SERIES NOTES: The Mavericks snapped a three-game losing streak against the Blazers with a 115-109 win at home on 4/3/18...Despite the victory on 4/3/18, Dallas still lost the season series with Portland, 2-1, in 2017-18...The Mavericks dropped a season series with the Blazers for the first time since 2009-10, when they went 1-3 against Portland (the Mavericks tied 2-2 in 2010-11, won 2-1 in 2011-12, won 2-1 in 2012-13, won 2-1 in 2013-14, tied 2-2 in 2014-15, won 2-1 in 2015-16 and tied 2-2 in 2016-17)...Dennis Smith Jr. averaged 19.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 7.0 apg, 2.3 spg and 31.0 mpg in three games (all starts) against the Blazers in 2017-18...Former Blazer Wesley Matthews averaged 17.5 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 2.0 apg, 1.0 spg and 35.0 mpg in two games (both starts) against Portland last season...Dallas has taken 35 of the last 52 regular-season meetings with Portland...The Mavericks are 47-31 all-time at home against the Blazers (compared to 24-51 all-time on the road against Portland).

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard Wesley Matthews played five seasons with the Blazers from 2010-15 and averaged 15.4 points, 3.3 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 1.2 steals and 34.0 minutes in 359 games (333 starts)...Blazers guard Seth Curry spent the last two seasons with Dallas (2016-18), but did not play in 2017-18 due to a stress reaction in his left tibia...In 70 games (42 starts) for the Mavericks in 2016-17, Curry averaged 12.8 points, 2.6 rebounds, 2.7 assists, 1.1 steals and 29.0 minutes while shooting 48.1 percent (338-703 FGs) from the field, 42.5 percent (137-322 3FGs) from 3-point range and 85.0 percent (85-100 FTs) from the free-throw line...Blazers forward Al-Farouq Aminu spent the 2014-15 season with Dallas and averaged 5.6 points, 4.6 rebounds and 18.5 minutes in 74 games (three starts)...Blazers head coach Terry Stotts spent four seasons as an assistant with Dallas (2008-12), including the 2011 championship season...Mavericks head coach Rick Carlisle was an assistant with the Blazers for three seasons from 1994-97...Blazers guard Gary Trent Jr. is the son of former Maverick Gary Trent Sr., who played three seasons for Dallas from 1998-2001 and averaged 11.3 points, 5.6 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 22.3 minutes in 89 games (38 starts) with the franchise...Mavericks forward Dorian Finney-Smith (Portsmouth) and Blazers big man Meyers Leonard (Woodbridge) were both born in Virginia...Blazers guard Nik Stauskas (Mississauga) and Mavericks big man Dwight Powell (Toronto) are both from Canada and have been teammates on the Canadian national team...Dwight Powell and Blazers guard Anfernee Simmons both attended IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla.

PLAYER NOTES: Six players, including all five starters, scored between 12 and 18 points for Dallas in the win: Dennis Smith Jr. (18), Harrison Barnes (15), J.J. Barea (15), Yogi Ferrell (15), Dirk Nowitzki (14) and Dwight Powell (12). Smith added a team-high-tying eight rebounds, a game-high-tying eight assists and two steals in 29 minutes. Maxi Kleber pitched in nine points, a team-high-tying eight boards and a game-high two blocks in 31 minutes off the Mavericks' bench. Blazers point guard Damian Lillard registered a game-high 29 points (6-20 FGs, 2-10 3FGs, 15-15 FTs) to go along with five rebounds, a game-high-tying eight assists, two steals and one block in 35 minutes. Jusuf Nurkic posted a double-double with 15 points and a game-high 13 boards in 27 minutes for Portland in the loss.

NOTABLES: Dallas led by one (50-49) at the half...The Mavericks used a 13-4 run early in the third quarter to turn a one-point deficit (51-50) into an eight-point lead (63-55)...The Blazers countered with a 16-7 spurt to go back up by one (71-70) with a little over 3 minutes left in the third...Dallas responded with a 7-0 run to go back in front by six (77-71) with just over 2 minutes left in the frame...The Mavericks took a four-point advantage (82-78) into the final stanza...The Blazers were within one (88-87) with 8 minutes to go in the game, but the Mavericks used a 16-7 run to open up a 10-point advantage (104-94)...Dallas went on to win by a final score of 115-109...Dallas outshot Portland 45.7 percent (42-of-92) to 44.8 percent (39-of-87) from the field...The Mavericks went 17-of-44 (.386) from beyond the arc, while the Blazers finished 10-of-40 (.250) from deep...Portland outshot Dallas 87.5 percent (21-of-24) to 70 percent (14-of-20) from the foul line...The Blazers outrebounded the Mavericks, 46-43...Dallas committed only seven turnovers (for four points), while Portland recorded 13 giveaways (for 14 points)...The Blazers outscored the Mavericks 38-30 in the paint and 15-8 in second-chance points...Dallas outscored Portland 21-12 on the fast break...The game saw 10 ties and 14 lead changes...The Mavericks led by as many as 10, while the Blazers' largest advantage was four.

Barea in Minnesota (2011-12) and three seasons playing alongside Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan on the L.A. Dwight Powell produced 17 points (5-9 FGs, 7-8 FTs), including 11 in the fourth quarter, to go along with seven rebounds and two assists in just 17 minutes off the Mavericks' bench. NOTABLES: LeBron James scored the game's first basket for Los Angeles, but Dallas proceeded to go on a 17-4 run and went up by 11 (17-6) a little over 4 minutes into the start of the contest...The Mavericks led 32-22 after one...Dallas was up 15 (45-30) less than 4 minutes into the start of the second stanza, but Los Angeles used a 14-2 burst to get to within three (47-44) with 3 minutes left in the period...The Mavericks held a five-point edge (58-53) at the half...The Lakers used a 17-6 run in the third period to turn a six-point deficit (67-61) into a five-point advantage (78-73)...Los Angeles outscored Dallas 25-17 in the third frame and took a 78-73 lead into the fourth...The Mavericks were within four (90-86) early in the fourth quarter, but the Lakers used a 15-3 spurt to open up a 16-point advantage (105-89)...Los Angeles outscored Dallas 61-45 in the second half en route to a 114-103 win...The Lakers outshot the Mavericks 48.8 percent (42-of-86) to 39.5 percent (34-of-86) from the field...Los Angeles outscored Dallas 62-40 in the paint and 31-13 on the fast break...The game had no ties and four lead changes...The Mavericks led by as many as 15 (in the first half), while the Lakers led by as many as 18 (after intermission).

DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME SCORING LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has scored **31,187** points in his illustrious career, currently ranks seventh on the NBA's all-time scoring list. He needs **233** points to pass Wilt Chamberlain (31,419) for sixth place on the league's all-time scoring list. The big German became the sixth player in NBA history (first international player) to reach the 31,000-point plateau with a one-legged fadeaway jumper over Jerami Grant at the 7:57 mark of the second quarter against Oklahoma City on 2/28/18 (the basket gave him seven points for the game and exactly 31,000 for his career). Nowitzki, who was assisted by J.J. Barea on the play, joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (38,387), Karl Malone (36,928), Kobe Bryant (33,643), Michael Jordan (32,292) and Chamberlain (31,419) as the only players in league history to reach 31,000 career points. The 13-time All-Star also became just the third player in league history to score 31,000 points with one franchise (Malone – Jazz; Bryant – Lakers). Through 2/28/18, there had been 4,257 players who appeared in an NBA game and Nowitzki was one of only six with 31,000 points. LeBron James eclipsed both 30,000 and 31,000 career points in 2017-18, becoming the sixth player in NBA history to achieve the milestones. He joined Nowitzki as the only active members of the NBA's 30,000-point club. James passed Nowitzki for sixth place on the all-time scoring list against San Antonio on 10/27/18 and Chamberlain (31,419) for fifth place against Portland on 11/14/18. In 2016-17, Nowitzki became the sixth player in NBA history to reach the 30,000-point mark with a 15-foot baseline jumper over Larry Nance Jr. at the 10:58 mark of the second quarter against the L.A. Lakers on 3/7/17 (the basket gave him 20 points for the game and exactly 30,000 for his career).

