halfway through the first quarter, but closed the period on 23-11 run and led by 11 (35-24) after one.
- Dallas outscored Washington 46-21 from the midway point of the first quarter through the halfway point of the second period to open up a 24-point advantage (58-34).
- The Mavericks went 13-of-23 (.565) from deep in the opening half (compared to the Wizards' 5-of-17, .294, clip) and led 70-49 at the break. It marked Dallas' highest-scoring first half since 12/29/17 at New Orleans (77 points). It was the second time the Mavericks scored 70-plus points in any half this season (71 in 2nd half vs. Minnesota 10/28/18).
- Washington outscored Dallas 29-17 in the third stanza and cut a 21-point half-time deficit (70-49) to nine (87-78) going into the fourth.
- The Wizards were within six (99-93) midway through the fourth quarter, but the Mavericks used a 16-3 run to build a 19-point cushion (115-96).
- Dirk Nowitzki (left ankle surgery) and Devin Harris (left hamstring strain) remained out for Dallas.
- The attendance for today's game was 19,234. The Mavericks have now sold out 683 consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch.
