- **TONIGHT'S KEY RUN:** The score was tied at 81 with 8 minutes to go in regulation, but the Mavericks used a 10-5 spurt to go up by five (91-86) with 3:28 remaining.

NOTES

- Mavericks rookie guard/forward Luka Dončić recorded his third triple-double of the season with a team-high 19 points, 10 rebounds and a game-high 11 assists in 35 minutes. It was his third triple-double in a span of seven games (18 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists at Milwaukee 1/21/19; 35 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists vs. Toronto 1/27/19). Dončić, who doesn't turn 20 until Feb. 28, now has three of the four triple-doubles ever recorded by a teenager in NBA history. Markelle Fultz, who had 13 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists vs. Milwaukee on 4/11/18 (at 19 years, 317 days), is the only other player in league history to produce a triple-double before the age of 20 (Fultz was 10 days younger than Dončić at the time of his first career triple-double).
- Over his last seven games (1/21-2/6), Dončić is averaging 24.6 points, 9.6 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game.
- Dončić became the first Maverick to record three triple-doubles in a season since Jason Kidd in 2008-09. The last Maverick to have four-or-more triple-doubles in a season was Michael Finley in 1999-00 (4).
- Mavericks forward Dorian Finney-Smith posted his first double-double of the season (second career) with 15 points, including 10 in the first half, to go along a season-high-tying 10 rebounds, two assists and one steal in 33 minutes. It marked his second straight game with 10 boards (10 at Cleveland 2/2).
- Mavericks center Dwight Powell notched his second double-double of the season (12th career) with 11 points (4-7 FGs, 3-3 FTs), a season-high (team-high) 12 rebounds, two assists, a season-high-tying two steals and a season-high-tying two blocks in a season-high 27 minutes off the bench.
- Mavericks big man Maxi Kleber made his 11th start of the season (46th career) and had 11 points (5-7 FGs, 1-1 3FGs) and seven boards in 29 minutes. It marked his second straight game with at least 10 points and seven boards (10 points and nine rebounds at Cleveland 2/2). The Mavericks improved to 9-3 this season when Kleber scores in double figures.
- Tim Hardaway Jr., who was acquired by Dallas on Thursday (Jan. 31), made his Mavericks debut and had 12 points, four rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 27 minutes off the bench.
- Hornets point guard Kemba Walker tallied a game-high 30 points, including 22 in the first half (13 in the first quarter), to go along with a season-high 11 rebounds, a team-high six assists and two steals in 37 minutes. It marked his 16th 30-point effort of the season (72nd career). It was his third career 30-point, 10-rebound game. It was also his seventh career game with at least 10 boards.
- The Mavericks used a 17-4 run spanning the first and second quarters to turn a three-point deficit (20-17) into a 10-point advantage (34-24). Dallas held a 52-46 lead at the half.
- J.J. Barea (right Achilles surgery) and Kristaps Porzingis (left knee surgery) both missed the game for Dallas due to injury/recovery. Tony Parker missed the game for Charlotte due to a back strain. Dwayne Bacon, Joe Chealey and JP Macura were on assignment with the Hornets' G-League team, the Greensboro Swarm.
- The attendance for tonight's game was 19,606. The Mavericks have now sold out 704 consecutive regular-season home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The streak began on 12/15/01 and Dallas has sold out an additional 67 playoff games during that same stretch.

The Mavericks' next game is vs. Milwaukee on Feb. 8 at 7:30 p.m. CT