DIRK'S 21ST SEASON: Dirk Nowitzki is set to begin his 21st season with the Mavericks – an NBA-record for a player to suit up for a single franchise. Kobe Bryant, who played 20 seasons for the Lakers from 1996-2016, held the previous record. Nowitzki's 21 seasons are also tied for the most by any player in league history (Vince Carter, Kevin Garnett, Robert Parish and Kevin Willis have also played 21). Former Maverick Vince Carter, who is also in his 21st season, is the only other active player with 20-or-more years of NBA experience. When Nowitzki and Carter squared off in Dallas on 10/20/17, they became just the second set of players with 20-or-more seasons of NBA experience to go head-to-head. Back in 2015-16, Garnett (in his 21st season) and Bryant (20th) faced each other twice during the Timberwolves-Lakers season series. Nowitzki played in 77 of Dallas' first 78 games in 2017-18 (all starts). His 77 games last year marked the most by a player in his 20th season in NBA history (previous most: 74 by Robert Parish with Charlotte in 1995-96 and 74 by Kareem Abdul-Jabbar with the Lakers in 1988-89).

LUKA DONČIĆ NAMED WESTERN CONFERENCE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH FOR OCTOBER/NOVEMBER: Mavericks guard/forward Luka Dončić was named Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in October/November. It marked the eighth time a Maverick achieved the honor and the first since Yogi Ferrell in February 2017. Dončić became the sixth player in franchise history to accomplish the feat. He led Dallas to an 8-2 record at home in October/November – the team's best start through 10 home games since 2013-14. The 6-7 Slovenian started Dallas' first 20 games of the season and averaged a team-high 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.3 assists, 1.1 steals and a team-high 33.1 minutes per game in that stretch. He shot 44.3 percent (129-of-291) from the field, 38.2 percent (47-of-123) from 3-point range and 79 percent (64-of-81) from the free-throw line. The former EuroLeague MVP scored 20-plus points in 10 of his first 20 career games, including a career-high 31 at San Antonio on 10/29/18. He led all first-year players in scoring (18.5 ppg) and minutes (33.1 mpg) for games in October/November, while ranking second among all rookies in assists (4.3 apg), second in steals (1.1 spg), fifth in 3-point field goal percentage (.382) and eighth in free throw percentage (.790).

HARRIS AND BAREA BOTH DELIVER HISTORIC BENCH PERFORMANCES IN LIMITED MINUTES AT HOUSTON: Veteran guards Devin Harris and J.J. Barea both delivered historically efficient bench performances in the Mavericks' 128-108 win at Houston on 11/28/18. Harris produced a season-high (team-high-tying) 20 points (6-8 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 3-3 FTs), including 15 in the fourth quarter, to go along with four assists and a game-high-tying two blocks in just 15 minutes off the bench. Barea finished with 13 points (5-9 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), a season-high (team-high) 12 assists, three rebounds and one steal in just 18 minutes off the pine. Both performances were the first of their kind by reserves since the NBA began distinguishing starters and subs on the box scores in 1970-71. Harris became the first reserve in NBA history (since 1970-71) to total at least 20 points and four assists in 15-or-fewer minutes, while Barea became the first sub to record at least 10 points and 12 assists in 18 minutes or less. As a unit, Dallas' bench outscored Houston's bench, 61-25, on the night.

DIRK PRESENTED WITH KEY TO THE CITY OF DALLAS: Mayor Mike Rawlings honored Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki with a Key to the City in recognition of his outstanding contributions to the community and his professional achievements over his 20-year career with Dallas. The 13-time All-Star was presented with the key at halftime of Dallas' game against Brooklyn on 11/21/18. Nowitzki became only the third person to receive a Key to the City from Mayor Rawlings since he took office in 2011 (golfer Jordan Spieth and author/humanitarian Virginia McAlester are the others).



DWIGHT POWELL RECEIVES OCTOBER NBA CARES COMMUNITY ASSIST AWARD: Mavericks center Dwight Powell received the October NBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by Kaiser Permanente in recognition of his efforts to support families battling cancer in the greater Dallas area. It marked the second straight year that a Mavericks player won the award for the month of October (J.J. Barea received the honor for October 2017 in recognition of his continuous relief efforts in Puerto Rico following devastation caused by Hurricane Maria). The award recognizes an NBA player each month who best reflects the passion that the league and its players share for giving back to their communities. The former Celtic was presented with the award at halftime of Dallas' game against Boston on 11/24/18. In addition, Kaiser Permanente and the NBA will donate \$10,000 on Powell's behalf to Champions of Discovery.

DONČIĆ POSTS MOST POINTS BY TEENAGER THROUGH 15 CAREER GAMES: Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić totaled 292 points through his first 15 career games (10/17-11/17/18), marking the most points by a teenager through his first 15 games in NBA history. The previous most was 290 by Kevin Durant, who Dončić coincidentally played his 15th career game against on 11/17/18 (Dončić scored a team-high 24 points to lead Dallas to a 112-109 win over Durant's Warriors on 11/17/18). The 19-year-old Slovenian scored 20-plus points in eight of his first 15 career games, which was also the most 20-point efforts by a teenager in his first 15 career NBA contests. The previous most was seven by Kyrie Irving, Jahlil Okafor, Dajuan Wagner and Durant.

MAVS BEAT JAZZ BY 50 ON SEATS FOR SOLDIERS NIGHT: The Mavericks beat the Jazz by 50 (118-68) at home on 11/14/18. It marked the third time in franchise history that Dallas won a game by 50-plus points (53, 123-70, vs. Philadelphia 11/13/14; 50, 128-78, at New York 1/24/10). What's more, the Mavericks handed the Jazz its worst loss since moving to Utah in 1979 (while in New Orleans, the Jazz lost to Milwaukee by 56, 158-102, on 3/14/79). Dallas held Utah to just 22 points in the second half on 11/14/18 (the Mavericks outscored the Jazz 60-22 after intermission), marking the fewest points the Mavericks have allowed in any half in team history. The previous low was 23 by Sacramento, in the first half, on 1/14/12. In fact, prior to the game against the Jazz, the fewest points the Mavericks allowed in the second half of a game was 24 at Philadelphia on 2/17/12. Utah's 68 points on the night were tied for the third-fewest points by a Dallas opponent in franchise history (it marked the fourth time the Mavericks held an opponent to exactly 68 points; the fewest points the Mavericks have ever given up was 60 vs. Sacramento 1/14/12 and the second-fewest was 65 at Minnesota 2/27/07). Dallas held Utah to just 31.2 percent (25-of-80) shooting, including 22.9 percent (8-of-35) shooting in the second half, in the 118-68 win on 11/14/18. It was the ninth-lowest field goal percentage by a Dallas opponent in club history. The 50-point win came in the team's 14th annual Seats for Soldiers game, a one-of-a-kind experience for our nation's military heroes. More than 100 wounded service members from Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio joined veterans from the Adaptive Training Foundation and reserve troops from the Dallas/Fort Worth area to enjoy courtside seats at the Mavericks vs. Jazz game at American Airlines Center. With the victory, Dallas improved to 12-2 (.857) all-time in Seats for Soldiers games.

