Dallas Mavericks (18-22) vs. Los Angeles Lakers (22-19)

- **TONIGHT'S KEY RUN:** The Mavericks were up eight (74-66) with under 7 minutes remaining in the third quarter, but the Lakers closed the period on a 20-6 run and took a six-point advantage (86-80) into the fourth. Los Angeles outscored Dallas 32-13 in the third stanza.

NOTES

- Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić tallied a team-high 27 points (10-23 FGs, 2-6 3FGs, 5-7 FTs) to go along with eight rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 35 minutes. It marked his 21st game with 20-or-more points this season. Dončić's 21 20-point efforts are already the third-most 20-point games by a Mavericks rookie in franchise history. Only Jay Vincent (53 in 1981-82) and Jamal Mashburn (37 in 1993-94) have produced more.
- Mavericks center DeAndre Jordan notched his 25th double-double of the season (289th career) with 10 points, a game-high 19 rebounds, two steals and a game-high three blocks in 33 minutes. It was his ninth game with 19-or-more boards this season. Jordan has now collected double-digit rebounds in 35 of Dallas' first 40 games this year.
- Mavericks guard J.J. Barea appeared in his 800th career game and recorded 11 points and three assists in 19 minutes off the bench. The former Northeastern guard became the 11th undrafted player who attended a U.S. high school or college to reach 800 career games since the ABA-NBA merger in 1976.
- Lakers forward Brandon Ingram totaled a game-high 29 points (12-21 FGs, 5-7 FTs) to go along with a game-high-tying six assists and two steals in 37 minutes. He scored 20-plus points for the eighth time in his first 30 games of the season.
- Lakers point guard Lonzo Ball had 21 points (8-15 FGs, 4-8 3FGs, 1-4 FTs), seven rebounds, five assists and two steals in 37 minutes. He posted his third 20-point outing of the season.
- Lakers guard Josh Hart recorded his third double-double of the season (11th career) with 14 points, a team-high 12 rebounds, a game-high-tying six assists and a career-high (game-high) five steals in a career-high 44 minutes. It was his third game with 10-plus boards this season.
- With the loss, the Mavericks moved to 15-4 (.789) at home this season. Dallas entered tonight having won 13 of its previous 14 games at American Airlines Center.
- With the win, the Lakers swept the 2018-19 season series, 3-0.
- Dallas began the game on an 11-3 run and never trailed in the first half. Los Angeles got to within one (17-16) with 5 minutes remaining in the opening quarter, but Dallas used a 9-2 run to build an eight-point cushion (26-18). The Mavericks used a 16-6 run spanning the first and second quarters to open up a 15-point advantage (46-31). Dallas held a 13-point lead (67-54) at the break.
- Ray Spalding, Daryl Macon and Kostas Antetokounmpo remained on assignment with the Mavericks' G-League affiliate, the Texas Legends. LeBron James (left groin strain) and Rajon Rondo (right ring finger surgery) both missed the game for the Lakers due to injury. Alex Caruso and Johnathan Williams were on assignment with Los Angeles' G-League team, the South Bay Lakers.
- The attendance for tonight's game was 20,354. The Mavericks have now sold out 697 consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch.