DONČIĆ BECOMES FIRST TEENAGER TO POST 198/66/44 THROUGH 10 CAREER GAMES: Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić racked up 198 points, 66 rebounds and 44 assists through his first 10 career games (10/17-11/6/18), joining Oscar Robertson (1960-61) as the only players in NBA history to reach those totals through their first 10 career NBA contests (Dončić became the first to do so as a teenager). If you include players who played in the ABA before making their NBA debuts, Connie Hawkins (1969-70) and George McGinnis (1975-76) would also be on the list. Dončić's 198 points through 10 career games marked the second-most points by a teenager through his first 10 career contests in NBA history (behind Kevin Durant's 201). The former EuroLeague MVP scored at least 20 points in five of those 10 games, including a career-high 31 at San Antonio on 10/29/18.

DJ'S DOUBLE-DIGIT REBOUNDING STREAK TO BEGIN THE SEASON: Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan recorded at least 10 boards in each of Dallas' first 11 games this season (10/17-11/7/18) – a franchise-record streak to begin the year. The previous team record for consecutive 10-rebound games to begin a season was six, shared by Roy Tarpley (1989-90) and A.C. Green (1997-98). Jordan led Dallas in rebounding in 10 of those 11 games and averaged 13.9 boards per game in that span. He had his streak snapped against Oklahoma City on 11/10/18, when he finished with a team-high nine boards in 28 minutes.

DONČIĆ GOES FOR 31-8-4 IN HIS SEVENTH CAREER GAME: In his seventh career game, Mavericks guard/forward Luka Dončić poured in a career-high (team-high) 31 points (11-18 FGs, 4-6 3FGs, 5-6 FTs), including 24 after halftime, to go along with eight rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 40 minutes in an overtime loss to San Antonio on 10/29/18. Dončić became the first player to post a 30-8-4 stat line within his first seven career games since Michael Jordan in 1984-85 (Jordan went for 33-8-5 in his seventh career game at New York on 11/8/84). The 6-7 Slovenian (19 years, 243 days) also became just the fifth teenager in NBA history to go for 30-8-4, joining LeBron James, Kevin Durant, Kevin Garnett and Andrew Wiggins. James and Durant were the only players to achieve that stat line at a younger age than the former EuroLeague MVP. What's more, Dončić became the first teenager in league history to post a 30-8-4 line less than 17 games into his NBA career. James, who had 33 points, 16 rebounds and seven assists against Memphis on 11/29/03 (in his 17th career game), was the teenager who previously did it the fastest (in terms of games played). Dončić also became the fourth Mavericks rookie to go for 30-8-4 in a game, joining Jay Vincent, Jason Kidd and Marquis Daniels – who were all 22-or-older when they did it. In fact, he became the youngest player in franchise history with a 30-point effort. The previous youngest was

Jamal Mashburn (20 years, 348 days), who had a 36-point outing in his fourth career game at Minnesota on 11/12/93. Mashburn was also the only other Maverick to score 30 within his first seven career games.

DJ'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE STREAK TO BEGIN THE SEASON: Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan posted a double-double in each of Dallas' first six games in 2018-19 – a franchise-record streak to begin the season. Roy Tarpley, who recorded a double-double in each of the Mavericks' first four games in 1990-91, held the previous team record. Jordan had his double-double streak snapped at San Antonio (10/29/18) when he finished with eight points and 19 rebounds in 41 minutes. Through his first six games with the Mavericks (10/17-10/28/18), Jordan averaged 15.3 points, 14.7 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.8 blocks in 33.2 minutes per game. He shot 64.7 percent (33-of-51) from the field and 86.7 percent (26-of-30) from the free-throw line in that span. Jordan came up one assist shy of his first career triple-double against Utah (10/28/18) when he totaled 12 points, 19 rebounds and a career-high (game-high) nine assists in 37 minutes.

DONČIĆ BECOMES YOUNGEST MAVERICK TO RECORD A 20-POINT GAME: Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić tallied a team-high 26 points, including 15 in the second quarter, to go along with six rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in 36 minutes versus Minnesota on 10/20/18. Dončić (19 years, 234 days) became the youngest player in Mavericks history to record a 20-point game. The previous youngest was Dončić's teammate, Dennis Smith Jr., who had 22 points at Washington (11/7/17) last season at 19 years, 347 days old. Before Smith, Dončić's other teammate, Dirk Nowitzki (29 points at Phoenix 4/16/99; at 20 years, 301 days), was the youngest Maverick ever to produce a 20-point outing.

LUKA'S ROOKIE RANKINGS: Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić is averaging a team-high 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds (2nd on team), 4.3 assists (2nd on team), 1.1 steals and a team-high 33.1 minutes per game this season. He is shooting 44.3 percent (129-of-291) from the field, 38.2 percent (47-of-123) from 3-point range and 79 percent (64-of-81) from the free-throw line. Among all rookies in 2018-19, he ranks first in scoring, fourth in rebounding, second in assists, second in steals, first in minutes, fifth in 3-point field goal percentage and eighth in free throw percentage.

RAINING THREES: The Mavericks have hit at least five 3-pointers in a franchise-record **203** consecutive regular-season games (3/9/16-12/2/18). The previous team record was 56 straight games with five-plus triples from 4/10/15-2/3/16. Dallas is 6-0 this season when it hits at least 14 trifectas in a game. Just two games into the 2018-19 season, Dallas set a new franchise record for most 3-point field goal attempts with 50 in the home opener against Minnesota on 10/20/18 (17-of-50, .340). The previous team-record was 49 vs. New Jersey (18-of-49, .367) on 3/5/96. Dallas went 967-of-2,688 (.360) from deep in 2017-18, setting new club records for 3-pointers made and attempted in a season (the Mavericks went 878-of-2,473, .355, from long range in 2016-17, which was the previous most triples made and attempted by the franchise in a season). Dallas ranked fifth in total made threes (967), fifth in 3-pointers made per game (11.8), fourth in 3-pointers attempted per game (32.8) and 17th in 3-point field goal percentage (.360) last year. The Mavericks made 19-or-more trifectas five times in 2017-18 (19-of-40, .475, vs. Philadelphia 10/28/17; 19-of-38, .500, vs. Milwaukee 11/18/17; 22-of-39, .564, at New Orleans 12/29/17; 19-of-42, .452, vs. Golden State 1/3/18; 19-of-42, .452, at L.A. Lakers 2/23/18), after they did so just once in the team's previous 37 seasons (19-of-41, .463, at Orlando 2/19/16 (OT)). It was tied for the second-most games with 19-plus treys in the NBA last season (Brooklyn also had five games with 19-plus 3-pointers and Houston recorded a league-high 13 in 2017-18). Dallas went 22-of-39 (.564) from beyond the arc at New Orleans on 12/29/17, setting a new franchise record for 3-pointers made in a game. Prior to their 3-point barrage at New Orleans on 12/29/17, the most triples the Mavericks made in any game (regular season or postseason) was 20 in their series-clinching playoff win over the L.A. Lakers on 5/8/11 (20-of-32, .625). Before the 2017-18 season, Dallas had never made 19 treys in a regular-season game that was decided in regulation.

DONČIĆ BECOMES SECOND-YOUNGEST PLAYER IN MAVS HISTORY: Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić made his NBA debut for Dallas at 19 years, 231 days old, and recorded 10 points, eight rebounds and four assists in 32 minutes at Phoenix on 10/17/18. Dončić became the second-youngest player ever to appear in a game for the Mavericks, behind only Bruno Sundov (19 years, 70 days). Second-year point guard Dennis Smith Jr., who debuted for Dallas at 19 years, 327 days, is the third-youngest Maverick ever to play in a game for the franchise. When Dončić made his NBA debut, he was exactly one year younger than when teammate Dirk Nowitzki (20 years, 231 days) played in his first NBA game.

HOW THE ROSTER WAS BUILT: Dallas had another busy offseason in 2018. The Mavericks entered the night of the 2018 NBA Draft with the fifth overall pick, their highest selection since 1994 when they used the No. 2 overall pick to draft Jason Kidd. Once the draft was underway, Dallas made a big splash by acquiring the draft rights to the third overall pick and reigning EuroLeague MVP Luka Dončić from Atlanta in exchange for the draft rights to fifth overall pick Trae Young and a protected 2019 first-round pick. The Mavericks used the 33rd overall selection in the draft to take the 2018 Consensus National College Player of the Year, Jalen Brunson, who was fresh off of leading Villanova to its second national championship in a span of three years. Dallas wasn't done making moves on draft night though, and acquired the draft rights to the 56th overall pick Ray Spalding and the 60th overall pick Kostas Antetokounmpo from Philadelphia in exchange for the draft rights to 54th overall selection Shake Milton. Once free agency began, the Mavericks signed center DeAndre Jordan, the NBA's career leader in field goal percentage, on 7/6/18. During the month of July, Dallas also signed all four of the players it acquired in the 2018 NBA Draft (Dončić, Brunson, Spalding and Antetokounmpo). The Mavericks made Antetokounmpo one of their two two-way players. On 7/23/18, Dallas re-signed 13-time All-Star Dirk Nowitzki, bringing back the franchise's greatest player for his 21st season – an NBA-record for a player to suit up with a single franchise. On 7/30/18, the Mavericks signed former Arkansas guard Daryl Macon, who went undrafted in 2018, to a two-way deal. On 8/3/18, the Mavericks re-signed center Salah Mejri, who led the team in both field goal percentage and blocked shots in each of the last two seasons. On 8/6/18, Dallas signed Australian guard/forward Ryan Broekhoff. On 8/8/18, Dallas signed Devin Harris, bringing the guard back for his third stint with the team. The Mavericks' roster currently stands at 17 players. Seven of the 17 are in their first season with Dallas (Antetokounmpo, Broekhoff, Brunson, Dončić, Jordan, Macon and Spalding). Two were members of the Mavericks' 2011 NBA championship team (Nowitzki and Barea). Overall, Dallas has three players with NBA championship experience (Nowitzki, Barea and Barnes). Harris was also with the Mavericks when they reached the NBA Finals in 2006.

INTERNATIONAL MAVS: The Mavericks' roster features eight international players born in seven different countries or territories: Kostas Antetokounmpo (Greece), J.J. Barea (Puerto Rico), Ryan Broekhoff (Australia), Luka Dončić (Slovenia), Dirk Nowitzki and Maxi Kleber (Germany), Salah Mejri (Tunisia) and Dwight Powell (Canada). Dallas had a league-high seven international players on its opening-night roster (eight if you count Antetokounmpo, who was excluded because he has a two-way contract and began the season on the Mavericks-affiliate Texas Legends roster).

ROSTER BROKEN DOWN BY DRAFT POSITION: The Mavericks' 17-man roster features five former first-round picks, five former second-round draft choices and seven undrafted players. Fourteen undrafted players appeared in at least one regular-season game for Dallas in 2017-18 (J.J. Barea, Gian Clavell, Antonius Cleveland, Kyle Collinsworth, Yogi Ferrell, Dorian Finney-Smith, Aaron Harrison, Scotty Hopson, Jalen Jones, Maxi Kleber, Wesley Matthews, Salah Mejri, Johnathan Motley and Jameel Warney) – the most in any one season in franchise history. The previous team record was 11, set the season prior (before 2016-17, the franchise record was eight in 1992-93). The 2018-19 Mavericks roster broken down by draft position is shown below:

MAVERICKS ACQUIRE DRAFT RIGHTS TO THIRD OVERALL PICK LUKA DONČIĆ: The Mavericks entered the night of the 2018 NBA Draft with the fifth overall pick, their highest selection since 1994 when they used the No. 2 overall pick to draft Jason Kidd. Once the draft got underway, Dallas made a big splash by acquiring the draft rights to the third overall pick Luka Dončić from Atlanta in exchange for the draft rights to fifth overall pick Trae Young and a protected 2019 first-round pick. The 19-year-old guard/forward was fresh off of leading Real Madrid to the 2018 EuroLeague title while becoming the youngest player ever to earn EuroLeague and EuroLeague Final Four MVP honors. He also became the youngest player ever to be named ACB Most Valuable Player after leading Real to its third ACB championship in four years. What's more, Dončić earned EuroLeague Rising Star and ACB Best Young Player accolades for his second straight season. He joined Nikola Mirotić and Bogdan Bogdanović as the only repeat winners of the EuroLeague Rising Star Award. In 33 EuroLeague games for Real in 2017-18, the versatile Slovenian averaged 16.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 3.9 assists in 25.9 minutes. In 28 Spanish ACB games last year, he averaged 12.8 points, 5.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists in 24.0 minutes.

DEANDRE ATOP THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FG% LIST: Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan is the NBA's all-time leader in career field goal percentage (.671). Jordan is the only player in league history with multiple seasons shooting 70-plus percent from the floor. His 71.4 percent (412-577 FGs) mark in 2016-17, 71.0 percent (379-534 FGs) clip in 2014-15 and 70.3 percent (357-508 FGs) split in 2015-16 are the second, third and fourth-highest single-season field goal percentages in NBA history. Wilt Chamberlain, who shot 72.7 percent (426-586 FGs) from the floor for the Lakers in 1972-73, is the only player in league history to post a higher single-season mark. The Texas A&M product led the NBA in field goal percentage in five consecutive seasons from 2012-17, joining Chamberlain (1964-69) and Shaquille O'Neal (1997-02) as the only players in league history to lead the NBA in the category at least five years in a row (Jordan saw his run of five straight seasons atop the league in field goal percentage come to an end in 2017-18 when he shot .645 from the floor, narrowly finishing second behind Clint Capela's .652 mark).

MATTHEWS' 3-BALL: Mavericks swingman Wesley Matthews has made 42 3-pointers in 2018-19 (42-of-109, .385), which ranks second on the team. Despite missing the final 16 games of the 2017-18 season due to a right proximal fibula fracture, Matthews still knocked down a team-high 153 3-pointers (153-of-402, .381) last year. He led Dallas in trifectas for the third straight year (it was his third season with the team). What's more, Matthews became the only NBA player with at least 125 triples in each of the last eight seasons (2010-18). It's the second-longest streak of consecutive seasons with 125-plus treys in NBA history (Ray Allen hit 125-plus 3-pointers in 12 straight seasons from 1999-00 to 2010-11). The undrafted guard out of Marquette knocked down his 1,400th career 3-pointer in the final minute of the game versus Indiana on 2/26/18. He reached the milestone in his 652nd career contest, becoming the sixth-fastest player to 1,400 3-pointers in NBA history (in terms of games played). Stephen Curry (459) achieved the milestone in the fewest number of games, followed by Klay Thompson (485), James Harden (620), Ray Allen (629), Peja Stojakovic (640) and Matthews (652). Matthews also became the first undrafted player in league history (31st player overall) to reach 1,400 career triples.

CARLISLE ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME WINS LIST: Rick Carlisle, who holds an all-time record of **729-588 (.554)** as a head coach, moved into 17th place on the NBA's all-time wins list in 2017-18. Carlisle recorded his 700th career win with Dallas' 108-82 victory over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/17, becoming the 18th coach in NBA history to reach the plateau. He joined San Antonio's Gregg Popovich and the Clippers' Doc Rivers as the only active coaches with 700 victories. By defeating Rivers' Clippers for career win No. 700, Carlisle became the first coach to reach the milestone against a fellow 700-win coach. Carlisle reached the mark in his 1,237th game as a head coach and his 745th game with the Mavericks (he went 700-537, .566, in his first 1,237 games overall, and 419-326, .562, in his first 745 games with Dallas). He passed Red Holzman (696) for 18th place on the league's all-time wins list with Dallas' 111-79 victory over Milwaukee on 11/18/17. Most recently, Carlisle passed John MacLeod (707) for 17th place on the NBA's all-time victories list with the Mavericks' 114-99 win over the Magic on 1/9/18. Gene Shue ranks 16th ahead of Carlisle with 784 wins.

NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FIELD GOALS MADE LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks eighth all-time in field goals made with **11,034**. Shaquille O'Neal ranks seventh ahead of Nowitzki with 11,330. Nowitzki passed Hakeem Olajuwon (10,749) and Elvin Hayes (10,976) on the league's all-time field goals made list in 2017-18. The big German moved ahead of Olajuwon with a 20-foot jumper at the 11:45 mark of the second quarter against Minnesota on 11/17/17 (career field goal No. 10,750), becoming the league's all-time leader in field goals made by an international player. He passed Hayes for eighth place with a hook shot at the 8:56 mark of the second quarter against New Orleans on 3/4/18 (career field goal No. 10,977). Nowitzki recorded his 11,000th career field goal with a 19-foot jumper at the 9:11 mark of the second quarter at Toronto on 3/16/18, becoming the eighth player in NBA history to reach the milestone.

DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME FREE THROWS MADE LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has shot **7,201-of-8,189 (.879)** from the foul line for his career, ranks first among active players and sixth all-time in free throws made. Michael Jordan ranks fifth with 7,327 career made free throws. Nowitzki has gone 7-of-7 or better from the line in 178 regular-season games, by far, the most such games in NBA history (he had one such game in 2017-18 – a 7-of-7 night vs. Orlando on 1/9/18). Reggie Miller ranks second with 149 such games. During the 2015-16 season, the big German became the seventh player in NBA history (and the first 7-footer) to reach 7,000 career made free throws against San Antonio on 4/13/16. In 2017-18, he passed former Laker great Jerry West (7,160th) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time free throws made list with his first free throw of the game (7,161st career) at the 7:51 mark of the second quarter against the Lakers on 1/13/18.

DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME TRIPLES LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks 12th on the NBA's all-time 3-point field goals made list with **1,918** career triples. J.R. Smith ranks 11th with 1,929 career treys and Joe Johnson ranks 10th with 1,978. At age 39, Nowitzki went 138-of-337 (.409) from beyond the arc in 2017-18. It was the fourth-most trifectas Nowitzki made in any one season in his career and the fourth-highest 3-point field goal percentage he recorded in any one year. What's more, it marked the most 3-pointers by a player age 39-or-older in NBA history. Jason Kidd, who went 114-of-325 (.351) from deep with New York in 2012-13 (at age 39), held the previous such record. In fact, Kidd (114 in 2012-13) and Vince Carter (112-of-296, .378, with Memphis at age 40 in 2016-17) are the only players in league history to record at least 100 trifectas in a season at age 39-or-older. The 2017-18 campaign was Nowitzki's ninth season with 100-or-more treys (including his fourth in the last five years). He advanced from 14th to 11th place on the league's all-time triples list in 2017-18. Nowitzki passed Rashard Lewis (1,787) against Philadelphia on 10/28/17, Kobe Bryant (1,827) against Phoenix on 12/18/17 and Chauncey Billups (1,830) at Miami on 12/22/17. He also leapfrogged Cleveland's J.R. Smith at Chicago on 3/2/18. Nowitzki knocked down his 1,900th career 3-pointer at the 10:34 mark of the third quarter versus Houston on 3/11/18 (he was assisted by Dennis Smith Jr. on the play). He became the 11th player in NBA history to achieve the milestone. He also became the first international player and the first 7-footer to reach the mark.

NOWITZKI ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME GAMES PLAYED LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and fifth all-time in NBA regular-season games played with **1,471**. He needs five more games to tie Karl Malone (1,476) for fourth place on the league's all-time games played list. John Stockton ranks third with 1,504. Stockton, who spent his entire 19-year career with the Jazz, is the only player to appear in more games with a single team than Nowitzki. Nowitzki advanced from seventh to fifth place on the all-time games played list in 2017-18. He became the seventh player in league history to reach 1,400 career games at Memphis on 10/26/17. The big German passed Kevin Willis (1,424) for sixth place on the NBA's all-time games played list against Phoenix on 12/18/17. On 3/17/18 at Brooklyn, he passed Kevin Garnett (1,462) for fifth place on the league's all-time games played list. Nowitzki played in 77 of Dallas' first 78 games in 2017-18. His 77 games last year were the most by a player in his 20th season in NBA history (previous most: 74 – Robert Parish played in 74 games with Charlotte in 1995-96 and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar appeared in 74 with the Lakers in 1988-89).

50,000-PLUS MINUTES FOR DIRK: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki ranks first among active players and third all-time in regular-season minutes played with **50,573**. Karl Malone ranks second with 54,852 minutes. Nowitzki logged 1,900 minutes in 2017-18 – the most by a player in his 20th season in NBA history (previous most: 1,863 by former Laker Kobe Bryant in 2015-16). He became the sixth player in league history to reach 50,000 career minutes at the L.A. Clippers on 2/5/18. He also passed Elvin Hayes (50,000) for fifth place on the league's all-time minutes played list at the L.A. Clippers on 2/5/18. On 2/23/18 at the L.A. Lakers, Nowitzki passed former Maverick Jason Kidd (50,111) for the fourth place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list. On 3/22/18 versus Utah, he passed Kevin Garnett (50,418) for third place. In addition to the 50,000-plus minutes he has played in the regular season, Nowitzki has also logged 5,895 minutes in his 145 career postseason games.

DIRK ON THE NBA'S ALL-TIME REBOUNDING LIST: Mavericks forward Dirk Nowitzki, who has grabbed **11,331** rebounds in his career, currently ranks 27th on the NBA's all-time rebounding list. Elgin Baylor ranks 26th ahead of Nowitzki with 11,463 career boards. Nowitzki passed Jack Sikma (10,816) for 29th place on the NBA's all-time rebounding list with his first board of the game (10,817th career) at the 10:48 mark of the first quarter at Brooklyn on 3/19/17. He collected his 11,000th career rebound at the 8:52 mark of the first quarter at Memphis on 11/22/17, becoming the 29th player in NBA history to reach the milestone. The big German passed Bill Bridges (11,054) on the league's all-time rebounding list with his sixth board of the game (11,055th career) at the 8:42 mark of the second quarter at Golden State on 12/14/17. Most recently, he passed Dolph Schayes (11,256) for 27th place with his second board of the game (11,257th career) at the 8:57 mark of the first quarter versus Denver on 3/6/18. Nowitzki, who advanced from 30th to 27th place on the NBA's total boards list in 2017-18, also moved from seventh to fifth place on the league's all-time defensive rebounds list last year. He passed Moses Malone (9,481) for sixth place on the league's all-time defensive boards list at Memphis on 10/26/17 and Hakeem Olajuwon (9,714) for fifth place at Phoenix on 1/31/18. Nowitzki currently sits at **9,868** career defensive rebounds. Robert Parish ranks fourth ahead of Nowitzki with 10,117 career defensive boards.

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki's name is all over the Mavericks' record books. In addition to being the franchise's all-time leading scorer, Nowitzki is also Dallas' all-time leader in games played, games started, minutes played, field goals made, 3-pointers made, free throws made, offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds, total rebounds and blocked shots. Nowitzki, who is now in his 21st NBA season, is the longest tenured player with one team. His career stats (and their rank in Mavericks history) are listed below:

DIRK, J.J. AND DEVIN ON THE MAVS' ALL-TIME GAMES PLAYED LIST: Dirk Nowitzki (1,471), J.J. Barea (590) and Devin Harris (551) rank first, seventh and 10th, respectively, on the Mavericks' all-time games played list. Barea is **29** games shy of tying Jason Terry (619) for sixth place on Dallas' all-time games played list. Michael Finley ranks fifth with 626 games. With his 583rd appearance with the Mavericks (at Chicago on 11/12/18), Barea passed Shawn Bradley (582) for seventh place on the team's all-time games played list (it was his 777th game overall). Harris is **15** games away from tying Mark Aguirre (566) for ninth place on the Mavericks' all-time games played list. Nowitzki has been the franchise's leader in games played since 2009-10 – he passed Brad Davis (883) for sole possession of first place at Phoenix on 1/28/10 (in career game No. 884). Barea moved into the top 10 on the team's all-time games played list in 2016-17, while Harris entered the top 10 last season. All three players began their NBA careers with Dallas (Nowitzki is the longest tenured player with one team). Harris is in his third stint with the Mavericks in 2018-19 (he also played for Dallas from 2004-08 and from 2013-18). He joins Murlon Wiley as the only players in Mavericks history to play three stints with the franchise (under the following parameters: had to play at least one game with the Mavericks to get credit for a "stint" and had to play at least one game for another NBA team between stints). Barea is in his second go-around with the team (he also played for Dallas from 2006-11).

CURRENT MAVERICKS ARE IN BOLD CAPS

2017-18 SEASON RECAP: The Dallas Mavericks finished 24-58 (.293) in 2017-18, missing the playoffs for the second straight year (after they reached the postseason 15 times in a 16-year span from 2001 to 2016). Dirk Nowitzki played in his 20th season with the Mavericks, joining Kobe Bryant (Lakers) as the sole members of the NBA's 20-year, only one team club. The 39-year-old German logged 1,900 minutes in 77 games (all starts) in 2017-18. He moved into third place on the NBA's all-time minutes played list (50,573) and fifth on the league's all-time games played list (1,471). Nowitzki also became the sixth player in league history (first international player) to reach the 31,000-point plateau against Oklahoma City on 2/28/18. Rick Carlisle became the 18th coach in NBA history to reach 700 career victories with Dallas' 108-82 win over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/17. Harrison Barnes averaged a team-high 18.9 points per game in 2017-18, leading Dallas in scoring for the second straight year (19.2 ppg in 2016-17). Dennis Smith Jr. had a fine rookie season, finishing second on the team in both scoring (15.2 ppg) and assists (5.2 apg) while earning NBA All-Rookie Second Team honors.

HISTORY OF THE FRANCHISE: The 2018-19 campaign marks the 39th season in the history of the Dallas Mavericks. Dallas has won three division titles (1987, 2007, 2010) and appeared in the postseason 21 times (including 15 times in a 16-year span from 2001 to 2016). The Mavericks have made four Western Conference Finals appearances (1988, 2003, 2006, 2011) and advanced to the NBA Finals twice (2006 and 2011). In 2011, Dallas defeated Miami in six games to capture its first NBA championship in franchise history.

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out **689** consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch (it's **756** straight sellouts including playoffs). The Portland Trail Blazers (814 straight sellouts, 4/9/77-11/16/95) are the only team in NBA history with a longer consecutive home sellout streak (regular season and playoffs) than the Mavericks. The listed capacity for American Airlines Center is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of **489-211 (.699)** during the regular season. Their game against the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/18 mark their 700th regular-season game at the AAC. Dallas has sold out all 41 home games in each of the last 16 seasons (2002-18).

BACK-TO-BACKS: The Mavericks are 1-1 in the first half of back-to-backs and 0-2 in the second half of back-to-backs this year. They were swept in their first back-to-back and split their second. The Mavericks have 14 back-to-backs this season. Dallas will play eight back-to-backs that begin at home and conclude on the road, four that start and end on the road, and four that begin on the road and finish at home. Dallas will not play any home-to-home back-to-backs in 2018-19. The Mavericks went 7-8 in the first half of back-to-backs and 3-12 in the second half of back-to-backs last season (the same exact records they posted in back-to-backs in 2016-17). They swept one, split eight, and were swept in six last year.

TEAM STATS

- With their 114-110 win over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2, the Mavericks have now won eight of their last 10 and nine of their last 12 games. The Clippers entered the meeting with Dallas on 12/2 with a Western Conference-leading 15-6 (.714) record.
- With their victory over the Clippers on 12/2 (in their 700th regular-season game played at American Airlines Center), the Mavericks have now won seven consecutive games at home. It's the first time they've won seven straight at the AAC since they started 7-0 at home in 2013-14. They'll look to make it eight straight home wins with a victory over Portland on 12/4. Dallas hasn't won eight-or-more home games in a row since its championship season in 2010-11 (Dallas won 9 straight at the AAC from 1/19-3/4/11).
- With the victory over the L.A. Clippers on 12/2, Dallas improved to 9-2 at home this season (Dallas started 2-9 at home in 2017-18). The Mavericks won nine of their first 11 home games for the first time since 2013-14 (they also started 9-2 at home that year). The 2013-14 campaign was also the last time Dallas won 10 of its first 12 home games.
- The Mavericks are averaging 115.5 points per game on 48.3 percent shooting (.373 3FG) at home this season (compared to 105.6 ppg on .438 shooting on the road).
- The Mavericks pulled down a season-high 64 rebounds against the Clippers on 12/2 (Dallas owned a 64-44 advantage on the glass). It was the most boards Dallas recorded in a game since 3/13/04 at Phoenix (64). The franchise-record for rebounds in a game is 66 (twice).
- The Mavericks have scored at least 100 points in 20 of their first 21 games this season. Dallas hit the century mark only nine times in its first 21 games in 2017-18 (and just 10 times in its first 22 games last year).
- Dallas went 17-of-34 (.500) from deep in its 128-108 win at Houston on 11/28, tying a season-high for 3-pointers made in a game (17-of-50, .340, vs. Minnesota 10/20). The Mavericks improved to 6-0 this season when they hit at least 14 3-pointers in a game.
- The Mavericks shot 54.1 percent (46-of-85) from the floor in their 20-point win (128-108) at Houston on 11/28. Dallas improved to 4-1 this season when it shoots at least 50 percent from the field.
- The Mavericks' bench outscored the Rockets' bench, 61-25, in their 20-point win (128-108) at Houston on 11/28. It marked Dallas' second-most bench-points in a game this season (66 vs. Utah 11/14). It was also the Mavericks' second-largest margin of victory in any game this year (50, 118-68, vs. Utah 11/14).
- The Mavericks are 5-0 this season when they tally at least 10 steals in a game. Dallas recorded 11 steals at Chicago (11/12), a season-high 12 thefts vs. Utah (11/14), 10 swipes vs. Brooklyn (11/21), a season-high-tying 12 steals against Boston (11/24) and 10 swipes at Houston (11/28). The Mavericks hadn't recorded double-digit steals in any of their first 12 games this season prior to doing so five times in a seven-game stretch from 11/14-11/28.
- Dallas posted a 74-point first half at Houston on 11/28 (Dallas led 74-56 at halftime). It marked Dallas' highest-scoring half since 12/29/17 at New Orleans (77-point first half). It was the third time the Mavericks scored 70-plus points in any half this season (70 in 1st half vs. Washington 11/6; 71 in 2nd half vs. Minnesota 10/28).
- The Mavericks scored at least 100 points in each of their first 15 games in 2018-19. The only other season Dallas hit the century mark in each of its first 15 games was in 1986-87. That year, the Mavericks scored 100-plus points in a franchise-record 19 straight games to begin the year (and averaged a franchise-record 116.7 ppg for the season).
- The Mavericks won four consecutive games from 11/10-11/17. It matched their longest win streak for all of 2017-18 (the Mavericks won four in a row from 12/26-12/31/17). During the four-game win streak (11/10-11/17), the Mavericks held opponents to just 92.8 points on 38.8 percent shooting (.237 3FG).
- Dallas defeated Minnesota 140-136 in its home opener on 10/20. The 140 points by Dallas tied an American Airlines Center record (Dallas' first season at the AAC was in 2001-02). The Mavericks also scored 140 vs. the L.A. Lakers (106) at the AAC on 11/21/14 and 140 vs. Phoenix (116) on 4/5/09.
- The Mavericks are 10-1 this season when they score 110-plus points.
- Dallas is 9-3 this year when it shoots at least 45 percent from the field.
- The Mavericks are 9-1 this season when they lead going into the fourth quarter, including a perfect 7-0 when they lead at home going into the fourth.
- Dallas is 7-2 this season when it has at least two reserves score 10-plus points, including a perfect 3-0 when it has at least three subs score in double figures.
- Dallas is 8-2 this season when it scores at least 30 points in the first quarter.

INDIVIDUAL STATS

- **Harrison Barnes** tallied a season-high (game-high) 30 points, including 15 in the first quarter, to go along with nine rebounds in 38 minutes vs. the L.A. Clippers on 12/2. The 30-point effort came just one game after he scored 13 of his then season-high (game-high) 29 points in the opening period at the L.A. Lakers on 11/30. It was Barnes' 12th 30-point game as a Maverick (he had 7 in 2016-17 and 4 in 2017-18). He scored 30 just once in his first four seasons with Golden State (Barnes now has 13 career 30-point games). Barnes led Dallas in scoring for the sixth time in the last nine games (including ties).
- **Harrison Barnes** has scored 20-plus points in six of his last nine games (Dallas is 5-1 when he scores 20-plus points this season). He's averaging 21.7 points (.445 FG, .474 3FG, .826 FT) in that span (11/12-12/2).
- **J.J. Barea** tallied a season-high 24 points (9-18 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 5-5 FTs), including 20 in the first half (12 in the second quarter), to go along with a season-high-tying five rebounds and four assists in 27 minutes vs. the L.A. Clippers on 12/2 (previous high: 21 vs. Oklahoma City 11/10). The Mavericks improved to 3-0 this season when Barea produces 20-plus points (and 9-2 when he scores in double figures). In fact, Dallas is now 7-1 over the last two seasons when Barea reaches 20 (Dallas was 4-1 when he hit the 20-point mark in 2017-18).
- **J.J. Barea** registered a season-high 24 points vs. the L.A. Clippers on 12/2. He scored 18-plus points for the third time in his last five games (18 vs. Brooklyn 11/21, 20 vs. Boston 11/24). Since returning from a left adductor strain that sidelined him for one game (at Memphis 11/19), he's averaging 16.6 points (.515 FG) and 6.8 assists over his last five contests (11/21-12/2).
- **J.J. Barea** scored 20 of his season-high 24 points in the first half against the L.A. Clippers on 12/2/18. It marked the fourth time in his career that Barea scored at least 20 points in a half (he's netted exactly 20 in all four). He scored 20 of his season-high 23 points in the first half against Utah last season on 3/22/18, 20 of his career-high 32 points in the opening half at Brooklyn on 12/23/15, and 20 of his 22 points in the second half vs. Atlanta on 12/6/08.
- **DeAndre Jordan** posted his 13th double-double of the season (277th career) with 16 points, a season-high (game-high) 23 rebounds, three assists, one steal and one block in 34 minutes vs. the L.A. Clippers on 12/2. His previous high rebounding effort this year was 20 at Memphis on 11/19. Jordan recorded his second game with 20-plus rebounds this season, becoming the first Maverick to record multiple 20-rebound efforts in a season since Tyson Chandler in 2014-15 (3). The former Clipper produced at least 41 double-doubles in each of the previous five seasons with Los Angeles (2013-18), including a career-high 49 in 2015-16 and 46 in 2017-18. Andre Drummond (282) and DeMarcus Cousins (231) were the only players to register more double-doubles in that five-year span than Jordan (225), who averaged 45 double-doubles per season in that stretch.

- **DeAndre Jordan** has collected 10-plus rebounds in 19 of Dallas' first 21 games this season. He's averaging 13.7 rebounds per game on the year, which ranks third in the NBA. The highest single-season rebounding average in Mavericks history is 11.9 boards per game by James Donaldson in 1986-87.
- **DeAndre Jordan** is shooting a career-high 75.6 percent (68-of-90) from the free-throw line this season. Jordan shot 58 percent (181-of-312) from the stripe with the L.A. Clippers last year.
- **Dorian Finney-Smith** recorded 10 points, seven rebounds and two steals in 34 minutes vs. the L.A. Clippers on 12/2. He scored in double figures for the ninth time in Dallas' first 21 games of the season (Dallas improved to 6-3 this year when he scores 10-plus points). Finney-Smith had five double-figure scoring efforts in all of 2017-18 (after missing significant time with left quadriceps tendinitis).
- **Dwight Powell** totaled 17 points, including 11 in the fourth quarter, to go along with seven rebounds and two assists in just 17 minutes off the bench at the L.A. Lakers on 11/30/18. Powell became the first reserve to record at least 17 points and seven boards in 17-or-fewer minutes since Julius Randle had 17 points and seven boards in 17 minutes off the pine vs. Detroit on 10/31/17. The 17-point effort was Powell's second-highest scoring game of the season (19 vs. Minnesota 10/20). It was his seventh double-figure scoring outing of the year.
- **Devin Harris**, who missed 10 games this season due to a left hamstring strain, appeared in his ninth game of the year at Houston (11/28) and registered a season-high 20 points (6-8 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 3-3 FTs), including 15 in the fourth quarter, to go along with four assists and a game-high-tying two blocks in just 15 minutes off the bench. He scored 18-plus points for the second time in his last three games (18 vs. Brooklyn 11/21). Harris' highest-scoring game with Dallas last season was a 17-point effort at New Orleans on 12/29/17. His highest-scoring game in all of 2017-18 was a 20-point outing as a member of the Denver Nuggets vs. Minnesota on 4/5/18.
- **Luka Dončić** produced a team-high-tying 20 points, including 15 in the first half (10 in the first quarter), to go along with six rebounds, two assists and one steal in 24 minutes at Houston on 11/28. He scored 20-plus points for the 10th time in his first 19 career games. He also led Dallas in scoring for the eighth time this year (including ties).
- **J.J. Barea** recorded his third double-double of the season (24th career) with 13 points and a season-high (team-high) 12 assists in just 18 minutes off the bench at Houston on 11/28. It was his fourth double-digit assist game this season. Barea had a career-high 10 double-digit assist games in 2017-18.
- **Maxi Kleber** had 11 points in 18 minutes vs. Brooklyn on 11/21. It marked his fifth double-figure scoring effort of the season (Dallas is 3-2 in such games).
- **Luka Dončić** recorded his first career double-double with 15 points, a career-high 10 rebounds, three assists and one block in 37 minutes at Memphis on 11/19. His previous high-rebounding effort was nine (three times).
- **Luka Dončić** is averaging 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game through his first 19 career games. The only rookies in NBA history to average at least 18 points, 6 rebounds and 4 assists per game for a season are: Oscar Robertson, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Michael Jordan, Elgin Baylor, Sidney Wicks, Larry Bird, Grant Hill, Alvan Adams and Magic Johnson.
- **Luka Dončić** produced a game-high 22 points vs. Oklahoma City (11/10), after he scored a team-high 23 points vs. Washington (11/3) and a game-high 24 points at Utah (11/7). He scored 20-plus in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. Dončić led Dallas in scoring in each of those three games.
- **Wesley Matthews** had 22 points, including 14 in the second quarter, vs. Washington on 11/6/18. He scored 20-plus points for the sixth time in his last eight games. Matthews posted four straight 20-point scoring efforts from 10/22-10/26/18 (20 vs. Chicago 10/22/18, 23 at Atlanta 10/24/18, 21 at Toronto 10/26/18, 22 vs. Utah 10/28/18), tying a career-high streak for consecutive 20-point games. His other four-game streak of consecutive 20-point outings came with the Blazers in 2010-11 (2/13-2/23/11).
- **Harrison Barnes** recorded his first double-double of the season (22nd career) with 19 points, a career-high-tying 13 rebounds, three assists and two steals in 31 minutes vs. Washington on 11/6. It marked the fourth time in his career he grabbed 13 boards.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** tallied a game-high-tying 23 points (8-14 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 5-10 FTs) in 32 minutes vs. New York on 11/2. He scored 20-plus points for the third time in his last four games (27 vs. Utah 10/28, 22 at San Antonio 10/29), after he failed to score 20 in each of his first four games of the season. His 23-point outing against the Knicks marked his 18th career 20-point effort.
- **Dorian Finney-Smith** registered a career-high 19 points (8-10 FGs, 2-2 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), including 10 in the first quarter, to go along with a season-high-tying seven rebounds, two assists and two steals in 27 minutes off the bench vs. New York on 11/2/18. His previous high-scoring game was 17 vs. Sacramento on 12/18/16. Finney-Smith's 10-point first quarter was also the highest-scoring quarter of his career (his previous high-scoring period was 8 on five occasions).
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** tallied a career-high-tying (game-high) 27 points (12-19 FGs, 3-4 3FGs), including 16 on a perfect 7-of-7 shooting (2-2 3FGs) in the third quarter, in 34 minutes vs. Utah on 10/28/18. Smith's other 27-point effort occurred against San Antonio last season on 11/14/17. His 16-point third quarter against the Jazz was the second-highest scoring game of his career (he had an 18-point fourth quarter in his 27-point outing against the Spurs on 11/14/17).

- **J.J. Barea** has played in 784 games and needs 16 for 800 in his career.
- **J.J. Barea** reached 7,000 career points with a fadeaway jumper at the 4:48 mark of the second quarter against the L.A. Clippers on 12/2 (the basket gave him 16 points for the game and exactly 7,000 for his career). - **DeAndre Jordan** has 2,492 offensive rebounds and needs eight for 2,500 in his career. He will become the 45th player in NBA history with 2,500 offensive boards.
- **DeAndre Jordan** has 2,947 field goals and needs 53 for 3,000 in his career.
- **DeAndre Jordan** pulled down his 8,000th career rebound at the 5:19 mark of the third quarter at Phoenix on 10/17. He entered the 2018-19 season needing 12 boards for 8,000 and corralled exactly 12 in the opener.
- **Wesley Matthews** reached 3,000 points with the Mavericks with a 3-pointer at the 8:26 mark of the second quarter at Houston on 11/28.
- **Wesley Matthews** reached 1,000 field goals with the Mavericks with a 3-pointer at the 3:21 mark of the fourth quarter vs. New York on 11/2. Of those 1,000 field goals, 541 of them were 3-point baskets.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** has 9,868 defensive rebounds and needs 132 to become the fifth player in NBA history with 10,000 career defensive boards.
- **Dirk Nowitzki** has made 1,918 career 3-pointers and needs 82 for 2,000 in his career.
- **Dwight Powell** has 1,841 points and needs 159 for 2,000 in his career.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** has 433 assists and needs 67 for 500 in his career.
- **Dennis Smith Jr.** has played in 88 games (all starts) and needs 12 for 100 in his career.

Rick Carlisle is in his 11th season as the head coach of the Dallas Mavericks. He is the third-longest tenured head coach in the league behind San Antonio's Gregg Popovich (hired in December 1996) and Miami's Erick Spoelstra (April 2008).

Carlisle recorded his 700th career win with Dallas' 108-82 victory over the L.A. Clippers on Dec. 2, 2017, becoming the 18th coach in NBA history to reach the milestone. He joined the Spurs' Gregg Popovich and the Clippers' Doc Rivers as the only active coaches with 700 victories.

Carlisle, who was named the ninth head coach in Mavericks history on May 9, 2008, became the winningest head coach in team history with Dallas' 103-93 victory at the L.A. Lakers on Nov. 1, 2015, passing Don Nelson (339) with his 340th win with the franchise. Carlisle became the first coach in Mavericks history to reach 400 wins with the franchise with Dallas' 108-104 victory at Portland on Feb. 3, 2017.

Carlisle led his team to the playoffs 12 times in his first 14 seasons as a head coach. He guided the Mavericks to their first-ever world championship in 2011, while posting an impressive 16-5 mark during the 2011 postseason. Carlisle, who won a title as a player with Boston in 1986, is one of only 14 individuals to win an NBA championship as both a player and a head coach.

Dallas reached the postseason in seven of Carlisle's first eight seasons at the helm. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season before coming to Dallas.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61 percent (100-64) of their games to go along with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach in 2002, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award.

On Sept. 2, 2003, Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in team history (.744) and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons.

Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as a head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.

In 1984, Carlisle began his NBA career as the only rookie to make the Boston Celtics roster. He spent three seasons in Boston and enjoyed his best year as a pro when he averaged 9.9 minutes in 77 games for the 1986 world champions. He then played one year with the New York Knicks under head coach Rick Pitino before moving on to New Jersey, where he played briefly for Fitch before being offered an assistant coaching position with the franchise.

Collegiately, Carlisle played two years at the University of Maine before transferring to the University of Virginia, where he was co-captain of the Cavaliers' 1984 Final Four team. A native of Ogdensburg, N.Y., he graduated in 1984 with a B.A. in psychology from Virginia.
